

#### Sun Watch

On the June 21 summer solstice the northern journey of the sun reached its furthest point north along the western horizon at 300.33 degrees and 15 hours 20 minutes of daylight. Since that time, our daylight hours have been reduced to 14 hours and 30 minutes. Its coming. Typically at the winter solstice, on December 21, there is only a little over 9 hours of daylight.



#### **Mold Remediation**

On Tuesday, July 25, the on–site team of Badger Remediation a Division of Kelmann Restoration worked to clean mold from several areas in the building. They spent the morning cleaning mold from the back bar, storage cabinet under the trophy case and the water treatment room.

House + Grounds requested that Badger also clean the interior of the liquor storage room. The portable air conditioner in that room was filled with mold. The existing portable air conditioner was disconnected and removed from the building. A new air conditioner was purchased and installed it in the room. Rather than drain the condensate from the new machine internally a drain hose from the back of the portable air conditioner was run to the exterior through the East wall of the LBYC building.

The mold cleaning was a first step in mold remediation which will occur in the off season.

#### **Building Sign**

A contract has been signed with Bauer Sign in New Berlin. New, approved and improved graphics developed by Vicki Clayton will be provided on

new sign panels which will replace the existing. The new sign will be the same size and location of the existing sign. The sign is being rehabilitated with a generous donation from Sidestays. Bauer Sign will contact the Town of East Troy for any permit required and cost of permit.

#### **Dining Room Window Blinds**

Budget Blinds of Walworth County in Elkhorn submitted an updated proposal for a replacement for the dining room blinds.

Budget Blinds submitted revised proposal after House + Grounds visited their showroom. The following is a list of various blind configurations that are being considered.

- 1. Reverse roll-up cassette, Single Surface fabric, No visible roll, No Valence, Various opacities.
- 2. Roll-up shade configuration with a valence cassette; various opacities.
- 3. Silhouette 2" wide cellular blind with controllable vanes between cellular shade fabric.
- 4. Duolite Two shade fabrics on one track top and bottom, various opacities.

House + Grounds also contacted Window Works in Brookfield who is Hunter Douglas supplier. Met with representative at the building July 26. They are also developing a proposal.

#### **Loss of Power**

The building lost power on Friday, July 28 around 8:15pm. The main disconnect to the incoming electrical power was switched off to avoid damaging existing equipment. The surge protector of this panel was indicating a trickle charge in the building. Certain circuits were still receiving power but did not meet the specifications of several important machines.

The power was out until Sunday morning at 2:00am.

Sunday Morning the main circuit breaker switch was reactivated around 7:30am. The temperature in the kitchen freezer was 48degrees; cooler had a temperature of 45degrees.
