ROCKPORT — George W. Carroll, 87, of 18R High St., Rockport, passed away peacefully on Friday, Sept. 2, 2011 at Massachusetts General Hospital following cardiac surgery. George was born in Chelsea on March 19, 1924. He was the son of the late Burkess Charles Carroll and the late Laura Frank Carroll, both from Chelsea.

George and his wife, Dorothy Joyal Carroll lived in South Lancaster for 40 years where they raised two children, Glenn P. Carroll and Cynthia J. Carroll. While living in Lancaster, George worked at the Colonial Press in Clinton as a printer for 31 years and as the Superintendent of Building & Grounds at Nashoba Regional High, Bolton, for 10 years. Because of his strong sense of community involvement, George was also a member of the Lancaster Volunteer Fire Department for 35 years. Upon retirement, George and Dorothy

moved to Rockport, and served as volunteer lighthouse keepers on Thacher's Island for six years. For 26 years he had been actively involved in the Thacher Island Association and faithfully participated in work-parties on Thacher's every Wednesday until this past August.

George loved his country and served proudly as a Gunner's Mate in the Navy Armed Guard during World War II. He made five Atlantic convoy crossings, and was at Normandy Beach on Day 9 delivering much needed supplies to our soldiers from the Liberty Ship LST1083. He delivered supplies to the beach-head during the Battle at Anzio. When the European Theatre was won, George went to the Pacific Theatre on the SS Thomas Fitzsimmons. There he was awarded a battle star for valiantly fighting in the Battle of Okinawa. He had remained proud to have performed service in his Country's time of need and never lost sight of the great privilege that it is to be an American and enjoy the freedom and liberty that his country offers.

George had been a man that possesses an easy smile, a wonderful sense of humor and he had been quick to extend a helping hand to anyone in need. His family and his many friends have been the most important aspect of his life.

He will be greatly missed by his wife of 65 years, Dorothy Joyal Carroll; his son, Glenn P. Carroll of Ohio; his daughter, Cynthia J. Carroll of Rockport; his granddaughter, Kate Carroll of California; his sisters, Edith Mugford of Wilmington, Lois Turco of Florida, Margie Hertzog of Colorado, Nancy Stewart of Florida; and his many "favorite" nieces, nephews, great-nieces, great-nephews, as well as his multitude of friends from around the world.
