The organizing authority will be the Lewes Yacht Club and the Mobjack Class.

Rules: The current Racing Rules from the International Sailing Federation, as modified by the United States Sailing Association, The Mobjack Racing Rules and the Race Committee Sailing Instructions will apply. RRS 60.4(a)(2) is changed as follows: "(2) if it alleges a breach of a rule of Part 2 or rule 31 and is from a boat that was not involved in, and did not see, the incident, or". RRS Appendix V will be in effect for this regatta.

Eligibility: A Mobjack is eligible to race and is considered in the Mobjack Class only if it is registered to and is owned by or chartered by an active or isolated member in good standing, or by a syndicate or club. The boat must conform in all respects to the Mobjack Class Specifications. Skippers must be active or isolated members in good standing. In the interest of promoting the Mobjack Class, A member in good standing may designate an associate member or an individual from outside the class to skipper his boat. Other restrictions apply; see the International Mobjack Association Constitution and By-Laws for additional details. A competitor under 19 years of age as of the last day of the calendar year of this regatta may race as a junior by indicating on the entry form that he/she is racing as a junior.

SIs: Sailing Instructions will be available at registration. The regatta will be sailed on the Delaware Bay between the Roosevelt Inlet and the Breakwater or north of the Roosevelt inlet off of Beach Plum Island so as to remain clear of other regatta sailing areas. All courses will be listed in the SIs. Other fleets may be sailing the course at the same time.

Number of Races: The Race Committee will attempt to sail as many races as possible. One race will constitute a regatta.

Scoring: Scoring will be the low point scoring system as defined in RRS Appendix A.

Not before 1030 First Signal for first race of the day

Subsequent races back to back with lunch on the water

1700 Happy Hour

1830 Dinner

Sunday, August 16

0700 – 0900 Breakfast

Not before 1000 First Signal for first race of the day

Subsequent races back to back. No race will be started after 1300.

Lunch and awards to follow the last race of the day

Registration Fee: The registration fee will be \$155.00. There will be a \$5.00 discount for US Sailing members. Registration fee will include Breakfast, Lunch and Dinner on Saturday and Breakfast and Lunch on Sunday. There will be beer and sodas following racing and a regatta souvenir. Competitor Misconduct: A competitor that commits misconduct as defined in rule 69.1(b) towards a race official or support person shall have her most recent race scored DNE without a hearing. A subsequent offense will result in all her races scored DNE and she shall not compete in any further races. This changes rule 69.1(c).
