Half Staff – Althea Ann Karr

After a rich, long life, Althea Ann Karr, age 94, died on May 11 at Addison Gilbert Hospital. She had been living in The Residence at Riverbend in Ipswich for the past two years, after more than 50 years on Summer Street in Rockport, Mass. Althea is survived by her brother, Daniel Karr.

Althea Karr was born to Alfred and Thelma Tapley Karr, on September 11, 1922, in Newark, N.J Althea completed her bachelors in art at Colleges of the Seneca in 1944. She furthered her studies at Columbia Teachers College and Harvard School of Education. For 17 years, Althea headed the art department at The Cambridge School of Weston.

When she moved to Cape Ann, Althea managed the art programs for the Gloucester Public Schools for six years, followed by another six years as an art teacher in the schools. In the 1950s, Althea illustrated a series of books about Native American tribes. In the 1960s, she was one of the first lay-people chosen to study at Episcopal Divinity School in Cambridge. Her thesis included vivid modernist paintings of the days of creation. In 1967, Althea won a grant to illustrate the Psalms by studying in Israel. In the 1970s, Althea's brother Dan constructed a solarium/studio in their home on Summer Street, so Althea could continue to paint, sketch, and print her work.

A prolific painter, Althea taught classes at the Rockport Art Association for decades. She painted religious icons, as well. She became a member of The Society of the Companions of the Holy Cross, an Episcopal women's society based in Byfield, in 1985. She attended St. Mary's Episcopal Church in Rockport, where she served as a lay-reader and a vestry member. Althea was active in the Cursillo movement for much of her adult life. Althea will be deeply missed by her community in Rockport and by the Companions.

Memorial services will be held at St. Mary's Episcopal Church in Rockport on Friday, June 2, at 1 p.m. The service will be followed by a reception.
