Task List:

- Wash outside windows of clubhouse
- Clean cobwebs off the clubhouse porch
- Dust the porch fans
- Blow leaves off the patio and porch
- Clean leaves out of the clubhouse gutters and downspouts
- Trim shrubs on the waterfront side of the clubhouse
- Cut back brush along pathways
- Cut underbrush and clean up around the kayak huts
- Weed-eat! Everywhere you see weeds! Cut them down!
- Weed the planting beds; plant flowers or bulbs in the beds
- See something broken, if you can, fix or repair it (if not able to fix or repair, report it via text to Orenda Gregory 706-264-3134)
- Empty the clubhouse trash cans (inside and outside)
- Clean up behind yourself when you use the kitchen (wash / dry utensils and cookware and return to appropriate storage area)
- Clean the grills
- Remove driftwood and fallen branches (smaller pieces of driftwood and small branches can be placed near the firewood stack by the fire pit)

Board of Directors Meeting – Minutes Draft 1

Monday, August 8, 2022

Tom Clark, Commodore

- The meeting was called to order at 6:00 pm
- Tom presented a draft of a proposed Constitutional change regarding Associate members and asked the Board to review it and provide feedback.

Martin Gregory, Secretary:

• The minutes had been reviewed by the Board and corrections had been made. *After a motion and a second, the minutes were adopted.*

Lynn Bruss, Membership Director:

- Current membership
 - Family membership 148
 - Associate membership 28
 - Marc Erickson resigned
 - Associate membership waiting list 10
- Two new Family Memberships were approved
 - Matt and Margaret Lyle
 - o Ryan Elverd
- One Family Membership reinstatement request was denied
- Two Associate Memberships were rescinded
- One Honorary Membership request was approved
- One Honorary Membership offer was approved pending review of Constitutional limits

Tina Marx, Treasurer:

- 58 members have not paid 2nd quarter dues/fees yet...approximately \$20K. Will send follow up letter with Clubspot/account login/set up instructions after end of August.
- Continue to work on collecting dues from member accounts which are 90 days past due.
- Will send bill to associate who resigned.
- Reviewed the P&L by month. Expect to pay \$20K in taxes in October.
- Have set target amounts for year end 2022 cash on hand and capital budget.
- With current financials, can only spend for "regular expenses" for the balance of the year.

Kevin Gersch, Dock Master:

- Boat Storage
 - 11 wet slips available C and D Docks
 - 3 dry slips South Cove lot
 - 4 dry slips Cabin Lot
 - 0 dry slips Clubhouse Lot
- Tony DiSanto purchased a 27' boat and has submitted a wet slip application.
- Has 21 volunteers Saturday for the safety ladder assembly and installation work party! THANKS to all volunteers! Installed 10 ladders on Docks A-E. Have one to install on South Cove dock. Have one extra ladder...most likely will install on A dock. Also have signs for each ladder "For Emergency Use Only."
- New slip assignment "maps" have been placed on Bulletin Board.

Orenda Gregory, Rear Commodore – Buildings and Grounds:

- New convection oven has been delivered. Need different "coil". Need modified wiring.
- New warming unit has been delivered. Need trays for unit.
- Freezer lock has been replaced. Signs placed on freezer and refrigerator...locked.
- Carl Dyer reported mildew in the men's showers and suggested adding another vent fan or another a/c vent.
- Recent heavy rains have washed some gravel in the main parking lot creating gullies. Tom recommended moving gravel/rip rap to replace that which the rains washed away.
- The six burner commercial electric stove is the next priority item on for the Kitchen upgrade project...\$5,300 to \$7,100.
- The area between the clubhouse steps and the dock steps needs pavers or concrete. The item is #3 priority on the non-cap list.
- Orenda emailed a "Volunteer Task List" to the membership last week. There is also a
 printed copy on the table in the hall by the Bulletin Boards. Volunteers are asked to select
 and complete tasks around the Clubhouse and on the grounds...and to record their work on
 the "Task List." One Volunteer has already completed a task!

Tim Chambers - Director Club Boats: (Rob Fowler reported for Tim)

- The motor on the Whaler would not come up to speed and was revving too high.
 Problem was a bad rubber hub bushing. Same problem happened to the Skiff 2 years ago. Options were to replace the bushing or to replace the whole propeller. Cost was about the same, so the whole propeller was replaced. The old prop was 13 pitch. The new one is 12 pitch which is better for low speed control, better towing power and slower top speed...all good things.
- Most of the Sail Camp boats have been put back on their trailers. The Whaler is on the dinghy dock.
- The Dog Days Race Committee has requested the Whaler and Large Rib. Bob Bissel will launch the Large RIB in time for the regatta.

