We need people to assist in many facets of the program, but a few key areas that we have identified include:

Boat Work: The 2012 season was a little hard on our boats and we are hoping to get a lot of work accomplished over the winter and spring This includes all the fiberglass repair, hardware replacement, painting, etc. that you would expect is needed to get the boats ready for next year. This will be accomplished over the course of the winter/spring at times that are convenient for the people involved. There may be a couple of scheduled work parties as well.

Sailing School 2012 season Wrap Up

Now that the docks are out and the boats are (almost) put away, it seems like a good time to give everyone a summary of the 2012 Sailing School Season. We had a very successful season with over 120 students coming through the various classes that we offer. We had some good weather for most of the season and by all accounts from the students and parents, we had a lot of happy sailors. From a monetary point of view, the revenues of the school continued to grow a little again this year, and that will allow us to invest some more money in upgrading the boats.

Highlights of 2012 include:

- An almost 50% increase in the number of juniors who attended one of our programs.
- Marked increase in Junior Racing participation. We had 17 juniors who were involved with our Junior Racing program and who came to classes and/or attended regattas. A number of them were also on the water racing on Wednesday nights.
- The expansion of the curriculum we offer. The Junior racing program was expanded to include a full week of training followed by an entire season of classes in the evenings to practice. We also added a Crew class to help education adults on how to improve their skills as crew members.
- Increase in the number of US Sailing Certified members. The club hosted a Level 2 Instructor certification course in the spring which was attended by 5 members. In addition, we had 7 juniors who went through the certification process to become US Sailing Junior Counselors.
- As always, we are gratified to see the number of people who took classes with us who apply for and/or become club members.

Of course, all of the success of the school program is directly attributable to all the people who are involved with the school and the hard work that they put into the program. Without making this sound like an awards acceptance speech, I would be remiss if I didn't thank everyone:

Aaron and Peter: We simply can't say enough good things about them. The students had a great time, the student and parents were always complimenting us on the job they did, and everyone learned a great deal from them. We couldn't ask for anything more.
