Permitted to be used on property; however, bikes must be walked from the main dock to the pool area. Rollerblades, skateboards, and push scooters are not permitted.



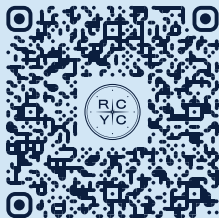
