

Commodore's Comments

It has been an honor and a pleasure to serve...



Two years ago, when I began this role as your Commodore, I told you what an

honor and a pleasure it would be to serve you. Those words fall short of the mark. The ILYA encompasses the best sailboat racing in the country, and the lifelong friendships that develop are amazing. Through the years this develops by the continuous support of our youth sailors and their programs. It is not surprising that many of our best sailors are under thirty years of age. There is camaraderie before and after races that is so valuable to all.

I have visited numerous lakes as a competitor, race officer or spectator. It is enlightening to learn about the different issues and concern of our clubs at these events. Each club seems to have its unique issues, and each finds ways to make their program succeed by sharing ideas. In this way the ILYA is made stronger as a whole.

I am very proud of a number of accomplishments that have occurred these past two years. Presiding over our Annual Championship at Minnetonka in 2011 and Mendota in 2012 were two highlights. Both of these clubs had fallen out of the regular rotation of the Annual Championship. Minnetonka had not hosted a Championship in ten years, and Mendota had last hosted one nine years ago.

Sanctioning the Club 420 was a huge accomplishment. We have been using the 420 for our Youth Championship for many years, but now by sanctioning the class we are encouraging our member clubs to get on board and start fleets. This is the boat of choice for this age group. The Minnesota region is a few years ahead of Wisconsin and Iowa with this class but they will soon catch up.

Another initiative we started was the Clean Regatta program. By eliminating disposable water bottles and reducing paperwork at our events we are demonstrating a respect for the environment that our future sailors will benefit from. I look forward to this trend continuing in years to come.

None of this can happen without a strong Board of Directors and committee structure. We are lucky to have this group of capable volunteers. If you have ever been to a board meeting you will have seen that as ideas are raised, member volunteers take the lead. Jim Smith has been great helping me keep track of these generous members and their hard work.

Other groups that make the ILYA what it is today are the hard working committees of the regatta host clubs. Anyone who has taken on this task knows how much time and work goes into this process. I can't thank you enough.

Next up on the ILYA agenda is the Winter Inland. It will be held a Chenequa Country Club on February 9th. A full day of meetings will end with a cocktail party at which we will present our special ILYA awards. Again this year Bilge Pullers has agreed to sponsor our speaker, Dick Rose who will explain all of the new rules. All day there will be a number of tabletop displays with products and services that might serve your club. At the delegates meeting we will elect our new board members. The following morning the 2013 officers will be elected by the Board.

In Memoriam...

E. Allen Becker, Charles 'Snuffy' Schneider

The ILYA remembers with great respect and appreciation the lives and service of two beloved Inland members who spent their later years as selfless members of the ILYA Race Committee.

Allen Becker, of Maxinkuckee Yacht Club, passed away Nov. 14, 2012, following a brief but valiant battle against cancer. Allen was an active member of the ILYA Race Committee, and always ready to supply his own boat and equipment in service of the ILYA. He was active on race committees throughout the Midwest, and especially with activities involving the Maxinkuckee Yacht Club.

Charles Schneider, of Lake Nagawicka, born on a Christmas Day 88 years ago, died this Thanksgiving. Part of the dynamic Snake and Snuff team, Snuffy's twin brother, Jack (Snake), was taken home in 2002, but the lives of the two are never severed in our memories. With smiles abounding, these two gentlemen were the backbone of our RC teams for many, many years.

Never has the ILYA had better exemplars of enthusiastic and selfless volunteerism than that personified by Snuffy and his late twin brother "Snake" (Jack).

Sailing World's Dick Rose to speak on new racing rules

We are very fortunate to have Dick Rose come back to explain the new rules to us. He is the premiere rules guru in the country, and his presentation on this topic is always interesting, as he weaves into the presentation not just what the new rules mean to us but how some previous rules caused confusion or were used by some for unfair advantage.

