Efforts have been underway for several months to evaluate the replacement of our club's website. Ridder Victor in Adirondack Invitational

Seventeen Thistle crews from around the Northeast assembled at the Saratoga Lake Sailing Club on the weekend of June 20-21 for the annual Adirondack Invitational regatta. As the crews gathered for the skippers meeting a 10:00, hopes were high that the light northeasterly blowing would develop into a good sailing breeze. These hopes proved vain, as the breeze died, attempted a comeback, then quit completely, leaving the lake a glassy calm. Providentially, each crew had been given a pack of playing cards as a souvenir at registration, and soon numerous games were in progress. Others gathered to swap stories or tinker with their boats. At 3:00 the Race Committee called it guits for the day and attention turned to the beer keg. This was followed by the world-famous (almost) SLSC hors d'oeuvres spread, and a steak dinner cooked by master chef Dave Hudson, daughter Amy and RC member Ann Seidman, Partving continued well into the night, as no one was particularly tired.

Sunday dawned with a light but building northerly breeze. As the fleet sailed out, the wind built to the 10-12 range with higher gusts and racing began. The first race was a typical triangle-windward–leeward course. "Doc" Gates (3878) took an early lead and was never headed. He was followed by Jonas Kelly (3848) and Eric Goethert (3849). In race 2, another triangle-windward-leeward, Jared Ridder (3874) rode a big lift on the left side of the second beat to victory, with Goethert and Kelly again taking the next two places. This left Goethert and Kelly tied for the lead with 5 points and Ridder third with 8.

This situation changed abruptly early in the third race, a two-lap windward-leeward course, when Kelly got onto the wrong side of the first beat and rounded back in the pack and Goethert capsized on the short leg from the windward mark to the offset. Rob Dexter (3953), Fleet 147's newest member, led through most of the race, but was nipped at the finish by Ridder and Dave Hansen (616). As the cutoff time for starting races was approaching, the RC called it a day at this point. This left Ridder as the winner with 8 points, with Kelly second and Hansen third. Trophies also went to Gates in fourth and Bill Wilson (3908) fifth. Among the locals, Dave Hudson finished in ninth, followed by Scott Meyer (12), JT Fahy (13) and Tom Kilcer (15).

Thanks to RC Chairman Clark Cooper and all who helped make the Regatta a success.




North Ramp Extension Project Completed

Mayer Industries Metal Fabrication of Ballston Spa, NY, delivered a 10' x 20' aluminum grated ramp in two sections for the north ramp extension the weekend of June 20. Mayer Industries collaborated with Allan Miller and Gene Auciello on ramp construction and specifications.

The ramp was installed prior to Sunday racing by a work party including Gene & Jeanne Auciello, Bob Barringer, Jim Benson, Joe Choi, John Collins, Tom Neufeld and Ann Patman. The ramp extension was primarily designed for launching and retrieving Kestrels, Flying Dutchman, Hobies, Jet 14s, and other light sailboats. Launching or retrieving larger sailboats, especially those on tandem-axle trailers, may bend the ramp.

After Sunday racing, Commodore James Nicol asked the Kestrel sailors about the ramp extension. Bill Churchman, long-time crew for John Collins aboard Kestrel 487, *Not to Worry*, exclaimed "The ramp is 300 percent better than it ever was."

The ramp extension will be removed during docks out and reinstalled in the spring.

It was a very light air race and the perfect opportunity to pop the 375 square foot Ensign spinnaker. With Dan at the helm and Gene at the spinnaker control lines, the team did a flawless spinnaker gybe and headed to the leeward mark.

After spending some time congratulating themselves on how well the gybe was done, the conversation turned to preparations for taking down the spinnaker and rounding the leeward mark. That's when reality hit. They weren't approaching the mark, they were there!

During the course of the fire drill recovery actions that followed, the team learned that the spinnaker, when used as a drag parachute, can bring an Ensign to a stop in about thirty feet. The other lesson is that these instances always happen when the mark is right off the clubhouse grounds and there is the maximum number of spectators.

Oh well, it's supposed to be a learning experience.

This year FSSA has added bow bags and transom ports to the FS specifications. This means that to race in FSSA sanctioned events a boat must have this equipment installed. This equipment facilitates rescue and recovery in the event that the boat becomes swamped. Boats build after 1992 are already fitted with transom ports as standard equipment. Bow bags can be purchased from the Saratoga Flying Scot fleet (we have a limited stock of bow bags and other spare parts) or directly from Flying Scot Inc. If you are interested in installing a bow bag but need help please contact Rob Hayes (see contact info above).
