## Commodore's Corner

First, I want to share some good news. Saratoga County Supreme Court Justice Thomas D. Nolan, Jr. has signed the agreement between the Saratoga Lake Sailing Club and the Town of Malta reducing the property tax assessment on our main parcel of land from \$1,050,000 to \$860,000. Under the terms of the agreement, the Town agrees to not raise our assessment for four tax years: 2013, 2014, 2015 and 2016. In return, we agree to not challenge the assessment for the same four years. We will shortly be receiving a partial refund for the County and School Taxes we paid in 2013 while this matter was being litigated.

The reduction in assessed value supports our goal of holding our membership fees at an affordable level. The other way we achieve this goal is to call on members to volunteer their time, energy and skills to help run and maintain the Club. I have some good news, and some not so good news, to report in this area.

Member participation in the Spring and Fall work parties remains very good. However, we do not do as well with the three major social events, race committee assignments, Wednesday night pot luck dinners, and overall clean-up of the club house.

Members who attend the social events are requested to help with setup or cleanup for one of the three events, based on the last name of the Primary Member. Please remember that setup includes preparation and cleanup includes washing all the pots and pans used to prepare the food. All too often, the same members who spent the day before the event purchasing and preparing the food are left to clean up the kitchen. This is not fair to those members.

Members who attend the Wednesday night pot luck dinners are reminded that everyone is expected to bring an appetizer, side dish or dessert to share. Each Wednesday night one of our Fleets is assigned to cook, while a second is assigned to clean up. On a recent Wednesday night, a lot of people ate dinner but no one bothered to clean up, leaving a mess that Kathy Johnston and Aaron Holland cleaned up. While I appreciate the efforts of Kathy and Aaron, this is not their job. If members want the Club to continue to support the Wednesday night pot luck with hamburgers and hot dogs, they must do their share.

The 2014 Y-Flyer International Regatta was held July 28th through July 31st at Saratoga Lake Sailing Club. SLSC Y-Flyer Fleet 63 hosted the event. Sailors from the USA and Canada competed for the trophy. The Internationals event was part of a three regatta series that started the weekend before at Chippewa Lake in Ohio and finishes this weekend at Lake Lashaway in Massachusetts which is where I am writing this article. The three regattas make up the Thoroughbred Series and a trophy for the highest scores will be awarded at the Lake Lashaway Kenyon Cup Regatta.

As of this time Shelby Hatcher with father Nile Hatcher of Atlanta have the lead in the series. Shelby won 4 of the 7 races at Chippewa Lake's Midsummer Madness Regatta and finished in 3rd overall at Saratoga Lake.

On Monday the competitors arrived on the SLSC grounds (many arriving from Ohio) and registered, set up tents and got to know their way around the club. The scheduled practice race was canceled for lack of wind.

Tuesday was a day of moderate to heavy wind and three races were sailed. Mark Barton (Little Rock) sailing with sister-in-law Jill Barton (Atlanta) won the first two races with Kevin and Wanda Black (Indianapolis) winning race three.

Wednesday started and finished with no wind. No races.

Thursday saw the heavier air return and in the first race Canadian "Fast Eddy" Hone, with son Justin, of Belwood Lake in Ontario surprised the fleet and took the win. The second race was abandoned when lightning was seen in the area. After the storm cleared the area it was too late to restart the racing and the regatta was over.

Mark and Jill Barton won the championship by 0.25 points over Kevin and Wanda Black. Four Saratoga Lake Sailing Club boats participated. Allan Miller was crew for a Canadian from Quebec, Bob Somek.

John Smith was the Regatta Chairman and did a great job organizing the event. Jackie Smith was in charge of food and also did a fantastic job. Volunteers from SLSC helped both on the water and on shore.

The Race Committee consisted of Paul White (Indianapolis) and Peter and Ann Seiden (Saratoga Lake).

The competitor traveling the farthest was a Canadian from Alberta Province. USA claimed 6 of the top 10 places. The highest placing SLSC boat was Terry and Joanne Fraser at 6th.

In the event the Y-Flyer National Champion cannot attend the Championship of Champions Regatta then the International Champion will attend. This year the C of C is to be held at Indianapolis in Thistles.
