SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

1. RULES

- 1.1 The races will be governed by rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing* including Appendix D, the current PHRF Regulations, as administered by the YRA of Long Island Sound (YRALIS) and the United States Sailing Safety Equipment Recommendations, with this event classified as a “Nearshore” event.
- 1.2 USCG approved personal floatation devices (PFDs) shall be available to competitors at all times while on the water by competitors. All competitors must supply their own PFDs, which shall be worn outside of all clothing when worn.
- 1.3 Advertising will be restricted to World Sailing Category A.
- 1.4 The event shall be scored using the PHRF Handicap Rating System of “Time on Time.”

2. ENTRIES

- 2.1 Eligible competitors shall be yachts who have a valid YRALIS PHRF Certificate, who have completed an electronic entry form, and paid the entry fee prior to 1800 on Friday, September 18, 2026. Late entries may be accepted at the sole discretion of the Race Committee.
- 2.2 If a boat does not have a PHRF rating, one may be assigned by the Principal Race Officer for the regatta at the Captain’s Meeting. The Race Committee encourages all yachts to obtain a PHRF certificate through the YRALIS. Yachts that do not have a valid certificate may be assigned a provisional rating at the discretion of the Principal Race Officer or Race Committee Chair, except that those yachts shall be assigned a rating that incorporates a five (5) second penalty to the yacht’s last known rating.

3. FEES

The entry fee will be \$35 per yacht.

4. NOTICES TO COMPETITORS

Notices to competitors will be posted on the official notice board located at the Main Clubhouse at the Seawanhaka Corinthian Yacht Club across from the service desk at the main entrance and will also be placed on the Regattas and Results pages of the Seawanhaka Corinthian Yacht Club at Seawanhaka.org

5. CHANGES IN SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

Change in the Sailing Instructions may be made at the competitors’ Meeting in the Main Clubhouse at 1030 hours on the day of the Regatta and posted immediately after the Captains’ Meeting.

6. SIGNALS MADE ASHORE

- 6.1 Signals made ashore will be displayed at the yardarm of the mainmast of the Seawanhaka Corinthian Yacht Club or from the Race Committee boat stationed at the Service Dock.
- 6.2 Code flag ‘AP’ over ‘H’ with two sound signals means “Do not leave shore.” All races not started are postponed. Further signals will be made ashore.

7. SCHEDULE OF RACES

One race is scheduled for the day and one (1) race shall constitute the Regatta. The starting sequence for the first race of the Regatta will commence at 1255 hours. No race shall start after 1700 hours.

8. RACING AREA

The racing area will be Cold Spring Harbor, Oyster Bay and Long Island Sound. The rendezvous area for the first race of the regatta will be in the area of Class Racing Mark 'S', or, in the event sailing conditions are, in the discretion of the Principal Race Officer, not fit for fair racing, in the vicinity of Seawanhaka Club Mark "4".

9. COURSES

The Race Committee Signal Boat will signal the PHRF Course by the display of placards. The placards will correspond to marks as detailed on the chart "Chart of Out of Harbor Marks" (See Attachment "A") and "Chart of In Harbor Marks" dated 5/28/24. (See Attachment B). The Race Committee shall make an announcement on VHF Channel 68 prior to the commencement of each divisional starting sequence of the manner in which each mark is to be rounded.

10. MARKS

The approximate locations of the marks and their designations are found on a chart entitled "CSHBC, SYC & SCYC" "Chart of Out of Harbor Marks" (See Attachment "A") and "Chart of In Harbor Marks" dated 5/28/24. (See Attachment "B"). In the event the Principal Race Officer find that racing is not conducive to racing off Club Mark "S", the Principal Race Officer shall have the discretion to move racing into Cold Spring Harbor and Oyster Bay, with the Starting Area being in the vicinity of Club Mark "4". Should that occur, the Principal Race offer may select marks from the and "Chart of In Harbor Marks" dated 5/28/24. (See Attachment B).

11. THE START

11.1 Starts of each division shall be in conformity with RRS 26.

11.2 The "Class Flag" shall be Numeral Pennant #1 for Division One; Numeral Pennant "#2 for Division Two; etc.

11.3 The starting line will be between a staff displaying an orange flag on the Race Committee boat and the course side of either Seawanhaka Club Mark "S" or, in the event Course "O" is designated as the course to be raced, Seawanhaka Club Mark "4".

11.4 A boat shall not start later than five (5) minutes after her starting signal.

12. RECALLS

The recall number is the boat's sail number.

The following shall not be grounds for redress [This modifies RRS 62]:

- a) Failure of a boat to hear or receive a recall broadcast;
- b) A boat's position in the sequence of recall numbers broadcast;
- c) Promptness of the broadcast.