Tina Campbell - Social Director:

- Have a request from Greg Gowan, Power Squadron to use the clubhouse for and engine maintenance course. The course is 2 hours/week over 11 weeks. Exact dates are to be determined. Approved.
- Have 65 RSVP's for the Dog Days Regatta and Social 08.13.22. Sign up has been cut off and food has been ordered.
- Planning a "Poker Run" on-the-water social for September 10th.
- Halloween Regatta and Social is scheduled for October 29th
- PIG Regatta is scheduled for November 12th
- Christmas Social will be either December 3rd or 12.10.22
- Last Sunday, July 17 the kitchen smelled like fish and the garbage cans were full. The club rules allow the club to charge \$100 with board approval to have the kitchen cleaned if not cleaned by the party using the kitchen.

Frank Hughes, Vice Commodore - Racing:

- Chase boat training sessions have been successful. 25-30 people have been trained so far. Thanks to David Bergevin for teaching the class.
- The Chattanooga Challenge has been cancelled.
- Planning is underway for a One Design Regatta for PYC Members. Will include J22's and J24's, plus other keel boats with similar PHRF ratings. More details to follow.
- Orenda advised that Ryan posted a list of approximately 18 individuals who want to crew for races or cruising on the PYC website. She encouraged all Skippers to contact help provide opportunities for these people to crew.

Rob Fowler, Past Commodore - PSEF:

- Sail Camp filled 173 spots with 152 unique campers (some campers attended more than 1 week. Both numbers are new records.
- This year had six (6) Level One instructors and five (5) Counselors. Three of the instructors were from the Atlanta Yacht Club, who brought some new ideas to share.
- The best two weeks of camp this year were the last two weeks of July. Normally the wind is better in early June.
- Sail Camp would like to thank the J22 fleet for loaning their boats for keel boat sailing in week 5's "Advanced Race Week" session. Thanks to J22 owners David Hensley, John Roberts, Frank Hughes, Steve Sherman and John Littlefield.
- Sail Camp would also like to thank the PYC membership for the use of the Clubhouse and Harbor.
- Megan Cline will be Co-Director of Sail Camp 2023 and will be Director in 2024.She has been a Camper, Counselor, Instructor and Head Instructor, s she understands the program better than anyone. The Sail Camp schedule fits nicely with her future work schedule as an elementary school teacher.
- Fall Adult Learn To Sail Saturday classes are fully booked. There are some Sunday class
 openings.

- The PSEF Flying Scot has been upgraded with a mast flotation device and a new summer cover.
- PSEF is making plans for its annual "Ready or Knot" Junior regatta in mid-September...weekend of September 17th.
- Ed Buiel has withdrawn from his role as Race Team Coach so PSEF is looking for a replacement.

New Business:

- Orenda reported PYC has a new contract with Republic Service for waste removal. The container size remains the same. The pick up (emptying) cycle of 1x/week remains the same. The monthly fee is now \$165 representing a \$3,200/year saving or a 62% cost reduction.
- Martin asked the Board for approval to post the revised PYC-PSEF Sailboat Program policy, rules and forms. Approved. Martin will get with Ryan on posting the revised policy.
- Insect Pests: Members have reported seeing ants and roaches in the clubhouse and fly larvae in the trash cans containing food waste. The Board asks Members to clean up the kitchen after use and to empty trash cans. PYC does not have a pest control service. Martin has sprayed Ortho Home Defense product twice now around the baseboards in all parts of the clubhouse. Ryan suggested "Do Your Own Pest Control.com" as a source for commercial pesticides for DIY application.
- The storage room needs reorganizing.
- PYC Insurance has increased by 17% since last year. Need to check the coverages and obtain new quotes.
- The Club answering machine is connected to the Fire Alarm panel. When unplugged, the Fire Alarm system is disconnected. Recommend moving the answering machine to the Office and "hard wiring" the phone line on the counter directly to the alarm system.
- Need to provide lockable storage for club-use-only supplies (paper plates, napkins, plastic cups, plastic utensils, etc.)
- Cleaning instructions have now been placed on both of the new Weber gas grills so that users know the proper cleaning procedure.
- Unsupervised children were reported in clubhouse and on swim dock (without life preservers). Need to check verbiage in Club Rules and Constitution.
- Club gate is being left open a lot, allowing non-members open access to the Club and grounds.
- The "Private Property, No Trespassing" sign on the right side of the gate is hidden behind the "Emergency Evacuation" sign. Recommend moving the "Private Property, No Trespassing" to the left side of the gate/fence.
- Need to encourage member volunteers. Need more people engaged in club projects.

Adjournment:

 Tom asked for a motion to adjourn the meeting. After a second and voice vote, the meeting was adjourned at 8:30 pm.
