

2024 Vessel Safety Checks (VSC)

Vessels passing safety checks are awarded a U.S. Coast Guard / Auxiliary Decal that informs:

- Coast Guard / Auxiliary
- Harbor Patrol
- Sheriff's & Police
- other boating law-enforcement & safety agency's

that your boat was in full compliance with all Federal and State boating laws during a safety check for that year. Best of all every VSC is 100% Free of charge!



What if I Don't Pass?

If your boat does not pass, no citation is issued at that time. Instead, you are provided a written report in how to correct any discrepancies.

Find an Examiner

Are you ready to get started on your path to safer boating? Simply type in "vessel safety check" in your search field on your phone or computer and click the USCGAUX link and then click at the bottom to get started. We will locate the closest volunteer vessel examiners within 30 miles of your location and request that they contact you and set up your VSC for your boat. Or give me a call.
