#### From the Commodore

Additionally I ask that all property, including boat parts, be stored with your boat or labeled with you name in permanent marker. ### **Annual Budget Meeting Report**

The Annual Membership Budget Meeting of the Saratoga Lake Sailing Club was held on Sunday February 14 as an additional non-sentimental alternative to the observance of Valentine's Day. Those members in attendance reviewed and approved the proposed 2010 financial plan for the operations of your club.

The financial plan for the club originates with a budget committee that looks at historical income and expense trends, the spending requirements that are projected by club officers, and the recommendations of the Long Range Planning Committee. This year's budget committee consisted of Dave Hudson, Allan Miller, Matthew Sweeney, Al Tedrow, Tony Bianchini, and Bruce Blackie as Treasurer. The objective of the committee is to develop a proposed financial plan for our club that will maintain and preserve the physical assets of the club and maintain member responsive programs in a financially responsible manner. The budget proposal is presented to the Executive Board for approval and then to the membership for approval at the annual meeting.

The annual dues paid by the membership are the principle source of operational income for the sailing club. These dues have not increased since 2007 and the 2010 financial plan maintains the dues at the present level. Despite the economic uncertainty that surrounds us, the club membership, and interest in club membership, continues at a high level. The sensible management of our expenses and the prudent use of our credit line with the Adirondack Trust Co. will enable us to meet our financial goals.

A 2010 special projects budget was also approved by the membership. Water related projects include the funding for replacement of the flattop and outboard that have served us valiantly for many, many years. Also, the floating dock replacement program will continue with some added funding for new, lighter ramp sections., Shore side, the floor of the big barn is targeted for repair and/or replacement, new picnic tables are on order, some caretaker apartment improvements will be undertaken, and the on-going sailing club versus Canada goose battle will be escalated to the Star Wars level.

The officers, flag lieutenants, and committee members of your club have done an excellent job in managing and controlling the financial affairs of SLSC and keeping our club on a solid financial foundation.

#### Sailing School Update:

As many of you know from our previous messages, the junior sailing programs are filling up rapidly and in some cases are already full. There are some slots open in the kids intermediate and advanced classes.

Now is also a good time to start thinking about the adult sailing classes that we will be offering this summer. We offer 2 different adult classes:

Adult "Learn-To-Sail" is designed for those new to sailing or who have little experience. This class will teach the basics of sailing, "cruising", boat handling, crewing, and water safety. Please pass the Learn to Sail information along to friends who may have an interest in getting out on the water. For those of you who are always looking for crew, this class is a nice way to start grooming friends and family for spots on your boat.

Adult "Intermediate Sailing" is designed for those who have sailing experience. This class has been very popular in the past with members who are looking to improve their technique, as skippers and crew, including more advanced boat handling for "cruising" and for racing: starts, mark rounding, and tactics. The intermediate class is a smaller class which allows the instructors to concentrate on the skills which individuals are most interested in. This is a great opportunity to learn and improve.
