Notice of Special Meeting (Continued from Page 1)

Change 1: - To add the following language to "Article IV Membership" under the section "B. Class of Membership". This will add a new membership class for youths not yet of college age but whom the club feels would be a benefit to the club. Membership sometimes receive Student Membership applications for juniors who do not meet the existing "Student Membership" requirements and this change will fill that gap.

- 7. **Junior Member:** An individual who is of secondary school age (typically age 19 or under), who is active with the Sailing School. Their privileges are limited to their use of Club facilities during the sailing season and receipt of Club mailings; they cannot bring guests, vote, or hold office. Their application must be cosigned by a parent or guardian, who must also execute an Agreement and Waiver provided by the Club.
- **Change 2:** A revision to the following language to "Article IV Membership" under the section "B. Classes of Membership" to clarify full time status. Deleted language is in strikeout, and additional language is in italics.
- 2. **Student Member:** An individual up to age 25 whose primary occupation is that of student attending an educational institution who is a fulltime student at a recognized institution of higher learning may have a membership with all the obligations and privileges of membership. Minors must have parental consent.
- **Change 3:** A revision to the following language to "Article IV Membership" under the section "B. Classes of Membership" to make the age requirement consistent with the student membership. Revision is in italics.
- **1. Regular Member:** An individual, or family unit and any children under the age of 21 *or* who are fulltime students at a recognized institution of higher learning *up to age 25*, are members and constitute a membership. They have all the attendant obligations and privileges, except that only one person from a membership may vote on any issue or hold elected office at any one time.

Grounds

The barn roof repair was completed in early December. The valleys were replaced. We need to find a way to keep the pine needles from collecting on the roof. The acidity from the needles is eating through the metal.

With docks in only a few weeks away (optimism) it is time to start planning for the spring work parties.

This year we need to build several new Kayak racks. The current racks need to be modified to make them easier to use. We would like to develop a plan the storage lockers that are by the racks. We can leave room between the racks and the boats along the driveway and or organize them in the space between the trees closer to the playground. Any and all suggestions about how to make this area better are welcome.

If we can get the boats and trailers removed from the center of the meadow, we will install matting and gravel in that area. As we get closer the first weekend work party, we will determine where the temporary storage will be set up. Over the coming years we can continue this process for the entire meadow.

There will still be the usual cleanup along with setting up the canopy and fence long the seawall.

Bid requests have been sent to Landscape Architects and Arborist to develop a plan for the grounds.

The major areas in need of repair on the seawall will be repaired as soon as the weather permits.

We are happy to announce that the 2015 Sailing Season schedule has been completed and registrations are now open. We appreciate the patience of everyone who has been contacting us asking for next year's dates and gift certificates. New Junior Adventure Sailing Class

We have been speaking about adding this class for the last couple of years with a number of parents and are very excited about being able to offer it. The Adventure Sailing program is a new program for juniors who want to explore the many different aspects of sailing outside racing. We will play around with as many types of boats as we can get our hands on such as keelboats, multi-hulls and a variety of dinghys. We'll cover a wide range of sailing skills related to day sailing and cruising including motoring, docking, anchoring, navigation skills, boating safety and mostly just sailing for the fun of it.

The program will run throughout the season and includes a full week of sailing from July 20th - 24th. The group will also meet on Thursday evenings throughout the summer from July 2nd through August 20th. If there is enough interest, we do intend to offer an optional field trip at the end of the season where we will take the kids sailing on Lake Champlain on chartered "big boats" (i.e. boats in the 40 foot range). We will work closely with the parents to work out the field trip details.

New Adult Racing Class

We have offered the introduction to racing crew for a few years now, and we are happy to now offer a skills improvement class for those who have been racing with us. "Adult Race Improvement" is designed for those people who are already racing and are interested in improving their skills in a small coached environment. Where possible, we hope that racing teams will take the course together in their own boats so that the skills are directly applied to their own racing. The class will cover topics such as starts, beats, reaching and running, finishes, tactics and strategy.

More Early Season Adult Classes

At the request of many of you, we have added more evening classes for adults in the months of May and June. Hopefully this will make scheduling easier and not interfere with the usual summer madness. It will also give you more time during the summer to try out your new sailing skills!




