Wow! Time is flying by. We just finished the Frostbite Series, and our year is nearly halfway behind us.

During my time at PYC, I have seen several attempts launch a junior sailing program with only limited success, but through the efforts of many dedicated people, we have now achieved a wonderfully robust program. The most constant source of energy and motivation has been Steve Sherman, without whom we would still be struggling. He was a major driver establishing our tax-exempt, charitable organization, Privateer Sailing Education Foundation,

was formed as a 501(c)(3) corporation to enhance sailing education on Lake Chickamauga.

With summer just around the corner, you will see a beehive of activity during this year's eight weeks of sail camp. We now have six full-time sailing instructors who are less than 20 years old, two of them from the Tulane 2022 College Sailing Open Dinghy National Championship team. They will be teaching 22 students per week in Opti and Fusion sailboats. This year's classes were already filled by the end of April, with only a third of the signage used in past years.

During the Fourth of July week, there will be a more advanced class for students who have attended at least two previous weeks of camp, which will enhance their basic skills. When you have an opportunity, thank Tim Chambers for his tireless efforts to sustain and grow this very popular program, while in his "spare time" keeping our fleet of motorboats functioning and safe.

The junior camp training has been augmented by the expansion of the Adult Learn to Sail Program, which includes three classes, scheduled in the spring, summer and fall. Each class meets either Saturday or Sunday for five weeks, during which students receive classroom training and become qualified on both Fusions and Flying Scots. have received an overwhelming number of applications for PYC membership from sailors involved in this expanded training.

Another wonderful outreach by Steve Sherman is his involvement with the Adaptive Sailing Program during the summer and his continuing involvement with this enthusiastic communi-



Boat Info in ClubSpot

In the new PYC managing software, ClubSpot, there is a great new feature that will help the club keep track of boats. You can now enter all the info about your boat into the software. At a minimum, please enter the type, length, boat name, registration number and insurance policy number. If needed, your boat details can be found at this handy website. sailboatdata.com. See picture below with my boat's info. You can even upload a copy of your insurance documents. It is very easy and will make the Dockmaster's job much easier in the future. Also, between the webmaster and myself, we will be updating the slip maps and make them available on the website.

Anchoring the committee boat

I was watching a recent Race Committee anchoring the Pontoon, and I realized that some of ya'll don't know how to do it correctly

DO NOT throw the anchor - it will get tangled with the chain. Just ease it down with the boat stopped (or moving slowly backwards). Then feed out enough line to acheive a 5 to 1 scope (it the anchor is in 10 ft of water, that means 50 feet of line). Once you have enough line fed out tie it to the center cleat at the bow and continue with the motor in reverse (idle speed) until the boat stops. The anchor is now set!

When you retrieve the anchor, pull it up using the roller at the bow. Do this without using the motor. The anchor may be muddy, so dunk it up & down a few times in the water to rinse off the mud. Set the anchor GENTLY on deck to reduce damage to the deck. The boat driver should not put the motor in gear until after the anchor is on deck. Neatly coil the anchor line. If you accidentally got mud on the deck, be sure to rinse it off when you get back to the dock.


Please welcome Scott Jenison as PYC's newest Associate Member.

The boat comes with trapeze harnesses, trapeze retractor shock cord, blade cover, forestay wind indicator, tool box full of spare parts. The only thing I find wrong is some stitching come lose from a mesh storage compartment, which is easily resewn.
