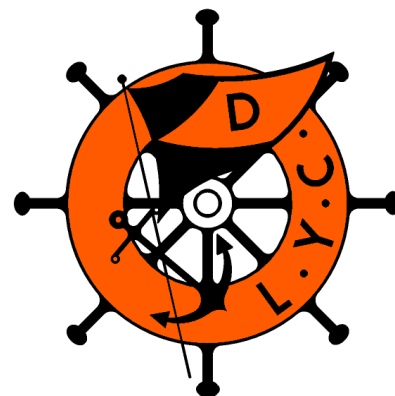


Flying Scot Midwest Districts

Sailing Instructions

Revised 2026-08-03
Hosted by Delavan Lake Yacht Club
Saturday, August 15 & Sunday, August 16



The sailing instructions shall consist of the instructions in RRS Appendix S, Standard Sailing Instructions and supplementary sailing instructions that shall be posted on the [official notice board](#).

1. Schedule

- 1.1 Competitors briefing is Saturday, August 15 at 0930 hours at regatta Headquarters at the DLYC Clubhouse.
- 1.2 Warning signal for the first race is Saturday, August 15 at 1030 hours.
- 1.3 Time of the warning signal for subsequent races will be posted except when races are sailed back-to-back.
- 1.4 Five (5) races are scheduled.
- 1.5 ~~No more than three races shall be sailed on any one day.~~ At the discretion of the PRO and in consultation with the Fleet Representative 4 races may be sailed on Saturday. Races may be sailed back-to-back.
- 1.5 On the last day of the regatta no warning signal will be made after 1230 hours.
- 1.6 Notices to competitors will be posted on the [Official Notice Board](#).
- 1.7 Signals made ashore will be displayed at a docked Race Committee Signal Boat.
- 1.8 The race committee will make courtesy broadcasts to competitors on VHF radio channel 72.
- 1.9 If there is a conflict between the NPR and SI's, the SI's prevail.

2. Marks

- 2.1 Original marks and change marks will be identified at the competitor's briefing.
- 2.2 After the start, minor adjustments in a mark's location will not be signaled. This changes RRS 33.

3. Time Limit

The time limit shall be 90 minutes. Boats still racing 20 minutes after the first boat sails the course and finishes will be scored TLE (Time Limit Expired), the position of the last boat that complies with RRS 28 to finish plus 2. This changes RRS 35, A4.2, and A10.

4. Starting Line

- 4.1 Will be between a staff displaying an orange flag on an RC boat at the starboard end, to the port end starting mark, or
- 4.2 Between staffs displaying orange flags on two RC Boats, or
- 4.3 From a staff displaying an orange flag on an RC boat at the starboard end, to a staff displaying an orange flag on an RC boat in the approximate center of the start line, and thence to a staff displaying an orange flag on an RC boat at the port end.
- 4.5 If a mid-line boat is in place in accordance with SI 5.3, a boat may return to the pre-start side of the line around the midline boat, leaving it to port, before starting. This changes RRS 30.1
- 4.6 A boat that has not started before 5 minutes after her starting signal shall be scored DNS.

5. Finishing

- 5.1 The finishing line will be between a staff displaying an orange/blue flag on a race committee boat and on the course side of a nearby mark, or between staffs displaying orange/blue flags on two race committee boats.
- 5.2 Flag A displayed, with no sound, while boats are finishing indicates "no more racing today".
- 5.3 Flag H displayed, with no sound, while boats are finishing indicates "racing will continue after a break either on shore or on the water".
- 5.4 If no flag is flying it may be assumed that another race will follow immediately.
- 5.5 A boat that retires from a race is requested to notify a RC boat before leaving the racing area, or, if that is not possible, notify a regatta official at Regatta Headquarters immediately upon arrival on shore.

6. The Low Point System, RRS A4, will apply, except that RRS A2 is changed such that each boat's total score will

be the sum of her scores for all races. Awards will be based on her finishes in the overall fleet.

- 7.** Except in an emergency, a boat that is racing shall not make voice or data transmissions and shall not receive voice or data communication on the designated RC channel.
