Sailing School Update

We are only 5 weeks away from our first sailing class of the season! That must mean it's time to sign up. Historically members are the last to sign up for sailing classes, a trend I would love to reverse. As the school fills up, it gets harder and harder to make adjustments to get members and their kids or grandkids into the sessions that are almost full. A few options of special note:

Racing Classes for both new and experienced racers:

We are happy to announce that we will once again be offering two of our racing classes to members for only \$50 for a week's worth of instruction. You simply can't beat that price as non-members pay the usual rate of \$245 for a week's class. The school offers this discount as a service to members and to help promote more involvement in the racing programs at the Club.

"Introduction to Racing" is designed for those people who are interested in getting involved with racing. The class will teach students the basic concepts of racing, what is expected of race crew, and will give students the opportunity to try some races with experienced skippers at the helm.

"Strategic and Tactical Racing" is designed for those people who are already racing and are interested in improving their skills in a small coached environment. Where possible, we hope that racing teams will take the course together in their own boats so that the skills are directly applied to their own racing. The class will cover topics such as starts, beats, reaching and running, finishes, tactics and strategy.

Bylaws Revision Vote

Just a reminder that the vote on the bylaws revision that has been discussed at the Budget meeting and the Sailing Programs Discussion meeting, will be held at the Sailing Programs and Pizza Party to be held at the Club on May 7th at 12PM.

The current language being looked at is:

"Only Club-owned power boats are permitted to dock or moor in the Club mooring area. Privately owned power boats are not to be used or left at the Club."

The proposed revised language is:

"Personal power boats are not to be stored on Club grounds or used at the Club for recreational purposes under any circumstances. All other uses, docking or mooring of power boats will be at the discretion of the Rear Commodore or the Executive Committee in his/her absence.".

This change would move responsibility for specific regulations to the Rear Commodore who oversees waterfront. Please plan on attending the Sailing Programs and Pizza Party in order to vote and to enjoy the Sailing Program. If you are unable to attend, please arrange to give your proxy to another member.

US Sailing Certification
