## House & Grounds

#### Oh No!!!!!!, Déjà vu

As if the first storm was not enough:

A more severe storm struck the area on Tuesday evening, August 10, 2021 around 6:45pm. Strong winds brought down several area trees which again interrupted power to the building. This outage caused a partial outage to the building, tripping a surge protector alarm at the junction box where the power enters the building. Kevin Brickler and Mike Greeson notified me of the alarm. This partial outage, damaged equipment, especially the HVAC AHU which relies on the full 3 phase power to operate motors and controls. We shut down power to the building to prevent further damage around 10:00am. This prevented the cookout volunteers from completing preparation in the kitchen for the cookout.

The Beren pontoon boat was flipped upside down in the water, still attached to the lift, which was now in the water with its feet up in the air. Several other boat canopies were damaged as well. A tree was down across Lindey's former bowling alley entrance and the Willow tree along East Shore Road and Beach Road intersection lost a major portion of its upper branches. All of this was possible evidence of a micro-burst that came across the lake, unabated, towards the Northeast shore.

It was a close call with the HVAC air handling unit. Wednesday Evenings Smyczek Rib–Fest had to be held in a dining room without a source of air conditioning other than trying to push conditioned air from the bar and entry foyer which are served by a separate air conditioning unit.

Conditioned Air Design was able to repair the air handling unit just outside the kitchen. The single phase power had started to damage the machine's circuitry and for a while the status of the compressors and repair cost was in doubt. The internal fuse did its job, however, and protected most of the unit. The Conditioned Air Design technician did a superb diagnostic review of the unit and replaced some of the control circuits and contacts to the two compressors. He told me to stand back, away from the unit when it first started up ("You never know these are going to start back-up") and I was glad when the unit started. Replacement may be a near future option.

#### House and Grounds met with Conditioned Air Design to update replacement costs. It was initially hoped that maybe an opportunity to modify the amount of cool air to the kitchen rather than adding the planned additional wall mounted 3 ton capacity split-system was possible. This was not feasible because of the existing undersized ductwork compared to the larger sized ductwork required for a bigger unit. A new larger sized unit would also require a costly new power feed. An alternate scenario was suggested of switching the

An alternate scenario was suggested of switching the thermostat location to the kitchen but this might cause havoc in the dining room. For the short term, the air conditioning is back up and running, providing cool air to the building. This would have to do for now.

## **From the Treasurer**

2021 Financials are posted on website. Click here to review.

The **Profit-Loss Statement** reflects operations January 1 through July 31st to be consistent with prior years' presentation. It is obvious that some categories are amortized rather evenly throughout the year but dues income is collected in the first five months; bar startup inventory and licensing costs occur May – July 15th; all regatta funds are accrued August and September Property taxes and insurance expenses are last four months of the year and not represented or partially represented in this P/L. Bottom line, we look to be in good shape with a healthy profit at this point. But there are substantial expenses the last quarter of the year without matching income.

The income for the next two months is always substantial. Thanks to the ILYA Opti regatta who look to generate \$12-13,000 after one last outstanding bill. The Dorn and Challenge are charged to generate \$2000 each. Initiations are collected in September which might be a possible 10 new memberships.

Your Board will discuss adding to the Capital Reserve Fund after we review required improvements for the Fall. For example, in 2021 the Board capitalized the following items: Parking lot resurfacing, outdoor seating improvements, the signal boat windlass replacement. The sailors donated the expenses to the signal boat to allow more efficient anchoring.

The **Balance Sheet** is also posted. The past eleven years are there for comparison. The yearend financials are posted in January.

If there are areas of concern or questions, please notify the treasurer prior to the meeting. Your questions are most likely shared by others and the time to consult this year and prior year's accounting will better prepare the treasurer to inform the membership.
