he rumors are true! Last month the Board of Directors unanimously approved a budget for replacing the ABYC bar. Zieba Builders Inc. have been selected as the general contractor. The projected completion date of the project is summer of 2018.

Joe is in the process of developing a project schedule and contract. The schedule is subject to board review and approval before any work will start. We feel that summertime is the right time to complete the project. Waiting until summer will allow us to setup bars on the patio during the warmer weather. We don't anticipate having to reschedule or cancel any events while

the up-stairs bar is closed.

This is about all the definitive information I have. We plan to publish a follow-up within a month. If you have questions in the meantime please contact Chuck (I know he is going to love this). He is spearheading the new bar project for ABYC. 

Every Wednesday and Friday we've had 20 or more sailors on the water for High School sailing, representing 5 different high schools (LB Poly, LB Wilson, LB Sato, St. Anthony, Marina HS). If you come down to the club from 3:30-6:30pm you'll be able to catch them battling it out and getting ready for their next regatta. Speaking of HS Sailing, our schools had a very successful fall, with Woodrow Wilson's Silver team clinching second at both the Anteater Regatta (NHYC), and Rose Bowl Regatta (USSCLB).



This spring our high schools will be travelling to San Francisco, Santa Barbara and possibly San Francisco/San Diego for Gold & Silver Pacific Coast Champs.

Come on down to the club February 3rd & 4th to see our great sailors in action and to spectate the fantastic SoCal #4!

The Junior Racing Program has been travelling or practicing every weekend during the Fall Season! Our programs offered coaching and regattas to over 30 sailors. Your ABYC Juniors have participated in regattas from San Diego all the way to San Francisco, competing against international sailors and having the time of their life experiencing racing conditions like they have never seen before.

Our racing Sabot Program sent 9 sailors to events this fall, competing in the Fall Gold Cup at Newport Harbor Yacht Club, as well as three other events in Newport Beach, San Diego, and our very own Alamitos Bay!

The Opti program has excelled at offering some of the best sailing conditions in Southern California, providing perfect conditions for practices with ABYC coaches. The ABYC Opti fleet is sending so many sailors to regattas that we have outgrown our trailer! ABYC sailors participated in 8 different events, with over 15 sailors, even getting some air time at the LA Boat Show!

We're kicking off the New Year and our Spring Programs with the Junior Invitational. Over 65 sailors registered for the event, a great turnout for a winter event! The first day the breeze was a steady 15-20 knots, with gusts seen up to 28 knots. The Sabot's racing was postponed to see if the breeze would settle down, but it never did and racing was called off for the sabot fleet. 

lue is approaching the mark and Yellow is leaving the mark, therefore, under rule 18.1(c), yellow is not entitled to mark room. Yellow is on starboard tack and is the right-of-way boat under rule 10 opposite tacks. However, as is changing course, she must give blue room to keep clear under rule 16.1. Yellows alteration of course did not give Blue time to keep clear, so yellow breaks rule 16.1.

Yellow is disqualified under rule 16.1.




