Commodore's Comment



FROM THE SAILING COMMODORE

The first weekend of racing is under our belts, and we had quite the variety of conditions out there. Saturday's three short races were light air, and Sunday's two short races were medium to windy. Please let your fleet captains know your opinions about the new format so we know whether or not to continue this for next year. It has been suggested that the races would get off more quickly if the MCs started first. Thought being that with races this short, the Cs wouldn't catch the MCs. and the races would finish much closer together. See what you think and let your fleet captains know.

The windy races on Sunday high-lighted what I believe to be a bad habit we have gotten into. We had the requisite safety boat out there, with my husband aboard. An MC turtled at the first windward mark, and David was there immediately. The problem was, one boat cannot right a turtled MC, and the time spent was time NOT spent helping others. Jeff and Bill Hudson, Randy Schmidt, and Jim Kutschenreuter all helped with either that MC or the two C boats that later tipped. HUGE thanks to them! But the safety boat not only righted the MC, but also towed him

home. David was unavailable for a total of more than 30 minutes because of one boat. And this kind of situation happens. So here's my reminder:

Please come out to watch your loved ones. Even if you can't physically right their boat, you can tow them home. Also, if you're out there, please don't assume that the safety boat is available to help anyone who tips over. If you're able, please help right any tipped over boats you see.

If I had to pick two C Boats least likely to tip over, David Porter and Jay Hiller would be at or near the top of that list. Shows you how much I know! Here's a reminder to safety boat drivers to please check the level of the tubes in the inflatable boat. They should be firm before you take off onto the water. It's very easy and quick to re-inflate them, and is vitally important. Under-inflated tubes cause wear and leaks to the tubes, and they have been patched so many times, that we're running out of life span! There is a foot pump under the seat that you can attach to the tube and pump until firm. I've done it, and it took less than 5 min-

utes to get everything all pumped up. Thanks!

Ok, time for calendar talk. **This coming Fri-**



day is the annual fleet meetings. MCs start off the evening with their meeting at 6:30. Be prepared for lively discussions, and please bring \$10 each to finance the dinner for the judging volunteers that will be next weekend. Next come the youth fleets: X, Opti, and Laser, at 7:30. Finally, the C Boat sailors will meet at 8:30. C sailors, please bring \$20 per boat to finance the aforementioned dinner.

Bar prices will remain the same this year. Jeff Lippert has ordered some new red wines so please give them a try and let us know what you think.



Share Comments, Questions, and Tips with Beulah Sailors

Beulah is fortunate to have vibrant, competitive racing, with a great blend of top-performing sailors and newer sailors anxious to improve. The LBYC Racing Forum will use the experience of our sailing community to make LBYC racing even more competitive for sailors of all levels.

What?

Located on the LBYC website, the forum is a collection of comments, questions/responses and observations about C and MC racing on Beulah. A moderator will keep the forum fresh by posting weekend race results and soliciting comments and observations from race winners and "sage observers." Sailors can comment and ask questions about the weekend's racing, tuning, rules, boat handling, or any other topics suitable for public viewing. We started off the forum with a thread about the Andy Burdick session at the club on May 6, including comments and links to videos of the session.

Who?

We have enrolled all C and MC sailors as forum members. We didn't want to annoy anyone that hates emails, so we have initially set your forum preferences for online reading only. If you want to receive daily emails announcing or summarizing any new posts, see the "How Do I ..." section below.

Where?

You must be logged in to the LBYC website as a member to access the forum. Once logged in, click on the left menu item for Forums. If you don't know how to log in to the website, click on "member login" and follow the instructions to get your user name and password.

How Do I ...

read the current forum threads (topics)? From the forums page, click on the title, "LBYC Racing Forum." Then click on the title of the thread you want to read.

reply to a thread or ask a question on a thread? To reply or ask a question, open the thread and click "reply" next to one of the messages. Type in your text and click "post message" at the bottom of the screen. Your responses will help drive the forum, so be generous with your comments and questions. post a new thread? From the LBYC Racing Forum page, click on "start new thread."

receive email updates for new threads? From the LBYC Racing Forum page, click on "my forum preferences." Under the banner "message delivery," check the box that says "send forum messages to me via email." Then use the drop-down box labeled "frequency" to decide if you want either 1) immediate emails for new topics, 2) a daily digest email with the text of all posts, or 3) a daily digest email with subjects only. Then click "save" at the bottom of the screen
