

Commodore's Comments.

First, I'd like to apologize for missing the Opening Party, but it couldn't encouraging and demonstrates how pasbe helped. We had an unfortunate death in the family over the Memorial Day weekend. Thank you to those that expressed your condolences.

For those that did attend the Opening Party, you received a copy of the Yearbook. In the Commodore's Message I indicated that the Board was exploring ways to increase membership in the critical young family category. Anyone that has watched any of the X boat or Opti races this year understands the need to recruit this membership category there were only 7 X boats racing last Saturday! And, of the 11 X boats registered this year, just 3 families account for 6 of them.

In the Commodore's Message I also said that the Board was looking at amendments to the By-laws to accomplish the goal increasing this membership category. I also said that a draft of the proposed amendments would be posted to may become a regular member after 2 the website by now. If any of you have checked the website you noticed there wasn't anything posted yet. Initial ideas and proposals were circulated among the Board. This prompted further meaningful and vigorous discussion and other ideas. -----

There have been other thoughts and ideas offered and discussed by various members as well. All the discussion and engagement on the topic is sionate we all are about our club.

At the core of the discussion, the issue seems to be how to maintain the volunteer nature of the club while at the same time making it more accessible to the young family. Although our initiation and family membership fees total approximately \$1,500.00, the reality is that to join it currently costs well in excess of \$500,000.00 if you factor in the cost of the requisite real estate required for membership. That is a steep price to pay, especially for a young family just starting out. Some of the ideas discussed to address these 2 issues - the volunteerism and the actual cost to join - were to 1) create a second membership category without voting rights for those potential members that did not satisfy the "close proximity" criteria, 2) allow families with children in the LBSS for 2 years or more to join as regular members, 3) a crew membership years, or 4) eliminate the "close proximity" requirement and replace it with a defined territory, say anywhere within 20 miles of the shores of Lake Beulah for regular membership, coupled with a 2 year trial period for potential members -----

living outside the defined territory for them to demonstrate their commitment to the volunteerism after which regular membership would or would not be offered depending on their fulfillment of their volunteer requirements.

The Board recognizes this is a very sensitive issue about which the members have very strong feelings. Consequently the Board is still working on the amendments and welcomes any and all input from the members. Please, discuss it with your friends and, particularly, with any of the Board members. We really want your input. We will be hosting another round table discussion on June 29th at 4:00 p.m. and hope you all will attend and share your thoughts. Thank you!

While JP led the PRO discussion on appropriate courses for wind directions, offset & gate length (10 boat lengths!), listening to the fleet tell if the line is biased, and when/how to change the course, and even got in his swim trunks to tip over an MC to show proper righting ... first verify the sailor is OK, then approach from mast side, grab a sidestay, rotate boat until mast is no longer upwind.
