**Emblematic of:** Junior with Non-junior crew Special National Championship of the U.S.A.

**Donated by:** Past Commodore Gonzalo Diaz, Sr.

**Owned by:** SCIRA

**Regatta Conditions:**

1. 2-5 races
2. Length of course at least 4 miles
3. Not more than 3 turning marks with judges at each mark
4. Skippers and officials meeting before start of first race
5. Regatta must be sanctioned by SCIRA at least 3 weeks prior to first race

**Open to:** Any number of junior skippers with adult crews or a non-junior crew. A junior is a boy or a girl not yet twenty years old on December 31 in the year in which he/she is competing. Late registration is permitted by payment of a late registration fee of \$20.00. Juniors who wish to sail and have not joined the Class at the time of the Championship may do so by payment of the current dues and the late registration fee. It can be sailed in combination with the Junior National Championship as one fleet in which case scoring will be as if one fleet and at the end the two fleets separated each skipper retaining the original point scoring.

**Awarded to:** The winning junior

**Conditions:** Engrave year, name of junior and the City or locality where he/she sails from. To be held by the fleet until succeeding year. Returnable to Executive Director, SCIRA or as directed. Revision of Deed of Gift: By the donor or the SCIRA Board of Governors.
