GLOUCESTER: Mace de Buy Wenniger, 91, of Gloucester, died peacefully on Tuesday, November 17, at his home on Goose Cove. He was the loving husband of Mary Ann (Sigmund Miller) Wenniger for 52 years. Mace, born in Los Angeles, was a resident of Manchester- by-the-Sea for 44 years, where they raised a family of six children. Mace was the son of the late Willem F. As artistic partners, Mace and Mary Ann would inspire one another to create and work at their favorite mediums and then share their expertise and love of art with others in their three galleries. They published four books together and another is forthcoming.

Beyond all of his professional and artistic accomplishments, Mace will be best remembered for his role as husband and father. He took on both roles with great love and devotion, all the while instilling a deep sense of creativity in all of life.

In addition to his wife, Mary Ann, he is survived by Ian de Buy Wenniger and his wife, Alexandra of Topsfield; Nina Fabiszewski and her husband, Lester of Virginia Beach; Anne Wenniger and her husband, Rik Ekstrom of New York; Susanna Wenniger and her husband, Rudd Kierstead also of New York; and Julia Wenniger of Tampa, Fla.
