#### From the South

#### From the West

East on I-90 (N.Y. State Thruway) to exit 24. Continue east on I-90 about one mile to exit 2 (Washington Avenue/University at Albany). Right at the end of the exit ramp onto Washington Avenue. Turn left at the first traffic light onto Fuller Road. At the stop sign, turn right and follow the access road to the CESTM Building, #251. Park in any available spot.

#### **THISTLE FLEET 2008**

Adirondack Thistle Fleet 147 is planning an active season of sailing and social events. At SLSC, in addition to our usual participation in Club sponsored Sunday and Wednesday racing, we will host two invitational Thistle regattas.

On the weekend of June 21-22 we will host the Adirondack Invitational Regatta. We have held this regatta each year for close to 20 years. Over this time, it has become one of the most popular Thistle regattas in the northeast, with attendance averaging about 25 boats, and attracting Thistle sailors from upstate New York, Long Island Sound, New Jersey, Massachusetts and Pennsylvania.

Later in the season, in October, we will host the Kayaderosseras Kup regatta, a part of the Thistle East Coast Fall Series. This end of the season regatta usually features strong (and sometimes cold) winds as well as our legendary hors d'ouvre and dinner spread on Saturday night. (Last year a regatta visitor summed up his trip as "It's all about the food.")

Several fleet members will also go on the road to other Thistle regattas around the northeast, and to the National Championship Regatta, which will be held at Pensacola, FL in August.

Socially we will, as always, participate in the Club sponsored events on Memorial Day, Fourth of July and Labor Day. We will, in addition, hold fleet sponsored potluck dinners and meetings throughout the year.
