Commodore's Corner By Vic Roberts

I want to thank Terry and Joanne Fraser, who are members of the Y-Flyer fleet, for donating a fence to the Club. Flag Lt. Grounds John Smith and his crew installed the new fence during our first Spring Work Party to keep geese off the lower lawn. The fence is more attractive and durable than the fence we used last year, and should help keep our lower lawn goose-free. One way to reduce our property taxes would be to get a Conservation Easement for our property. In exchange for a lower property tax rate, we would agree to limitations on future development of our property. For example, we could agree to never sell the property for residential or commercial development. However, we need to proceed with care, since Conservation Easements are complicated and can have consequences we did not anticipate. For example, we do not want to be told we cannot build a new barn, or a boat storage building, if we decide that we need one in the future. If any member has experience working with New York State on Conservation Easements, please contact me so we can learn from your experience.

Members are reminded that the Saratoga Lake Protection and Improvement District will be treating the lake with herbicide in early June to control weeds. We will have to shut down our lake water intake for a week or two during this period and fall back on our well for the house water supply, so boat washing will be restricted during this period. More information about the herbicide treatment will be posted on the front porch of the house, and sent to the members by email.

The club's Saratoga Sailing School is a great place to learn to sail or hone your skills.

But hurry, classes are filling fast. The youth program has just a few spots left, and adult classes are almost full, too. To register and to see the complete schedule, visit <u>www.saratogasailingschool.org</u>. If you have questions, email: <u>info@saratogasailingschool.org</u>.

Adult classes meet for three hours in the evening. Beginner and intermediate youth programs (ages 9-17) are all-day for one week or two, with youth racing in the evenings. All classes are taught by US Sailing-certified instructors -- the gold standard for instruction. Many instructors are Club members who have gone through level I or II of training. Most adult classes are taught on Flying Scots or Ensigns – so you'll be sailing with an instructor and a small group. This creates a personal and safe environment for learning.

All classes stress safety and skills. And fun!

The US Sailing Small Boat Level 1 Sailing Instructor Certification Course, is designed to provide sailing instructors with information on how to teach more safely, effectively, and creatively. The goal of the program is to produce highly qualified instructors, thereby reducing risk exposure for sailing programs. Topics covered in the course include: classroom and on-the-water teaching techniques, risk management, safety issues, lesson planning, creative activities, ethical concerns, and sports physiology and psychology.

She also enjoyed spending time at her "home away from home", The Old Key West Resort at Disneyworld, with her sister and brother- in- law, Teresa and Dwayne Powell. 
