J/105 North American Championship Coming to Ugotta Regatta

100 BOATS ALREADY REGISTERED

As of April 17th, registration for the 58th Ugotta Regatta was full and there is an active waitlist. This is unprecedented and somewhat unexpected as the regatta boat cap was raised this year from 88 to 100. Nevertheless, we could not be more pleased. The early enthusiasm for registration is clear evidence of the popularity of LTYC's signature event. I hope

everyone who has ever been a part of this magical weekend will feel proud that so many sailors and families would be nowhere other than Harbor Springs at the end of July.

From July 26-29, not only will we be hosting the annual LTYC Ugotta Regatta, including the traditional Tour of the Bay and One Design Series, we will be welcoming competitors from around the country for the J/105 North American Championship. Currently there are more than 20 J/105 competitors bringing their boats from California, Texas, Florida and around the Midwest. Some boats will also be competing in the Chicago to Mackinac Race. Scores from the North American Championship and the Mackinac race will be combined for an Offshore Championship Trophy. Racing is expected to be extremely close and at a very high level competition. LTYC is proud to host this prestigious event.

The One Design Series for any class with five or more boats will begin Friday, July 27th with windward/leeward racing. The Tour of the Bay, our traditional and ever popular race format will be held Saturday, July 28th and Sunday, July 29th. There will be close to 80 boats sailing in the Tour of the Bay. The Tour will be exciting to watch from all sides of Little Traverse Bay with boats from 23 feet to 86 feet racing in the same waterway.

The traditional Irish Boat Shop party for sailors and volunteers will be held Friday evening. The Petoskey Steel Drum Band will be playing at the LTYC Party on Saturday so come and enjoy the music and libations. Come give a hand to the winners on Sunday, at the Awards Party following racing. We are grateful for our event sponsors, including Gosling's Rum, Quantum Sails, the Petoskey Area Visitors' Bureau, and the British Virgin Islands' Board of Tourism.

All the fun and excitement at LTYC requires a huge support staff, so become involved! Check your weekly eBlast from LTYC to see how you can sign up. Volunteers will receive tickets to the Friday Irish Party, a commemorative Ugotta Regatta hat and a big "Thank You."

The addition of the J/105 North American Championship this year means LTYC especially needs more support boats and drivers. We will need a Race Committee boat, mark boats, pin boats, leeward mark boats, patrol boats and VIP/photo boats. Look forward to more information on how to volunteer in the LTYC weekly eBlast.

New Format for Dinghy Racing:

LASERS ON MONDAYS, 420S ON THURSDAYS

The Dinghy Fleet's experiment with 420's as well as Lasers has been a spectacular success over the past two summers, with more sailors racing than ever before, and great competition and camaraderie on the water. By the end of the 2017 season, over 110 sailors had sailed in more than 40 races!

In response to popular demand, this year we are focusing each sailing evening on a single fleet, allowing for even better competition and to provide opportunities to sail in both fleets. Therefore, we will be sailing Lasers on each Monday evening, starting June 18—and sailing Collegiate 420's (no spinnaker or trapeze) on Thursday evenings starting June 21. Racing will continue weekly through August 13th (Lasers) and August 16th (420s). Separate scoring and awards for each fleet will be provided.

Once again, Little Traverse Sailors will make its fleet of 420s available to interested double-handed teams, or you can bring your own Laser. We are committed to keeping our fees as

low as possible; the all-season racing fees (sponsored by LTS) are just \$80 for adults and \$50 for juniors. Most nights, the LTS Race Coaches will be on hand for on-the-water coaching and tips. See www.littletraversesailors.org/dinghy-racing/ for more information and get signed up.

Start Planning Now for LTYC Cruise to the North Channel

AUGUST 2019

LTYC member Barbara Dau and her partner Bart English have offered to organize an LTYC "flotilla" to cruise the North Channel, modeled on a New York Yacht Club "Cruise in Company" trip they took in June 2014. LTYC participants can bring their own yachts or charter a power or sailing vessel from Canadian Yacht Charters, an excellent yacht chartering and marina facility located in Gore Bay, Manitoulin Island, Ontario, Canada. The week-long event will commence with a group dinner in Gore Bay. Each day, there will be a suggested itinerary and overnight anchorage, but participants would be free to deviate to explore on their own and rejoin the Fleet at their discretion. While at anchorage each night, informal or organized cocktail parties will take place. Group activities such as hikes could be planned as well as dinners when the fleet is in port.

The cost of the trip would be limited to meals and charter fees. Exact dates have not been determined but are estimated to be August 2019 following the Beaver Island race. Drive time from Harbor Springs to Gore Bay is approximately six hours. Go to www.cycnorth.com/ for information on Canadian Yacht Charters.

Clean Regatta Team GEARS UP FOR A GREEN SUMMER

We're looking forward to Clean Regatta 2018! Check out the club website and other social media sites for fun ways to incorporate a reduce, reuse, recycle model in your daily life, not just during Regatta Weekend. LTYC members are in a unique position to be leaders in keeping our harbor clean and reducing the waste we generate.

Each one of us has the opportunity to make a difference every single day, but during Ugotta Regatta, our club really shines. Last year was just our second year of implementing the Clean Regatta program but nevertheless, LTYC achieved Silver Status with the Sailors for the Sea by completing 21 required best practices. VERY Special thanks to the Petoskey Area Visitors Bureau for their grant in support of the Clean Regatta program.

We are proud to say we achieved our goals in 2017: eliminate all single use water bottles from all yacht club activities both on and off the water during the weekend (success!) and increase the use of compostable materials at Club events including sending all food waste to Emmet County's composting facility (success!).

These two goals were met thanks to the enthusiastic cooperation of members of the Board of Directors, Race Committee, yacht club staff and volunteers as well as club members, racers and other guests. The Little Traverse Sailors Board and Team Pancake Breakfast are to be commended as well for their enthusiastic support of Clean Regatta initiatives. Two non-members, Bonnie Hamilton and Anna Brieden earned blue flags for their countless hours of volunteering over the weekend.

Thanks to the J/70 home fleet, especially Chal and Lloyann Curtis who made sure that the fleet pre-regatta party held on Thursday night at the club was "Clean Regatta Ready." The Curtis' donated dozens of their own reusable cups which were seen in use over the next few days.

Club member Jason Meeuwig very generously donated 45 large reusable bottles and samples of his delicious and hydrating product, Q Energy, for all RC volunteers.

Emmet County Recycling partnered with us for all recycling and composting management. In all, 20 extra large bins of food and paper waste were sent to their composting facility rather than the landfill over the weekend. Most racers reused their drink cups. And in total, only eight standard sized black trash bags went to the landfill. Andi Shepard of ECR deserves a special thanks for her "early and often" availability in these efforts.

Irish Boat Shop needs a special shout out this year. IBS generously donated a large tent (along with repurposing an old J/105 sail as shade) which was used to manage/sort waste so that the unsavory aspects of "clean regatta-ing" would take place away from our guests. Michael Esposito and his crew were extremely flexible and low profile but constantly available.




