


As it proved to be a very strenuous day of sitting outside the boat to balance the wind and especially the heavy gusts!

Throughout the day there were 6 boats bunched close together at the front of the pack. Only 5 points separated 2nd place from 6th place. In the races, three different skippers challenged Mark Swanson for a 1st place finish, but successfully only once (Ray Cudney), so that was Mark's throw-out race, leaving him with four 1st place finishes. Only Brad Dunn chalked up two 2nd place finishes. The rest of the pack finished far behind. Steve Olsen could have done better, had he had time to get the water pumped out of his hull between races! And kudos to Ray Cudney for leaving his boat during a race to help a capsized sailor, that's what makes him a great skipper to race beside!

## Grounds Report

Members all,

I have an unfortunate duty to perform this month. The club boat park policy is listed here for your information. Please note the importance of compliance with this important club policy. Especially note the importance of the dates June 30th and July 15th.

## Boat Park Policy

### General

The Saratoga Lake Sailing Club (SLSC) has a designated boat park area for trailered sailboats. A map and boat park assignments are posted in the Race Committee shed at the north end of the boat park. Please see Racing and Documents section of this website to view current assignments.

Each boat must display a valid, annually renewable, SLSC boat park decal. A valid decal shall be affixed to the boat or trailer before the boat is placed in the boat park, or no later than June 30. The decal shall be affixed to the starboard bow, or to the front of the trailer on the starboard side.

- Members failing to affix a valid SLSC boat decal by July 15 will lose their boat park assignment, and their boat(s) will be moved to the meadow for storage.
- Members who do not place their boat in their assigned boat park space by July 15 will lose their assignment and the location will be made available to other members.
- It is the responsibility of each member to ensure their boat(s) area in their assigned space(s).

The boat park is under the responsibility of the Flag Lt. Grounds who will establish appropriate rules and guidelines to assure the sailing enjoyment of all members.

There are several members waiting for boat park spaces to become available. Please be sure you are in compliance with the policy to avoid losing your boat park space.

The sailing season is well underway at this point with over a month of adult classes and a couple of weeks of junior classes under our belt. I thought I'd take the opportunity to send an update and answer the many questions about availability that we get every day. While we understand the frustration of all the waiting lists, we appreciate your patience as we work to expand our classes while still making sure class sizes are manageable and safe. That said, we do have a couple of sessions without wait lists:

### Junior sessions still available

- Week of 7/16 - Junior Intermediate Sailing - We have a few spots open. This is available to any juniors who have taken the Learn to Sail class (or has sailing experience elsewhere).

- Week of 7/16 and Thursday evenings - Adventure Sailing - This is open to any juniors who have been through intermediate sailing and are looking for a fun program that gets them out on all sorts of boats big and small. The main focus of this program is just sailing for the pure fun of sailing and finding new experiences.

- 2 Weeks starting 8/6 - Junior Intermediate Sailing - We have a few spots open. This is available to any juniors who have taken the Learn to Sail class (or has sailing experience elsewhere).

- 2 Weeks starting 8/6 - Junior Learn to Sail - We are working on opening a few slots in this program. Even if you see a waitlist, please sign up as we are actively looking to expand this class.

### Adult sessions:

- Starting 6/25 - Adult Learn to Sail: We have 1 slot open.

- Starting 7/16 - We have a couple of slots open in both the Learn to Sail as well as the Intermediate sailing classes.

- Starting 8/6 - We have an open slot for Family Learn to Sail class.

With all adult classes, we are constantly looking to expand classes when we can with additional instructors and boats. Please sign up on the wait list so that we know there is interest. We will do our best!

### Malta Free Sails:

We have slots open in many of our one night lessons for residents of Malta. We are also working with various groups of Malta Residents who are pulling together groups of friends and neighbors who want to try sailing. ## New SLSC Website Privacy Rules

SLSC uses a software program called Club Express to maintain our website. Like all other web services of this kind, Club Express is enacting new privacy rules. You may have received notification from some other companies you deal with about changes to their privacy rules as a result of the European General Data Protection Regulations (GDPR). I have spent several hours working with Club Express trying to understand and expedite the situation.

Here is the information provided to us by Club Express about these changes and the **steps every member must take in order to receive email from SLSC.**

*ClubExpress strictly protects and secures your personal data. They have implemented strong measures to control who has access to this data. One of the reasons we chose them to manage the organization's website, member database, and other functions, is because they take security and privacy so seriously. They have recently updated their platform to support GDPR and to fully protect you and our organization. We have also updated our Privacy Policy to fully and clearly explain how we collect, store, and process your personal data, our business reasons for doing so, and your rights under this policy.*

*When you login to our website, you will be redirected to a new screen where you will be required to answer a couple of questions. You will be required to click an "I Agree" box to certify the following:*

*-That you have reviewed the updated Privacy Policy. A link will be available on the new screen and at the bottom of every website page.*

*-That you consent to the storage and processing of your personal data in the US, by ClubExpress, on our behalf.*

*-That you consent to receiving email messages sent by ClubExpress on our behalf.*

*-That you consent to the sharing of your personal data with third parties to conduct the official business of the organization, such as processing a credit card payment. (SLSC does not share data with anyone, for any purpose. This is a pro forma clause required to fulfill GDPR requirements.)*

*You will also be asked whether you will accept general purpose communications concerning club or association business, such as newsletters and event notices. This question is required, but you have the option to accept or decline such communications.*

*In compliance with the GDPR, we have appointed a Data Protection Officer ("DPO") to handle any questions or concerns you might have about the privacy of your personal data. That person's name and contact information can be found on our Contact Us page.*

*Another provision of the GDPR is the "right to be forgotten", i.e. to have your information completely removed from our databases. We are implementing an automated process to handle these requests. Until it's fully built, they should be submitted to the DPO.*

*Thank you for continuing to support us as we implement these important changes to protect your privacy.*
