





Growing pains

*In 1906 A group of sailors led by F.W. Wallace split from the Hudson Heights Club to form the Hudson Boating Club. It was established on a small piece of land just East of the gov't pier.

*The clubhouse was built in 1908 and the membership fees were set at \$3/yr.

*The two clubs co-existed for a short time & then merged in 1909 and a new larger clubhouse was built in 1910.









Built in Montreal in 1912 by L. J. Marchand (Length 40.7 ft. beam, 9.5 ft. , powered by original 32 h.p. Van Blerck gasoline marine engine, the 'FLOX" was originally owned by Mr. H.S. Grove of Montreal. A living reminder of an age long past, the history of the "FLOX" Encompasses some of the most significant events of the 20th century.

Under the flag of the Canadian Navy she served faithfully and anonymously as a naval tender in His Majesty's Navy for five years during World War I. She was purchased by Albert (Bert) Webb in 1920 with prize money from W.W. I.

She was the first power cruiser to fly the Hudson Yacht Club burgee (Hudson, QC). In August of 1920 "FLOX" made her first cruise under her new owner up the Rideau and returned via Kingston and the St. Lawrence.



**October 1934 Tragedy strikes a
2nd time, as fire destroys HYC &
Wilson Ice Houses**

The Fire, most likely caused by a spark from a CPR steam locomotive, destroyed the Ice Houses, the Clubhouse, tennis courts and all but 2 of the boats at the club.

As a result the Club executive moved quickly to buy McNaughten's Point and plans were drawn up to rebuild in HYC's present day location. The land was bought for \$3000, and the clubhouse cost \$7,500 to build.


