Roy R. Wheeler Jr., 74, of Bath, Maine, died suddenly August 21, 2005, at the Maine Medical Center with family at his side.Roy was born in Boston, the son of Roy R. Wheeler Sr. and Mildred Brown Wheeler. He was raised in Wellesley, Mass. and Rockport, Mass., then graduated from Proctor Academy in Andover, N.H.

He was a U.S. Navy veteran of the Korean Conflict, serving on the U.S.S. Allagash. He studied plumbing and pipe-fitting while serving in the Navy and held a master plumbing license.

He owned and operated his own plumbing and heating business in Rockport for 20 years. After years of vacationing in the mid-coast area, he and his family moved to Bath, Maine in the late 1970s. He worked first for Eliot Winslow Tugboat Service, Southport, then later for Hogdon Yachts, East Boothbay.

He lived his life on the water and was an accomplished sailor and yachtsman. He served as commodore at the Sandy Bay Yacht Club, and as the assistant harbormaster in Rockport. He kept boats in the water all his life, sailing out of Rockport Harbor, and sailing and motoring the mid-coast area from Linekin Bay to the Kennebec River.

He was a self-educated scholar of local maritime history and was an avid craftsman and model builder. He built highly detailed ship models, depicting the working ships of the East Coast. His work has been exhibited in the communities in which he lived and at the Maine Maritime Museum.

He was a devoted volunteer at the Maine Maritime Museum and was especially interested in his work on the Grand Banks Schooner, the Sherman Zwicker, and in the curatorial department.

He participated in and was grateful for the Running Start program at Mid-Coast Hospital, Brunswick.

He is survived by his wife of 47 years, Nancy S. Wheeler of Bath; two daughters, Gigi R. Laberge of Henniker, N.H. and Phippsburg, Maine and Barbara F. Stallard of Virginia and Alice Springs, Australia; a granddaughter, Maxine R. Laberge; two grandsons, Noah and Jonah Stallard; a sister, Rosamond Thorp of Fresno, California; and a brother, Walker Wheeler of Durham, N.H.