Dick is able to do this from the perspective of the racing sailor, having raced sailboats for over 50 years, and winning many championships. Boats he has raced include the International 14, Laser, Snipe, Lightning, Penguin, and most recently the Laser 28.

Dick has served on the US SAILING Racing Rules Committee for over 20 years, 12 of them as chairman. He has also been a member of the International Sailing Federation Racing Rules Committee for over 10 years. He is also the chairman of the ISAF Case Book Working Party. Since the publication of the 2005-2008 edition of The Racing Rules of Sailing, Dick has been a central figure in the evolution of the 2009-2012 edition of the RRS. In 2012 Dick was awarded the Nathaneal G. Herreshoff Trophy, US Sailing's highest award, for his contributions to the sport.

Dick's most visible enterprise is his monthly rules column in *Sailing World*.

Dick can get us all up to speed with the new rules, highlighting the changes. He provides a wonderful combination of racing sailor and race management official, offering insight to all.

Are there any major changes in the new edition of the RRS? If so, what are they, and how did they come about?

"By far the most significant change for sailors is in the definition of Mark-Room. However, there are quite a few other changes, some of which make changes in the 'game' we play, and many of which align the rules with the 'game' sailors are already playing."

Dick will speak to those interested in race committee work early in the day (see the schedule on page 6). Many of the new rules will affect how we manage race courses. As our main speaker, Dick will address us on the rules changes that affect the racing sailor. The two presentations will have different emphasis, so plan to attend both if your schedule allows it.

Between presentations Dick will be happy to chat with you about the sailing world in general.

New Racing Rules affect race management

Every four years ISAF World Sailing updates the RRS, Racing Rules of Sailing. In conjunction, our national organization US Sailing makes additional changes called prescriptions. Every four years US Sailing publishes the new rules which include the ISAF rules and the US Sailing prescriptions. If you are a member of US Sailing you should automatically receive your new rule book. If you are not a member you should go to the US Sailing web site and order yourself a new book. The updated APP for your smartphone should also be available very soon. This is your sport and you agree to play by the rules. The only way to know the rules you are agreeing to is to have a copy.

If you would like a full study version of the rule changes that not only show the changes but explain why, go to the following link:

Below is a list of the changes that affect only the Race Committee. I encourage you to understand all the changes, but I have pared this down to list only the items that affect our work in the Inland.

- 1. Definitions Finish: A boat finishes when any part of her hull, or crew or equipment in normal position, crosses the finishing line from the course side. The change here is that a boat cannot drift across the line upside down because the crew would not be in the normal position. The new definition also clarifies that a boat finishes after she has crossed the line again after taking a penalty. It also allows the RC to set up a finish line prior to the end of the race and that it does not count when a boat crosses the line until the proper number of roundings have been
- 2. Definitions Mark: The word temporary has been removed from the definition which allows our trailing marks at the start to be defined as a part of the mark. This will simplify our SIs.
- Basic Principles Environmental Responsibility: Participants are encouraged to minimize any adverse environmental impact of the sport of sailing. Also Rule 55 has been added which states a competitor shall not intentionally put trash in the water.
- 4. 25.3: A race committee may display a visual signal by using either a flag or other object of a similar appearance.
- 33 Changing the Next Leg of the Course: The change here clarifies the green triangle and the red rectangle.
- 62.1 Redress: Redress can now be requested before a race starts. This would come up if the NOR or SIs got changed without notice.
- 7. 90.3 Scoring: When the race committee determines that

- it has scored a boat incorrectly, it shall correct the error and make the corrected scores available to competitors.
- 8. A11 Retired: Retired has been added to the scoring abbreviations.
- A11 DPI: This allows for a discretionary penalty to be imposed by the protest committee.
- 10. All Retired after finish was deleted.
- 11. Flag change: We will no longer use the 2nd repeater flag to signify another race. It is assumed another race will always be sailed unless you fly the "A" flag which means no more racing today.
- 12. NOTE: The definitions have moved to the front of the book. This is significant because the definitions are very important to the rules and they are finally getting their proper spot in the rule book.

