Work Day: Saturday, May 6, 2023

New Kitchen Hand Sink

A small hand sink was installed on Thursday, March 16 between the kitchen dining room door and the kitchen dishwasher out-take.

Accessories for the sink including a surface mounted paper towel dispenser and soap dispenser were installed March 18. This complies with the State of Wisconsin Health regulations for a commercial kitchen.

permit; the installation will be reviewed when the Town of East Troy inspects the building later this spring. The Town of East Troy Building Inspector met at the building prior to starting the installation and the sink was installed per his direction.

Telephone Land Line

The LBYC office telephone dial tone was non–existent at the beginning of the year. We have a bundled service Internet/ Land Line with a Spectrum Business Account. A field technician inspected the modem and service determining that the modem not only needed to be rebooted but reformatted while in contact with Spectrum Home Office.


We currently have the land line operational in the LBYC Office.

Power Outage

Power was lost at the building on Wednesday, April 5 after strong early morning thunderstorms (storm radar at right). A confirmed EF-0 (winds up to 80mph) went just South of I-43 after visiting Elkhorn. Thirteen tornados have been reported in Southeast Wisconsin so far in this busy hazardous weather spring.

The main breaker was shut off to protect equipment while full power was down. Power was restored by WE Energies @12:15. Cause of the power outage was attributed to downed branches over electrical lines.



Recent Power Outages:

In 2022, Foremost Electric submitted a proposal for the installation of a natural gas powered Kohler generator at the back of the building that will power essential equipment/ systems during a power outage. This price tag should be considered somewhat of an insurance policy protecting expensive equipment cooling/ heating equipment.

The cost is \$72,000. This will not only protect expensive equipment controls but also time regulated equipment to water conditioning, lighting controls and building electric locks.

Carpet Cleaning

J&S Carpet Cleaning from Waukesha cleaned the carpets on March 13. They pre-treated the carpet, steam cleaned the carpet and added a commercial surface protector to the carpet surface. The carpets, glued down to the fiber reinforced concrete slab do not look their age of 23 years.

The ceiling fans were turned on to help dry the carpet. The building thermostats were set at a higher temperature than normal to facilitate with drying.

Spring Preventative Maintenance

- The piers have been re-installed and the hoist is ready for operation. The crane has a new guide rope to help swing the boom into position.
- Akrit Refrigeration (Walk-in Cooler, Freezer, Back Bar Coolers)
 Condenser coils were cleaned and the remote condenser of the Back Bar coolers was cleaned and pressure inspected.
- Conditioned Air Design (Heating/Cooling)
 Conditioned Air Design will perform maintenance on the roof top exhaust fans and the grade mounted Air Handling Units.
 Filters, Belts and Controls.

Irrigation Works (Court Sprinklers)

Primed the intake pump and replaced the pea gravel filter of the water intake section. They inspect all of the sprinkler heads mounted on the tennis court fence. The courts are watered in two zones. Each zone has one (1) cycle occurring at midnight and 4:00am with a third cycle at noon during the summer.

Elko Incorporated

Inspected the two dishwashers, repairing a minor leak in the Kitchen dishwasher. They also resupplied the detergent, rinse and sanitizing chemicals used in each cycle.

Fleming Fire 1

This spring maintenance review is required by the Town of East Troy in order to issue the Liquor License for the club. Fire extinguishers and exit lights are inspected and tested during the visit. The hood over the ovens is inspected, firefighting chemical levels in the tank feeding the hood fire suppression nozzles are checked.

We are looking forward to seeing you this summer!


