Born in 1918, he was a World War II veteran having served in the North Atlantic on the destroyer escort, USS Eisner. John was an honors graduate of Bentley College.

John was one of the principal founding partners of Psychiatric Institutes of America, the largest chain of private mental healthcare facilities in the country at the time of its sale in 1982 to California-based National Medical Enterprises. He felt his most important achievement in mental health care was convincing the insurance industry to increase care to 28 days inpatient -up from the standard five-day stay.

John and his wife, Patricia, enjoyed playing tennis, golf and traveling. He was an excellent amateur photographer for which he won several awards. His main passion, however, was enjoying frequent gatherings with immediate and extended family and friends. His Foundation's major contributions were to education, young peoples' causes, and to the disadvantaged, all of which were most dear to him.
