The Organizing Authority (OA) for this regatta is Coronado Yacht Club (CorYC).

1. RULES

1.1 The regatta will be governed by the Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS), these Sailing Instructions, the prescriptions of the US SAILING Assoc., the Class Rules of the Club 420 fleet, the Perry Series Standing Rules as published on the SCYYRA website.

1.2 RRS 33, 35, 40, and Race Signals will be changed and will appear in full below.

2. ELIGIBILITY & ENTRIES

2.1 Each participant shall be under 19 years of age for the entirety of the series.

3. NOTICES TO COMPETITORS

3.1 Notices to competitors will be posted on the official Notice Board, located on the front porch of CorYC.

4. CHANGES TO THE SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

4.1 Any changes to the Sailing Instructions will be posted before 1015 hours on Saturday and 1015 hours on Sunday.

5. SIGNALS MADE ASHORE

5.1 Signals made ashore will be displayed on the flagpole on the CorYC Front Deck.

5.2 If for any reason the Race Committee determines that racing should be postponed before leaving the harbor area, code flag AP will be flown. Upon lowering AP, one horn blast will be made. In addition, the warning signal for the next race will be no less than 40 minutes after lowering AP.

6. SCHEDULE

Saturday Dec.10th

Sunday Dec. 11th

6.1 Races follow at RC Discretion.

6.2 Snack distributed immediately after races both days on grass area in main parking lot.

7. RACING AREA

7.1 The racing area will be in South San Diego Bay unless safety dictates a change to safer location.

8. THE COURSE AND MARKS

8.1. The diagrams in Appendix A show the course including the order in which marks are to be passed, and the side on which each mark is to be left.

8.2. Marks 1, 2, and 3 will be cylindrical yellow inflatable marks. Marks 4s/4p (leeward gate) will be orange inflated marks.

8.3. The courses to be sailed will be windward/leeward, trapezoid, or a combination thereof. This modifies the Notice of Race.

- 8.4. The courses to be sailed for each race will be displayed from the committee boat.
- 8.5 The Course Chart is posted on the Official Notice Board and at the registration table, and will not have any printed SI's.

9. THE START

9.1 The class flag will be a pennant 1

9.2 The starting line will be between the orange flag displayed on the committee boat and a large red buoy, at the port end of the line.

10. CHANGE OF THE NEXT LEG OF THE COURSE

10.1. To change the next leg of the course, the race committee will move the original mark (or the finishing line) to a new position, provided no boat is on that leg of the course. No signals will be made by RC. This modifies RRS 33.

11. THE FINISH

11.1 The finish line for course 1 and 2 will be between the blue flag displayed on the finishing boat and a small red buoy.

11.2 Finish line for course 3 and 4 will be between the blue flag displayed on the finish boat and yellow inflatable.

12. TIME LIMITS

12.1. If no boat has passed Mark 1 within 30 minutes the race will be abandoned.

12.2. Boats failing to finish within 15 minutes after the first boat sails the course and finishes will be scored Did Not Finish without a hearing. This changes rules 35, A4 and A5.

13. PENALTY SYSTEM

RRS 44.1 and 44.2 shall apply.

14. PROTESTS AND REQUEST FOR REDRESS

14.1. Boats must notify the Race Committee Signal Boat immediately upon finishing of their intent to protest.

14.2. Protest forms are available at the front desk of CorYC. Protests shall be delivered there within the protest time limit.

14.3. The protest time limit is 30 minutes after the Committee Boat returns to the dock. Return time will be posted on the Notice Board.

14.4. Decisions of the protest committee will be final.

14.5. Any suspected use of illegal drugs or alcohol on or off the racecourse during the course of the regatta shall result in a report under RRS 69 Allegations of Gross Misconduct.

14.6 At any hearing where Skipper is contesting a starting infraction 3rd party video or photo will not be accepted.

15. SCORING

15.1 The Low Point System of the RRS Appendix A will apply.

15.2 3 races completed constitute a series.

15.3 Each team's worst race score will be discarded if six (6) races are completed.

15.4 No more than (8) races will be attempted.

16. CAPSIZE

16.1 If a yacht, as a result of a capsize or mechanical breakdown, is unreasonably delaying the finish of a race, the Race Committee may order the craft rescued and score her DNF unless it has otherwise infringed a rule.

17. SAFETY REGULATIONS

17.1. Prior to the warning of the first race of the day, each boat shall check-in with and be recognized by the Race Committee (R/C boat) by passing close astern on starboard tack and hailing her sail number.

17.2. Boats failing to check-in properly will have a 5-point penalty added to the first race of that day.

17.3. Boats intending to retire for the day or from any race must notify the Race Committee as soon as possible. Failure to do so will result in a 5-point penalty being added to their score in the previous race.

17.4. All competitors shall properly wear a USCG approved life jacket (type I, II or III) at all times on the water, except while briefly changing or adjusting clothing or personal equipment. This modifies RRS 40.

17.5. The Race Committee may disqualify a competitor who is not properly wearing a life jacket. The Race Committee may order that competitor immediately back to shore.

17.6. All boats must have a floating towline in each race boat that is a minimum of 26' long and a minimum of 3/8" diameter.

18. SUPPORT BOATS

18.1. Support boats must have a working VHF Radio capable of transmitting on VHF 16, & 67 18.2. Support boats are required to check in upon arriving on the course and declare the number of boats they are coaching.

18.3. Support boats failing to comply with Race Committee directions may be ordered off the course.

18.4. Team leaders, coaches and other support personnel shall stay outside areas where boats are racing from the time of the preparatory signal until all boats have finished the race or the race committee signals a postponement, general recall or abandonment.

19. Awards

19.1 Regatta awards will be presented to Skipper and Crew of the top three teams

20. CLUB FACILITES

20.1 No cars without a CYC parking decal are allowed to be in the parking lot during the day. Competitors and coaches are welcome to drop gear, then park in the unmetered spots available outside the gate or in the east parking lot, past the Jr. Office. Failure to do so may result in cars being towed and/or competitors associated with the car to be scored as DNC for the day.
