NOTICE OF RACE

ECESA E Scow Eastern Championship Regatta July 31 – August 2, 2024 Organizing Authority: Toms River Yacht Club

Location and Date

The regatta will take place on Thursday, July 31, 2025, through and including Saturday, August 2, 2025. The Toms River Yacht Club, located at 1464 Riviera Avenue, Toms River, NJ 08753 (https://tryc.com/), is the host and organizing authority.

Rules

The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined by the National Class E Scow Association (NCESA), the Eastern Class E Sloop Association (ECESA) regarding crew and floats as stated below, and the 2025-2028 Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS), in this order. In the case of a conflict between rules, the RRS will prevail.

Please note NCESA By-Law Article VIII, #6 - No yacht while racing in a sanctioned event may have a paid hand for either skipper or as a paid member of the crew.

According to the Class Scantling Rules every E-Scow entered in the regatta must have paid the "Active Owner Member" Dues and the Skipper must be at least a "Regular Member" to the NCESA before registration.

Vakaros RaceSense will be used for this event and is required for participation. Rules changes will be in the Sailing Instructions. NCESA Scantling Rules Part II, F.3.b. is suspended for the Championship only for the use of RaceSense. Competitors owning their own Vakaros unit will be responsible for obtaining a valid license prior to the event and ensuring their unit has the most up-to-date version of software. Competitors who do not own a Vakaros unit will be responsible for renting a unit directly from Vakaros. Boat mounting requirements and details about rental Atlas 2 units will be made available on the official notice board. Fee structure will be forthcoming for those renting a unit.

Advertising

Competitor advertising shall conform to the current World Sailing Advertising Code. Boats may be required to display event and sponsor's advertising for the duration of the event in accordance with World Sailing regulations. These items will be supplied free of charge by the organizing authority (OA) at registration.

Eligibility

The regatta is open to all yachts which meet the rules of NCESA, whose skipper is an Active Owner or Regular Member of the NCESA and whose sails and equipment comply with the Scantlings and By-laws of the NCESA.

Crew

The number of persons comprising the crew is minimum 3, maximum unlimited, but each yacht shall sail the entire regatta with the same individuals and number of crew members that are declared at the close

of registration, except for unusual situations when the jury of the event may, at its discretion, authorize a substitution, the underlying concept being to prevent "strategic" changing of crew following the close of registration.

Entry and Fees

Eligible boats may enter by going to the Clubspot page to complete the regatta's online entry and payment. Early registration deadline is July 15, 2025. All skippers must complete the Waiver of Liability on the Clubspot page.

Entry fees for the regatta are as follows:

\$400 for registration before July 15, 2025 \$475 for registration after July 15, 2025 \$300 for skippers born after July 31, 2000

Vakaros RaceSense will be used for this event. Competitors owning their own Vakaros unit will be responsible for obtaining a valid license prior to the event and ensuring their unit has the most up-to-date version of software. Competitors who do not own a Vakaros unit will be responsible for renting a unit directly from Vakaros. Fee structure will be forthcoming for those renting a unit.

Registration fees include participation in the race series, breakfast and lunch for skipper and crew from July 31 – August 2, 1st through 5th place trophies, special awards, and complimentary refreshments after racing. Fees must be paid prior to the close of registration to be eligible to race.

Onsite Registration

There will be no on-site registration. However, there will be a **check-in** at the following times:

Wednesday, July 30: 1600 pm – 2000 pm Thursday, July 31: 0745 am – 0830 am

Boat Launching & Storage

On-site trailer storage is available for all competitors. Boats will be launched daily from the club's two hoists. Boats may arrive on property beginning Wednesday, July 31. However, any boat participating in the TRYC Up Bay Challenge Cup, to be held the weekend before the ECESA Championship, will be allowed to store their boat at the club for the days between the two events.

