Terms Addendum

Privileges of New Class of Membership.

- Thorough check out on the Club's small keelboats (Capri 22s or the similar boats).
- Certification to ASA 101 Basic Keelboat Sailing.
- Once qualified, use of Club's small keelboats through reservation program.
- Access to Club's mainland facility, including ability to charge food and beverage to membership account and invitation to mainland social events.

Restrictions of New Class of Membership.

- Non-voting membership.
- No access to Howland's shore facilities or moorings reservation list, except as a guest of a regular member.
- Not eligible to hold office of a Flag Officer.
- To qualify for CS membership, one cannot own a boat over 25' within the Southern California area.

Minimum Requirements of New Class of Membership.

- Complete Club's membership selection process.
- Pay dues and assessments of this membership class.
- Participate in at least four volunteer workdays per year.
- Obtain ASA 101 certification within six months of joining this membership class.
- Payment of any damage to boats over and above normal use.



Dues.

- Initiation fees of \$350 (covers the cost of ASA 101 certification, except for testing materials). Sailing lessons, other than an introduction to the Club's keelboats, are extra and can be arranged through the Club's adult learn to sail program.
- Regular monthly dues of \$86 for members ages 26 and above (some part of which shall be considered a facilities assessment).
- Convertible monthly dues of \$65 for members 18-25 (some part of which shall be considered a facilities assessment)
- Initiation fee and accumulated facilities assessment shall be credited towards conversion to Regular Member.

Miscellaneous.

• Regular members may also subscribe to the privileges of this membership class in order to use the boats once they successfully complete a checkout (\$50).
