1 RULES

- 1.1 This event is governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing*
- 1.2 Each registered class's corresponding class rules (USODA, ILCA, or Club 420) will also apply.
- 1.3 Club 420 rules C9 and C10 will not apply.

2 SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

- 2.1 The sailing instructors will be available after 12 pm on June 25th on the official notice board

3 COMMUNICATION

- 3.1 Official notice board is located online at [NOR HERE](#)
- 3.2 On the water, the race committee will make courtesy broadcasts to competitors and coaches via VHF radio. The channel for this communication will be stated in the SIs.

4 ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

- 4.1 Competitors must enter the event by registering online at [REGISTER HERE](#)
- 4.2 To be considered an entry in the event, a boat shall complete all registration requirements and pay all fees before 9:00 am on Friday, June 25th.
- 4.3 Charters will be available on a first come first serve basis.
- 4.4 Sailors chartering boats will be provided with a boat and a set of WBSS race sails. Sailors chartering boats must bring their own spinnaker and trapeze equipment.

5 FEES

5.1 Entry fees are \$25.00 per sailor.

5.2 A late fee of \$10.00 per sailor applies after June 18th.

5.3 Lunch will be provided for all competitors and coaches.

5.4 420 Charter fees are \$10.00 per boat with a \$200.00 damage deposit. For the damage deposit, a check must be written out to the White Bear Sailing School and will be shredded at the end of the regatta assuming no damage to the chartered boat or resulting from a collision at the fault of the chartered boat. White Bear Sailing School will not be chartering Optimists or Lasers.

6 SCHEDULE

6.1 The first warning signal is 1000h on Friday, June 26th

6.2 There will be no warning signal after 1500h.

6.3 There will be a short break to eat lunch in between races.

7 COURSES

7.1 Courses will be standard windward leeward courses. Specific diagrams will be in the Sailing Instructions.

8 SCORING

8.1 A minimum of one race in each division must be completed in order for the regatta to be scored

9 SUPPORT PERSON VESSELS

9.1 Support vessels shall keep clear of the race courses, unless asked by the Race Committee to assist in helping a sailor in need or adjusting the course

10 RISK STATEMENT

10.1 RRS 3 states: 'The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue to race is hers alone.' By participating in this event each competitor agrees and acknowledges that sailing is a potentially dangerous activity with inherent risks. These risks include strong winds and rough seas, sudden changes in weather, failure of equipment, boat handling errors, poor seamanship by other boats, loss of balance on

an unstable platform and fatigue resulting in increased risk of injury. Inherent in the sport of sailing is the risk of permanent, catastrophic injury or death by drowning, trauma, hypothermia or other causes.