NOTE: There will not be a specified Harbor Gun during this event. The long tow and possibility of separate launch venues make this impractical. Each yacht is responsible for launching and joining a tow with sufficient time to reach the racing area

Race Format

Seven (7) races are scheduled with up to four (4) races per day. The completion of three (3) races constitutes a Regatta. Sufficient Head boats will be provided by the Organizing Authority for competitor use between races. No warning signal shall be made after 1300 on Saturday, August 2, 2025. If there have been fewer than three (3) races completed, the time for the warning signal may be extended to no later than 1500.

Sailing Instructions

Sailing Instructions will be available online on the Clubspot registration site. If you want a printed copy, please print it off from the website and bring it with you. No printed copies will be available onsite.

Radio Use

The RC will communicate with competitors on VHF radio channel 68. The order of transmission or failure

to hear a RC transmission shall not constitute grounds for redress. Notification of course changes after the start may be broadcast by the RC in addition to the signals. Please bring a VHF radio.

Required Safety Equipment

Per ECESA by-laws, the following safety equipment is mandatory to be onboard all competing yachts for the duration of the event, except when in use:

- I. Personal floatation device for each crew member certified to USCG Type III, EN 393, or ISO 12402-5 (Level 50) or equivalent.
- II. Paddle
- III. Type IV flotation device
- IV. Mainsail flotation panel set, which are required to be used at all times while racing Further, a tow line of sufficient length, minimum 40ft, and strength for rescue and for **towing to the racing area** shall be required equipment for this event and must be kept onboard while racing

Hull and Sail Requirements

All boats must bear a silver certified lead added label and white tamper-proof sticker.

If any competitor has made modifications to their boat and needs to be re-weighed, it shall be done in controlled ideal conditions **before** arriving at the regatta by a class recognized representative.

Sails must contain a manufacturer's serial number (or measurer's serial number) and an NCESA Royalty Tag. Boats may be inspected at any time during the regatta to ensure conformity with class rules.

Racing Area and Courses

Racing will take place in one of three racing areas on the Barnegat Bay. The racing areas are as follows:

Primary – Cedar Creek Course – Barnegat Bay off Berkely Island Park

NOTE – This course requires a tow of around 30-45 minutes from TRYC. Sufficient tow boats will be organized by the Organizing Authority, but the participating yachts are responsible for bringing a tow line of sufficient length and strength to be towed to the racing area

Alternate – Seaside Course – off Seaside Park Yacht Club

Alternate – Wanamaker Course – between Island Heights, Guilford Park, and Ocean Gate

Further information on the course locations will be illustrated in the Sailing Instructions. The courses to be sailed will be a windward / leeward configuration as described in the SI's.

Penalty System

RSS US Sailing prescription Appendix V shall be in effect. The two-turn penalty is replaced with a one-turn penalty. This changes RRS 44.1

Scoring

Three (3) completed races are necessary to constitute a series.

The Low Point Scoring System of RRS Appendix A will apply with the following modifications: When six or more races have been sailed, a boat's series score will be the total of the skipper's race scores after throwing out the skipper's worst score. Rule A5.3 will be in effect.

Awards

Top 5 Skippers, Top 5 Crews, Top Vintage Boat Skipper, Top Rookie, and Top Master. (Master is a skipper whose age is 65 or greater as of July 31, 2025).

Insurance

Each participating boat shall be insured with valid third-party insurance.

Disclaimer

Competitors participate in this regatta entirely at their own risk and are reminded to pay special attention to RRS 3, Decision to Race.

Toms River Yacht Club, Race Committee, Protest Committee, sponsors, volunteers, or any other affiliated organization or official accepts no responsibility for any loss, damage, injury, death or inconvenience incurred, in conjunction with the regatta, however caused. By participating in this event, each competitor, or in the case of minors, each competitor's parent or guardian, agrees to release the Regatta Organizers from any and all liability associated with such competitor's participation in this event to the fullest extent permitted by law.

The legal drinking age in the state of New Jersey is 21 years old. This is strictly enforced at TRYC.

The Organizing Authority may amend this notice. Amendments will be posted on the Clubspot regatta registration page.
