Race Committee Corner

thanks to regular attention from dedicated volunteers like Frank Rappold, John Becker, and others. We intend to continue to maintain this asset. The engine appears to be in good shape after having the thermostat replaced

this spring, although we are watching for any recurrence of water in the engine oil. We're considering a new canopy and perhaps new seating for next served us well for a long time, year. If you have noticed any upgrade or repair needs, let me know.

> The anemometer (wind speed indicator) on the signal boat is not necessarily accurate in all conditions. For example, on one windy recent day, the signal boat anemometer was indicating

an average wind speed of 15 mph with gusts to 20. Candace was using a calibrated anemometer that indicated gusts to 26-28 mph. So, don't use the signal boat anemometer as your only indication. There are hand-held anemometers in the equipment locker. There's also a chart in the signal boat information binder that gives a number of visual clues to wind speed.



Politely say "Get Off"

I'm sure most of you have seen people fishing from the pier, parking in our lot, maybe children playing on the playground that aren't members and are in fact, trespassing on LBYC property. What, if anything, should you do?

There are a couple of facts that need to be kept in mind when deciding to approach someone that is trespassing. The first is that there are signs posted around the property advising everyone that they are on private property. But the other fact, perhaps equally important, is that we all represent the Lake Beulah Yacht Club when we ask someone to leave the property. Rarely, if ever, does anyone wish to do the LBYC harm, so politeness is imperative

should you choose to approach a stranger.
