Alec Brown 1929 - 2007 by John Kimball

Alec Brown was a Renaissance man: a sailor, dancer, skater, musician, civil engineer, mechanical engineer, father (of 4), grandfather (of 9), athlete, soldier, Englishman, American and a gentleman. His death on April 11 was very sad news for many people, including members of the Saratoga Lake Sailing Club. We will miss his active participation in our racing and social programs.

Alec had a spirit and enthusiasm for life we should all admire. He enjoyed challenging people twenty years his junior in racquetball. He would face the fury of Saratoga Lake even on days when he was not perfectly healthy. He treated leukemia as a minor annoyance. At his 50th wedding anniversary, he demonstrated remarkable skill in dancing and banjo playing. At the same time, his kindly nature made even those with two left feet feel at ease.

Non-Member/Corresponding Member Storage Charge

The meadow has become a repository for abandoned boats. The club is not going to continue this practice as it does not benefit our active members, creates an expense for the club, and is even a potential health and safety concern. We have established a storage charge of \$50.00 per month for boats left on the club grounds not belonging to active members. The charge is also applicable to corresponding members who have boats on club property. This is a charge comparable to that paid at a marina or storage facility for similar services.

However, the sailing school does need boats, so an alternative to paying for storage, is to donate your serviceable boat to the sailing school. Although our tax status does not entitle you to a deduction, you help our sailing school and save the storage fees.

Please Mark Your Property

We continue to ask the help of both members and corresponding members to mark their boats and equipment so we treat personal property respectfully and do not dispose of anything by mistake. As we are cleaning out all of the club buildings this spring, this is especially important to you and to the club. So pick a nice spring day, go over to the club, and mark your stuff.

Grounds and Waterfront Improvements

We have started work on projects to improve the grounds and waterfront of our club. Some cleanup of the lower part of the upper barn has begun. The new ramp is ordered, and new dock sections are being built. Now, especially, we need the help of each member who has anything stored in any building on club property to mark everything with your name so we don't inadvertently adopt it for the sailing program or dispose of it.

We did receive a number of messages from club members volunteering to help us on the following projects but we need more help. Pick a job and send a note or give us a call and we will make sure you become part of the team doing that task you volunteered for.

North Ramp Replacement - The deteriorated north ramp concrete sections will be replaced with a solid concrete slab.

Fuel Containment - A specially-designed pan will be placed under the gas tank in the race committee shed to protect the environment from a possible fuel spill.

Boat House Transition - The boat house is a safety hazard to the membership and cannot be used. We will be adapting the lower level of the big barn as an interim storage facility until the issue of a new boat house is resolved.

Crane Work - Paint the crane

Water Rack Relocation - The water racks to the north will be painted to free beach access.

Beach Improvements - Removal of rocks along the main beach in front of the lower lawn to facilitate all uses of the beach/shore line.

Board Boat Rack Improvements - Relocation and consolidation of boats, removal of the section paralleling the shore in front, refurbishing sections needing work, and moving the section paralleling the sail shed closer to the house to get it out of the low wet area.