Sailors, please note, this list does not contain the changes that affect you. There are many small changes that you will need to understand prior to you sailing your first race in 2013. The study guide link above has all of those changes.



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Bowers in training for Olympic Laser campaign

Erik Bowers has embarked upon his campaign in the Laser class for the 2016 Summer Olympic Games in Rio de Janeiro, Brazil.

The 23 year-old ILYA and Minnetonka Yacht Club member has already had an active year of Laser sailing. After graduating in May from the College of Charleston, Bowers won the Laser U.S. National Championship on Galveston Bay in Houston. The Nationals win qualified Bowers for the 2013 Laser World Championship in Oman, November 22-28. North America is only allocated 9 berths for the Worlds. After the Nationals. Bowers went on to finish 5th at the North American Championship in Oregon, 2nd at the O'Day US Singlehanded Championship in Sheboygan, Wis., and 5th at the CORK Olympic Classes Regatta in Kingston, Ontario.

According to Bowers, "I had a good summer in North America, and look forward to even more intense international competition in the next 3 years to refine my game."

Bowers recently returned from competing at Sail Melbourne in Australia December 3-8, where he finished 18th. Bowers stated, "Sail Melbourne was a small but very competitive international Laser fleet, and I faced conditions I've never raced in before, which included 20-25 knots and 4-6 foot very confused waves. The Aussies are extremely strong in the Laser right now, and it was invaluable to race against some of the best guys in the world. The event

exposed some areas of growth for me, which I look forward to improving prior to the Miami Olympic Classes Regatta. My goal at the Miami OCR is to make the Medal Race and qualify for the 2013 US Sailing Team Sperry Top-Sider by being one of the top two

Americans overall."

For the next year, Bowers has twelve Laser events on his schedule. In the next six months he'll be racing in Miami and Clearwater, Florida; Spain; France; England; and Germany. With the exception of the Midwinters in Clearwater, the aforementioned events are all ISAF Grade 1 level events, upon which his Laser world ranking will be based.

After returning from Germany, Bowers competes at the North Americans at the end of July in Kingston, Ontario, then the Europeans at the end of August in Ireland, Qingdao Olympic Week in China at the venue for the 2008 Olympics, and finally the Laser World Championship in Oman in November.

Bowers said, "It's a very busy schedule, and it will be challenging to be at my best for each event."

Bowers credits much of his passion for racing to growing up competing in the ILYA. According to Bowers, "The ILYA is simply a great community with high quality racing across multiple fleets. I am



very fortunate to have learned the art of racing here."

In spite of his hectic Laser schedule, Bowers will find time for some ILYA regattas this coming summer. "I'm lucky this year to be able to drive the E Scow at the Invitational and the Big Inland. There's nothing quite like the fun and excitement of racing in major E Scow regattas against some of the toughest sailors in the world."

On the support of the ILYA membership, Bowers goes on to say, "I hope the tight knit community of the ILYA will follow my progress and help support my Olympic campaign over the next few years. There is a strong tradition of Olympic aspirants and representatives from the ILYA, and my goal is to further that tradition with a Gold Medal in Rio."

Team Haeger/Provancha training in 470

Team Haeger/Provancha has begun its quest for the 2016 Olympics and a gold medal in the 470 class. Briana Provancha and Annie Haeger (Beulah) began sailing the 470 in 2009 in San Diego, California. They fell in love with the boat, and have been in competition internationally ever since.

This past year, the team competed in the Miami OCR where they placed 7th,

and sailed their first of many medal races where, placing 2nd.

The team is training with Romain Bonnaud in Miami all fall, winter and spring.

Next year The team plans to head over to Australia and Europe, competing in regattas in Perth, then in Spain and France.

Fletcher Driscoll, Pewaukee YC receive US SAILING honors

An ILYA member and an ILYA member club took two of the five awards presented by US SAILING at the US SAILING One Design Symposium, January 12 in Cleveland.

