#### Commodore's Corner

I have to admit that I have written this column several times this month. My original one was written last Saturday after what seemingly was another successful grounds work party. Quite a few members came out and gave up the better part of their Saturday in some sweltering heat to move boats, re-organize the boat park and meadow, mow, put stickers on boats etc. The reason I say "Seemingly successful" was that I had mixed emotions afterwards. On the one hand, I was so proud to be part of a club where so many people volunteer their time to help the club and do the work that needs to be done. The question that was bothering me was, did all of this particular work need to be done by volunteers?

Much of what we spent our time doing included identifying boats and trailers that had old stickers or no stickers and moving boats to their proper place. Even more disturbing was the number of boats we identified that needed stickers that didn't exist as the members did not register them when they renewed. All of these tasks certainly do not need to be done by volunteers, but rather they should be taken care of by the members whose boats are involved. I certainly don't believe it is too much to ask every member to register and pay for every boat they plan on keeping at the club. Our dues are extremely low and our boat charges range from \$25 - \$75 per year for boats. Nor do I think it is too much to ask that members come to the club before mid July and place their stickers on their boats and make sure they are moved to their proper place in the boat park, lawn or meadow. ### **Ensign #23 Recommisioned**

Recently the team of Bruce Blackie and Dave Miller completed the restoration of Ensign No. 23, after a 10 month effort.

The most significant work being completed was the rear deck re-core along with replacement of much of the aging hardware. After "cutting their teeth" on the complete restoration of #114, now owned and enjoyed by the Fowler Team, they took on the task of making #23 a show piece for the Saratoga Lake Sailing School. Never ones to shy away from a challenge the Bruce & Dave (B&D) team skillfully removed the rear deck and much of the wood work, re-cored the deck section and refinished the 54 year old mahogany with professional attention to detail at every step. The results are not only significant to the school but also to the Ensign Class Association as it takes an important member of the Ensign Fleet from the eventual scrap yard to a show piece to be proud of.

As the pressure mounted to get her in the water this sailing season additional reinforcements were brought in to get the bottom and rigging in shape to reflect the condition of the top sides. Scott Meyer and Piotr Czajkowski repaired and resurfaced the lower hull and rudder while Tony Cannone replaced all the running rigging and some standing rigging. So after a flurry of activity on the last weekend of July, 2016 and many adventures of her 54 year life, Ensign #23 will live on for many more years to come thanks to the efforts of a couple of very special SLSC club members who believed in the boat and in themselves! #### **Grounds Report**

We had a successful July work party on the Saturday the 23<sup>rd</sup>. 14 members participated. Most of the boats and trailers in the meadow were moved and the area mowed. Empty trailers were gathered on the south side. The west end did not get mowed due to the extreme heat.

Most of the boat park spaces were organized. The crew was able to get through spaces 1 to 94 before the heat became too much. We were also able to look at the dinghy rack and the 3 northern most racks on the lawn.

Mark Welcome was kind enough to attach most of the remaining stickers that were on the table that day. If you do not have a sticker for a boat that you have brought to the club since the beginning of the year, please pay your fee to John Kimball and he will notify me to get you a sticker.

For any of you that have not participated in moving approximately 100 boats on trailers, I want you to know that this takes an enormous amount of effort. This year most of the boat park was emptied in the fall to allow for tree trimming, gravel work and the creation of an additional 10 spaces. I believe that this caused a lot more of the boats in the park to be in the wrong place, therefore requiring more boats to be moved during the work party. Hopefully next year most members can get their boats into their assigned spaces before the July work party and make our job easier.

During the work party we found a club dolly under a member's boat under one of the racks. The 3 dollies that the club owns are for all of the members. Please use the dolly, place your boat and leave the empty dolly on the lawn, available for the next member.

I have attached several pictures of boats that we could not identify since they had no stickers or names of any kind or appear to be in the dinghy area and do not have a mooring. Please let me know if one of the pictured boats belongs to you. The first 7 pictures are from the new dinghy rack. If you have a boat there and do not have a mooring, please move your boat to one of the other 6 racks.
