Border Crossing Information

Border crossings are very easy to bring the boat into Canada for an event. Many Canadian boats have done the trip south a few times and never had any issues going either way.

When entering Canada, the Canadian Border Service Agency will ask you the following questions most likely.

1. How long is the boat staying in Canada?
2. Are you selling the boat in Canada or bringing it back?
3. Where are you staying while in Canada? (hotel, AirBNB, etc)

4. They will then ask for the following information.
 - a. The boat's registration and or license.
 - b. The trailer ownership.
 - c. Proof of insurance on the boat and trailer.
 - d. A letter from the owner designating the driver by name to cross the border with your permission. (if you are not driving it across yourself)

Depending on where you cross, it is only about a 90-minute drive to Port Credit Yacht Club. There is a back entrance, and there will be a regatta organizer there to assist you.