Fletcher Driscoll of White Bear Yacht Club received the One Design Service Award, and Pewaukee Yacht Club received the One Design Yacht Club Award.

Fletcher Driscoll One Design Service Award

The US SAILING Service Award recognizes distinguished service and exceptional leadership in the promotion of one-design sailing and class organization.

Fletcher Driscoll was nominated by Lee Alnes for his remarkable efforts in building the A Scow Fleet on White Bear Lake.

In late 2003 Driscoll purchased his first A Scow (a 1995 Melges) because "his E scow [at only 28 feet in length] wasn't big enough" to take his family out sailing. The mere sight of an A Scow on White Bear created a stir and many folks inquired if they could get a ride or help out with it in any way.

By 2012 Driscoll—rebuilding some wooden boats, buying a few used boats, encouraging others to purchase used boats—had built the White Bear fleet to twelve boats, the biggest A Scow fleet in existence. Along the way he encouraged

the formation of a 'mostly' female team' which races regularly as well.

With seven crew members on each boat and a larger number of spectators and families, the Monday night races on White Bear now regularly have over 100 people participating. All of this was due to the vision and perseverance of Fletcher Driscoll. He set about a mission to get more people involved in sailing and he did it in a big way with big boats that cost big money. Now in his 80's he is still active at his waterfront where he hosts nine of the 38 footers on his dock (yes he needs a special permit!).

Pewaukee Yacht Club One Design Yacht Club Award

The US SAILING Club Award recognizes administrative excellence, fleet growth, creative programming, regatta support and member contribution—at regional, national and international levels—of the one-design yacht club of the year.

Pewaukee Yacht Club was nominated by Candace Porter for its remarkable undertaking of eight major sailing events during its prime racing season.

From a local small frostbite event to the US Sailing Champion of Champions event and a National A scow Championship in between, each regatta was top notch, utilizing in some cases, over 100 volunteers. The events included an ILYA Optimist Championship with over 115 competing yachts.

Pewaukee used the busy schedule to offer sponsors eight opportunities to support sailing. The local club sacrificed local fleet racing in some cases to provide the local and national sailors with topnotch events. The 15 supporting sponsors provided social and racing financial support to make each event a first class, exceptional value event.

Minnetonka Sailing School touted for Women's Championship

US SAILING Championships Chair Shannon Bush was very impressed with the Lake Minnetonka Sailing School, according to the following which contains excerpts from US SAILING.

LMSS became the first organization in Minnesota to host the 2012 US Junior Women's Doublehanded Championship. It was evident that the volunteers on the ground who ran the event were not just satisfied with being a host to this US Sailing National Championship. Their efforts set an example for future hosts with their professionalism, energy, hospitality, and teamwork.

Seventy-six talented junior women sailors collected on Lighthouse Island, home of LMSS, for three days of racing on June 27-29. The island is a magical

setting for a regatta. However, the island venue has its share of logistical challenges. An amazing team of volunteers delivered over 1,800 meals to the island during the week. "It was important to adapt to the unique needs of the sailors, whose nutritional needs varied, based on the level of activity on a clinic day vs. a race day, and the sailing conditions each day," said LMSS President Laura Ekholm. "Some will also have specific dietary needs, and the volunteers and caterer worked together to adapt menus as needed."

Hundreds of volunteer hours went into making the event a success. Ekholm discussed the recruitment of volunteers for this event by saying, "Our Volunteer Coordinator Terry Jewett pulled in all of her resources to cover the hours and jobs that had to be completed. We could not have held the event if not for Terry's relationships and coordination of the teams of volunteers from the yacht club, sailing school, high school teams, employees and the greater community around the lake."

Bush said, "What made Minnetonka a perfect place is that they are a small venue, have dedicated people working and planning the event and no preconceived notions on how to host a big championship. They didn't brag about how they had run numerous other events and that they knew how to run a big event. They worked very well with everyone to get organized, and their volunteer pool was amazing."

