The race committee was considering using the W1 but started down wind and finishing down wind. The second race was a W1 finishing towards the club. No one went to their wallets to file any protest. (Protest forms were the largest bill in your wallet to present to the non-existent protest committee)

We did have an interesting situation at the finish line for the second race. 3 boats overlapped coming to the finish line at the committee boat end and the windward boat calling for room. The leeward boat was calling to rights and claiming the windward boats were barging. The right call is that the committee boat at the finish line is a mark not an obstacle, therefore the inside (windward) boat must be given room.

#### All For Fun Racing Series Week 3

James Nicol sailed his Laser to the dock to bring out another rescue boat to tow Andrew to the dock. For this effort we decided to give James the win for the first race.

We did get 2 races in by sailing a modified windward leeward finishing downwind. The second race finished just at as it got DARK and we sailed to the docks in moonlight. James Symon won the second race by 6 second over my Y-Flyer. There should be a law against spinnakers!!! Congratulations James.