13. THE FINISH

13.1 The finishing line will be between a staff displaying an orange flag on a Race Committee boat and the course side of Class Racing Mark "S" or, in the event racing is moved to start off Club Mark 4, then the finish line shall also be Mark 4.

14. PROTESTS

14.1 Protests shall be written on forms available at the front desk of the Seawanhaka Corinthian Yacht Club and lodged there by 1800 hours on the day of the regatta.

14.2 The Protest Committee will hear protests in approximately the order of receipt as soon as possible. The parties to the protest will be advised of the date, time, and place of the hearing.

15. SCORING

15.1 The scoring system is as follows: Entries will be divided into divisions at the sole discretion of the Race Committee. Each division will be scored separately. Prior to the start of the first race, yachts will commit to racing in either the Jib and Main or Spinnaker Division.

15.2 There will be no throwouts. This modifies Appendix A.

16. PRIZES

Prizes will be given for the first-place winner of each division. Additional prizes may be awarded in each division, depending on the number of starters, at the sole discretion of the Race Committee. Prizes will be distributed at the Annual Awards Dinner at Seawanhaka Corinthian Yacht Club on October 24, 2026.

17. SAFETY

A boat that retires from a race, or from continued racing on a particular day, shall notify the Race Committee as soon as possible of her intent to retire.

18. VHF REQUIREMENTS

Each boat must carry a VHF radio on board and shall monitor Channel 68, with the understanding that the Race Committee may, in their discretion, move to another channel after duly notifying the participants of the change.

19. COMMUNICATIONS

19.1 A boat shall neither make radio, telephone or electronic transmissions while racing nor receive special radio, telephone or electronic communications that are not available to all boats.

19.2 The Race Committee shall monitor and make announcements over VHF Channel 68 or any successive channel after duly notifying participants of the channel change.

20. DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

Competitors participate in this regatta entirely at their own risk. The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue racing is hers alone. Seawanhaka Corinthian Yacht Club will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the regatta. The skipper of each boat shall be responsible for the behavior of each member of her crew.

