Become a Licensed Captain

Learn more Sunday, August 22 at 5 PM at SLSC

There are people in the club interested in obtaining their OUPV (Operator of an Uninspected Passenger Vessel) commonly known as the Six-pack license. The advantage of this license is that you become familiar with all the important skills for operating a boat in US lakes and coastal waters. It is an important certification in obtaining approval for bare boat chartering, doing boat deliveries and mandatory for operating a vessel with paying passengers.

The course will be given by Peter Byron of Nav. Ed training, a local company specializing in Captain and Masters U.S. Coast Guard licensing.
