Opti Action in Belgium

Hello my name is Avery Keane and myself, Mia Brandt, JP Crab, and Nick Berkowitz were representing the inland lakes, and all of America, as we flew to Belgium at the beginning of this July to sail in the Nieuwpoortweek regatta that we qualified for at the 2023 team trials. Sailing outside of the country is a whole lot different than the inland. A few major differences were the large waves, heavy current, and the salty water. In Nieuwpoort Belgium sailing with Team USA is very competitive but, we drove each other to do better and overall did well as a team. Sailing in the International Optimist Dingy Association (IODA) is sometimes just like sailing in the Inland Lake Yachting Association (ILYA). although your climate and breeze may differ, sailing as a team and cheering each other on has been the same no matter the location or team I have competed with in the Opti and I really saw that with our team this week. We not only got close with our fellow teammates we also met new people outside of the country including kids from Germany, Netherlands and Belgium.

On the first day of racing we did two races the wind was blowing up to 30 mph and the waves were as big as 5 feet. Some of my teammates capsized one even on the tow line in for the day. I got a 16 and a 17 on my two races and flipped over on the first one. On the second day of racing we got through 3 races with the wind blowing even harder than the day before. 3 of my teammates JP Crabb, James Chaytors and Elisa De Becker did extremely well that day despite the heavy conditions. I had two not so good races because of the current and severe wind but my last race of the day was more of a Finish I was hoping for. Our third day of racing was really rough our coaches Scott Lindley and Martin Barello described the one race we did as "unsailable" it was blowing up to 40 knots with 7 foot waves but somehow the current was still stronger. Out of the 98 competitors only 30 of them were able to finish myself not included. Congrats to JP for an amazing 3rd place finish and James for his 10th place, the only United States finishers that race. Day 4 of racing we separated into gold and silver fleet. 11 of my teammates including myself, had an amazing performance the days before and made gold fleet and the other four were so close but made the silver fleet and did extremely well. For our last day of racing we had totally different conditions the wind was much lighter, blowing about 6 to 10 miles per hour but the current was much stronger, if that was even possible. A lot of the heavier sailors did not do as well as they had hoped but many of the lighter sailors did extremely well, Graham Lewis won the first race in the silver fleet and Grace Crespin won the second, although she later found out she had been over. In the gold fleet Cal Naperotic and Constantino Conrad came back with some extremely good races to end of their regatta. On the last day of racing we had no sailing the wind was too heavy to sail us in getting up to 55 miles per hour that morning.







Outside of sailing we walked around on the beach or rented scooters to ride up and down the boardwalk and ate dinner at delicious restaurants where we had the most amazing food and drinks. Most of our team was staying at the same hotel and we had a good time playing in the halls and elevators and climbing on the roof of the hotel. Our overall finished were amazing – see full results.

House & Grounds

Ants

The six legged insects were noticed at the exterior entrance doors to the dining room. Ant traps were placed at either door jamb at the floor level. This is an annual problem.

Since spraying for mosquitoes, other flying insects have also been reduced. There have been no instances of ground bees nor wasps in the playground equipment. This is either a good or bad sign depending on your perspective.

Mold Remediation

On Friday, July 7, I met with the Director of Environmental Services for Badger Remediation a Division of Kelmann Restoration. They have been in business for 50 years. They have submitted a quote to remediate mold conditions within the LBYC Building.

I reviewed the areas that mold has been observed in the building. The largest area is the water treatment room. This room is a wet environment that has a significant amount of mold. Remediation in the past has been hampered by wall mounted pipes and floor mounted equipment; large water heater, iron curtain, water softener, pressure tank and brine tank.

It was determined during the on-site meeting that the back bar cabinets could be cleaned but the existing conditions warrant a replacement. This may be an opportunity to replace the wood cabinets with a refrigerated back bar cabinet between the two coolers.

The proposal would be to clean-up mold conditions; Remediation would require some building downtime and thus is done best after labor day.

Dining Room Window Blinds

One of the blinds self destructed with the help of an unnamed diner and has been removed from the mounting track.

Budget Blinds of Walworth County in Elkhorn submitted a roll-up shade configuration that was not approved. The existing blinds have a special reflective surface on the glass side of the cellular shade to help with heat gain and glare. Window Works, Brookfield: Proposal in progress.

Sally's Playgound

The fence separating the playground from the parking lot needs to be replaced. The fencing pickets are glued to the PVC rails and have been failing over the years. A repair instituted by Frank Rappold of sleeving a

repair reinforcement into the picket and then with self tapping screws re-attaching the picket to the rail has prevented the fence from collapsing into the parking lot. House + Grounds would recommend a wood fence with either rail and picket or horizontal fencing. This could be built with volunteers during work day.

Every year the playground equipment is inspected to make sure the connections are solid and the fish, slides and climbing apparatus is in good condition.

Building Sign

Sidestays donated money this year to renovate the existing metal sign in the front yard.

The new sign would contain updated graphics but would occur between the two existing posts. The sign panel would be removed and taken to a sign shop for a new face. The LBYC Board of Directors approved the sign restoration at the July 18 Board meeting.



Dishwasher Leak

A leak was noticed in the PVC drain of the dishwasher into the screened sump drain of the machine. On Monday, July 17 a site visit was made by Elko, Inc from Walworth, WI which is the dishwasher preventative maintenance, chemical supplier.

They were able to repair the PVC pipe leak, since the piping occurred within the machine and was not actually part of the general building plumbing system which would need a certified plumber.

The outside air plenum closure panel had fallen off the East air handling unit during the storm on Sunday night. The panel was repositioned and the set screw secured into position.

Over the weekend the third compartment of the dish washing triple compartment was plugged with rice and bean casings. There was a telltale backup ring in the sink. When I removed the PVC the culprit fell into my pail positioned under the trap. A dinner knife had fallen into the drain and was a pretty effective dam against the log jam of dinner rice.
