Pacific Inter-Club Yacht Association (PICYA) 2024 Guidelines for Scholarship Applicants

The Pacific Inter-Club Yacht Association offers \$2,500 scholarships to students whose parents, grandparents, or guardians are members of a yacht club belonging to PICYA. Applicants must be graduating high school seniors of the current year, or college students continuing to pursue their educational goals. Scholarships are not renewable. However, previous recipients are eligible to reapply provided they still meet all other qualifications.

All applicant's for a Scholarship must submit the following six (6) items:

- 1. A filled-out <u>application</u> signed and submitted (received) by five pm June 15th, of the current year.
- 2. An <u>Official Transcript</u> submitted by the High School or College" you currently attend.

A one-page Essay (see guidelines below) on the following subject: "How quickly do you think sea level rise will affect water sports, fishing and boating, and what changes would YOU like to see implemented to slow down its impact."

- 3. <u>One</u> page that lists your community <u>Volunteer Activities</u>. This does not mean paid internships or any paid positions. Do not list any sports or school extracurricular activities on this page.
- 4. <u>One</u> page that lists your extra-curricular <u>School Activities</u> such as science or debate clubs, participation in team sports, on the school paper staff, etc.

Guidelines for your PICYA Essay

Your essay carries the most weight of any of the items above in judging your application.

What the Scholarship Committee expects, and will look for in your essay are:

- 1. A Title for your essay and a length of about 300 words, preferably one page.
- 2. An introductory paragraph on why you chose the subject you did.
- 3. A statement of the positions you took.
- 4. Several paragraphs that support the positions you took in your essay; and
- 5. A concluding paragraph summarizing the reasoning behind the position and arguments you presented.
- 6. Research your topic, include references as postscript.

Your essay should be well written, have correct spelling, grammar and punctuation; and have one or more rational arguments that support the position(s) advanced in your essay.
