Location: Corpus Christi Yacht Club, Corpus Christi, Texas.

Class: PHRF

1. Rules:

- 1.1 The regatta will be governed by the Racing Rules of Sailing 2025-2028, the prescriptions of US Sailing, this Notice of Race, and the Sailing Instructions.
- 1.2 Rule 60.4(a)(2) is changed as follows: “(2) if it alleges a breach of a rule of Part 2 or rule 31 and is from a boat that was not involved in, and did not see, the incident, or”
- 1.3 Changes to PR 15 (b) “A protesting boat shall, at the first reasonable opportunity after finishing, notify the Race Committee of its intent to protest. Failure to do so makes her protest invalid. This changes rule 60.4.”
- 1.4 A competitor must notify the Race Committee (RC) of their intent to protest another boat, at the finish line, before talking to a coach or a parent. If this instruction is not followed, the protest will be found to be invalid. This is in addition to and modifies the requirements of class rules and RRS 60.1.
- 1.5 In the event of a conflict between the governing documents, the Sailing Instructions will take precedence.
- 1.6 The organizing authority is Corpus Christi Yacht Club.

2. Eligibility:

- 2.1 The regatta is open to any yacht that holds a valid 2025 South Texas PHRF certificate or temporary certificate, and each yacht will be scored according to that rating.
- 2.2 Alternatively, the CCYC Race Committee retains the right, at its sole discretion, to assign a temporary PHRF rating for the sole purpose of this regatta.

3. Classes:

- 3.1 All Sails (PHRF A & B), 150 Class (PHRF A & B) and Multihull classes.



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3.2 Classes may be combined or eliminated at the discretion of the Principal Race Officer depending on participation. PHRF classes will be divided by the Principal Race Officer based upon PHRF ratings.

3.3 For the formation of a class in this regatta, a minimum of three (3) boats will be required to form a class.

4. Entry and Communications:

4.1 Entry for the event is available online at [the Club Spot](#)

4.2 All registration and fees are due by midnight July 13th.

4.3 Registration includes all three days of racing of both PHRF and 420 per the event format.

4.4 Entered teams unable to compete must notify the Regatta Chairperson as soon as possible. Registrations are not transferable between teams.



5. Entry Fee

5.1 The registration fee is \$75.00 per boat.

5.2 The optional food & beverage fee is \$30.00/person, payable online or at the social. The menu is attached to the end of this NOR.

6. Sailing Instructions

6.1 Sailing instructions will be available online at the Club Spot regatta information page approximately one week before the regatta.

7. Regatta Format

7.1 This is a combined score regatta including PHRF scores from Wednesday and Saturday, plus the overall finishing score of the 420 races completed on Friday. Entrants are not required to race in the 420 event Friday, see alternate score in section 9.4.

7.2 PHRF Races

7.2.1 Wednesday will consist of one race using the normally scheduled Wednesday night races.

7.2.2 Saturday racing will consist of multiple windward/leeward or triangle races.

7.2.3 PHRF boats may be divided into the following classes and starts based on participation: PHRF A-All Sails, PHRF B-All Sails, PHRF A 150, PHRF B 150, Large Multihulls

7.2.4 For the formation of a class in this regatta, a minimum of three (3) vessels will be required.

7.2.5 The Race Chairman may combine or eliminate classes based on participation.

7.3 420 Races



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- 7.3.1 Friday will consist of multiple races using 420 boats.
 - 7.3.2 Teams will be assigned to CCYC 420s at the Skipper's meeting.
 - 7.3.3 Only one (1) 420 team per PHRF boat. Sailors must both be crew from the same PHRF boat they are representing.
 - 7.3.4 In order for 420 race results to count towards a PHRF boat's Race Week scores, both 420 race participants must sail a minimum of 3 other Race Week races on the boat they are representing.
- 7.4 Snacks and beverages will be served at the awards ceremony.

8. Schedule

9. Scoring

- 9.1 Appendix A, Low Point Scoring system will apply.
- 9.2 No races will be excluded for the PHRF fleet. This changes Appendix A2.1.
- 9.3 The 420 Races will count as a single race in PHRF Race Week scores.
- 9.4 Any boats that do not participate in the 420 races, but are entered in race week, will be scored number of entries +1 for their 420 score.

10. Awards

- 10.1 Awards will be presented approximately 1 hour after the signal boat returns to the dock or after the conclusion of any protest hearings.
- 10.2 Awards for 1st-3rd place.



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11. Sustainability

13.1 Sailing is an activity that has an inherent risk of damage and injury. Competitors in this event are participating entirely at their own risk. See RRS Part 1, 3 Decision to Race.

13.2 The race organizers (organizing authority, race committee, protest committee, host organization, sponsors, or any other organization or official) will not be responsible for damage to any boat or other property or the injury to any competitor, including death, sustained as a result of participation in this event. By participating in this event, each competitor agrees to release the race organizers from any and all liability associated with such competitor’s participation in this event to the fullest extent permitted by law.
