Sailing School 2013 Season Wrap Up

Now that the school sessions have ended and the docks are out, it seems like a good time to give everyone a summary of the 2013 Sailing School Season. We had a very successful season with almost 70 adult students and 80 junior students taking part in the various classes that we offer. This does not include the many private lessons that get offered. For those of you keeping score at home, that is roughly a 20% increase in enrollments this year. Most of that increase was on the adult side. From a monetary point of view, the revenues of the school continued to grow again this year, which allowed us to invest some more money in upgrading the boats, including a new (to us) Flying Scot and 4 newer Lasers to replace some of the more tired ones in our fleet. Most importantly, we had a lot of happy sailors. I can't begin to estimate the number of e-mails, phone calls and comments I received this year from parents and students who were just happy and having fun sailing.

Highlights of 2013 include:

- A large increase in the number of adults who attended one of our programs.
- Another increase in participation in the junior racing program. A number of them were also on the water racing on Wednesday nights.
- Some new US Sailing Certified members. The Club hosted another US Sailing Junior Counselor course this spring and we had 3 Juniors get their certification for the first time and 2 who took the course just as a refresher.
- As always, we are gratified to see the number of people who take classes with us who apply for and/or become club members.

Of course, all of the success of the school program is directly attributable to all the people who are involved with the school and the hard work that they put into the program. I cannot let a season end without thanking everyone:

Aaron and Peter: I simply can't say enough good things. The parents love them, the kids love them, the adult students have a great time. We look forward to them returning next year.

Jen Tayne: Jen was kind enough to jump on board and help us out throughout the summer whenever we had too many kids or Aaron and Peter were away with the racers. She was a huge help and we hope to see her again next year.

The Sailing School Committee: The school committee is large, and it needs to be, in order to take care of the myriad of things that go into the school every year. It couldn't happen without the efforts of a team of dedicated volunteers. A huge thank you to Tony Bianchini, JT Fahy, Devon and Kathy Howe, Mary Kate McCarty, Emmett McCarthy, Allan Miller, James Nicol, Skip Parry, Laura Rappaport, Matthew Sweeney, and Greg Tkal for all of their efforts.

Junior Counselors: Last year we began certifying many of our juniors as part of the US Sailing Junior Counselor certification program. All we ask was that they help us when they can with the junior programs. Many of them then donated weeks of their time this summer to assist at the junior classes. There is no way we could accommodate the number of junior sailors that we do without their help. Our thanks to Piotr Czachowski, Peter Hamlin, Brett Howe, Helaina Howe, Jack McCarty, Hannah Merrill, Cameron Parry and Drew Welcome.

Adult Member Instructors: A number of our members are also US Sailing certified instructors, and have given us many hours of their time to make the adult program a success. Watching our membership teaching others to sail and improve their sailing never gets old. Thanks to Mike Funk, John Kimball, Scott Meyer, Allan Miller, Glenn Miner, Greg Tkal, Jerry Zell for all their help.

With the 2013 season officially over, we have already started work on the 2014 season. In 2014 we will continue to streamline the process for running the school so that we can offer all of the services we do now, but with less stress on the resources/manpower of the club. At the same time, we will continue to refine and expand our offerings to suit the needs of the membership.

Water System Update

During the docks-out work party we removed the lake water intake, as we do each Fall. The house is operating entirely on well water until we reactivate the lake water intake in the Spring of 2014. The well has limited capacity. For that reason we ask that house water not be used to wash any boats until the lake water intake is reactivated next Spring. The lake water intake is normally reinstalled at the first docks-in work party in early May. However, if people want to start work on their boats before then, we can arrange a special work party in April to reactivate the lake water intake. The only limitation is that threat of a hard freeze must be past.

Property Tax Update

Our challenge to our new Real Property assessment remains unresolved. In mid-October, Attorney David Rowley met with the judge assigned to hear our property tax appeal and a representative from the Town of Malta. With Board approval, Rowley presented an offer to the Town of Malta with the goal of settling the case without the need to go to trial. The Town has not yet responded to our offer.

We have also received our 2013-2014 School Tax bill. This is the first of two property tax based bills we receive and pay each year, the second being the County and Town Tax bill. The amount of our 2013-2014 School Tax is in line with the estimates we made and reported to the membership in the June 2013 Telltale. We hope to have more definitive information by the date of the December Membership Meeting.