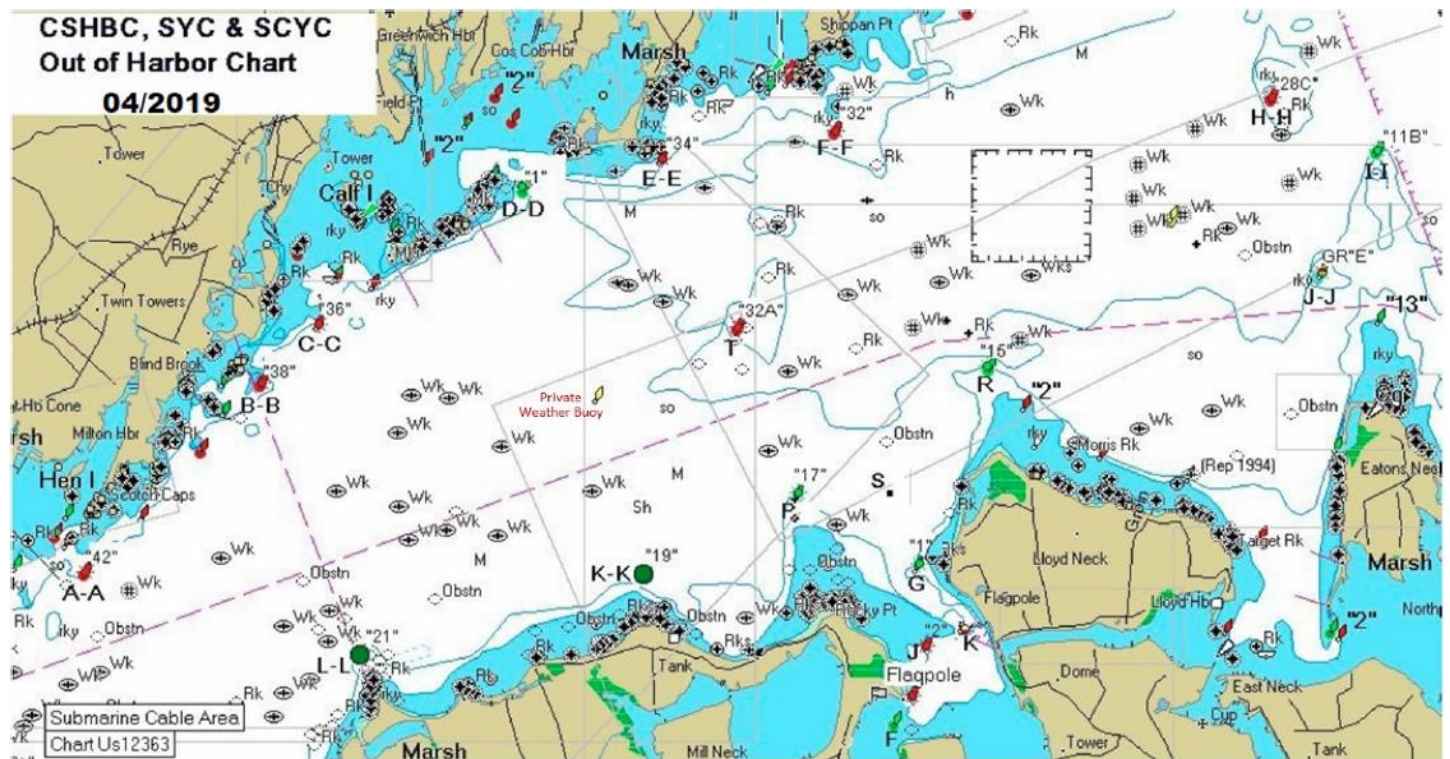
21. INSURANCE

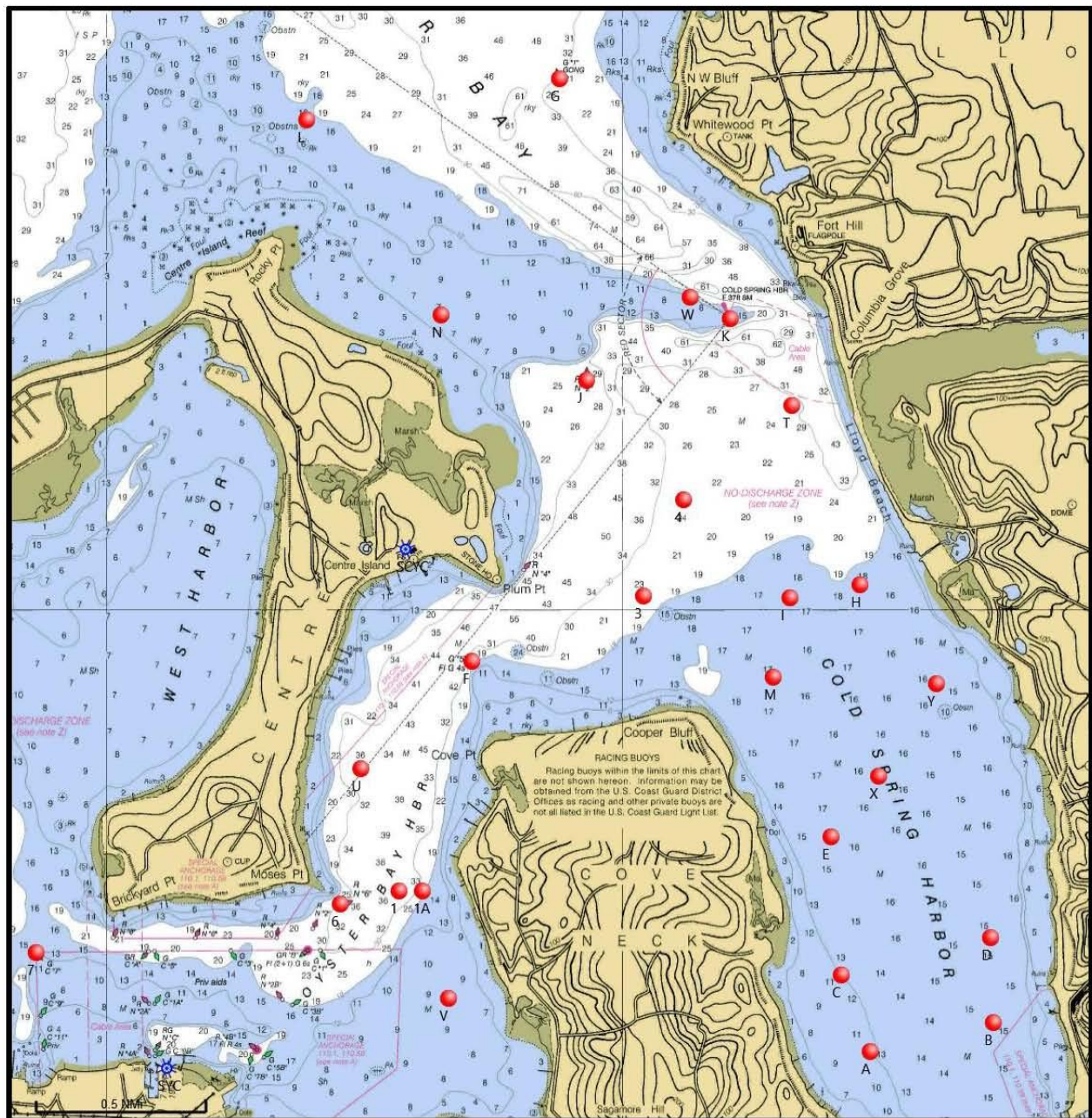
