

2026 C WORLD - SAILING INSTRUCTIONS – OCTOBER 2-4, 2026

1. SCHEDULE:

- 1.1 The time of the warning signal for subsequent races will be posted on the Official Notice Board except when races are sailed back-to-back.

2. SIGNALS MADE ASHORE:

- 2.1 When flag AP is displayed ashore, 'one minute' is replaced with 'not less than forty-five minutes. This changes Race Signals.
- 2.2 Signals made ashore will be displayed at a docked signal boat at DLYC.

3. MARKS:

- 3.1 Original marks and change marks will be orange shapes.

4. TIME LIMITS:

- 4.1 Mark 1 Time Limit: 20 Minutes
- 4.2 Race Time Limit: 90 Minutes

5. THE START:

- 5.1 The starting line will be between a staff displaying an orange flag on an RC boat at the starboard end and the port end starting mark, or between staffs displaying orange flags on two RC Boats.
- 5.2 Orange Line flags will be flown no less than 5 minutes before the warning for the subsequent race.
- 5.3 A boat that has not started before 5 minutes after her starting signal shall be scored DNS.

6. CHANGES TO THE NEXT LEG OF THE COURSE:

- 6.1 To change the next leg of the course, the Race Committee will lay a new mark (or move the finish line) and remove the old marks as soon as practicable. When in a subsequent change a new mark is replaced, it will be replaced by an original mark.
- 6.2 A gate or finishing line mark may be adjusted without signaling a course change and this may be done while boats are sailing on the first half of the leg that the mark ends (this changes rule 33).

7. THE FINISH:

- 7.1 The finishing line will be between a staff displaying an Orange flag on a race committee boat and on the course side of a nearby mark, or between staffs displaying Orange flags on two race committee boats. This changes RRS Sailing Instructions 11.1.
- 7.2 A boat that retires from a race is requested to notify a RC boat before leaving the racing area, or, if that is not possible, notify a regatta official at Regatta Headquarters immediately upon arrival on shore.
- 7.3 Code Flag Hotel flown at the finish, without a sound, means further signals will be made ashore.

- 8. **COMMUNICATIONS:** While racing, except in an emergency, a boat shall not make voice of data communications and shall not receive voice or data communications that is not freely available to all boats or medically necessary. The Competitor's channel is 72.

9. PROTEST/REDRESS:

- 9.1 A boat intending to file a protest is requested to inform the RC after finishing. This modifies S13.1
- 9.2 A protest or request for redress must be filed 1 hour after the Signal boat docks.

10. SPECTATORS and SUPPORT PERSONS:

All Spectators and Support Persons are requested to keep a minimum distance of 100 yards from all competitors and from the racecourse. See RRS Definition "Support Person".