Committee revises guidelines for General Foundation grants

ILYA Financial Support for Youthful Competitors

The ILYA foundation seeks to encourage ILYA sailors who stretch outside traditional ILYA events by providing a financial stipend to sailors from ILYA member clubs who have distinguished themselves in ILYA competitions and who are competing in challenging competitions outside the ILYA.

ILYA sailors aged under 25 who are getting started in national level competitions may apply for a stipend from the ILYA Foundation – General account based on guidelines and limitations listed below.

Starting in 2013, skippers who have finished...

- within the top 25% of the ILYA 420 or X Senior Championships
- within the top 10% of ILYA X Junior or IOD Championships
- with distinguished finish(es) within ILYA adult fleet(s)

...at the discretion of the foundation board will have a very high probability of receiving a stipend if they seek to attend one or more of the qualifying or challenging regattas listed below. This preferred status will last for 24 months after their qualifying finish.

Regardless of finish positions in the ILYA regattas listed above, skippers who are members of an ILYA club still have a high probability of receiving a stipend if they qualify for one of the regattas listed below. This consideration will last for 12 months after their ILYA regatta participation.

Any skipper who is a member of an ILYA club who has attended an ILYA regatta within the preceding 12 months could receive a stipend if they seek to attend any regatta (qualifying or challenging) listed below based on the discretion of the foundation board.

Criteria for evaluating requests for stipends:

- Complete application form from the ILYA office
- ILYA member in good standing
- Member in good standing of

ILYA member club

- · Competitive nature of the event
- Finishes in ILYA youth championships or adult ILYA events
- How the competitor qualified for the event
- Timeliness: Application made before the event
- For skippers granted preferred consideration, the number of events they may seek to attend

 otherwise, one award per competitor per calendar year
- Net expense to competitor (after other financial support if factored in)
- Note: To put these funds to the best possible use, the ILYA reserves the right to consider an individual's financial need.

While competitions not on the list will be considered, the following events are predetermined to meet the "challenging competition" criteria.

- US Sailing Junior Women's Championships or Semi Finals
- US Sailing Youth Championships (Olympic classes)

- ISSA Team racing Championship (Baker)
- ISSA High School Singlehanded

or Double handed Championship (Cressy or Mallory)

 Other regattas which require qualification will be considered on a case by case basis

an extended campaign in national, international, Olympic or Paralympic events should create a separate ILYA foundation account for the benefit of their campaign, and perform their own fundraising.

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Member support evidenced by stickers

The ILYA Board of Directors Member Support Recognition Program continues its success. Many ILYA Members and friends supported Association activities and were acknowledged with stickers corresponding to the three-tiered recognition system.

- *Silver Level Support Recognition* is awarded to members who donate \$100 or more in addition to their dues.
- *Gold Level Support Recognition* is awarded to members who donate \$500 or more in addition to their dues.
- Platinum Level Support Recognition is awarded to members who donate \$1,000 or more in addition to their dues.

In 2012 the **Promotion** Committee enabled 58 youth sailors to sail in our events at discounted prices. The

General Foundation has

already helped a number of teams, mainly youth, participate at major regattas by helping them fund their campaigns. The Foundation is also operating in support of Olympic campaigns (see page 11) shooting for 2016.

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

Board of Directors meets in Hudson

Minutes October 28, 2012 Hudson House Grand Hotel Hudson, Wisconsin

Commodore Trester called the meeting to order at 8:37 a.m. The following officers were present: Commodore Trester, Vice Commodore Friend, Secretary/Treasurer S. Schmidt, and Past Commodore Prange. The following Directors at Large were present: Andert, Cox, Driessen, Driscoll, Kotovic, Oltrogge, D. Porter, and Reilly. Weston was absent. The following Fleet Representative Directors were present: Haines, JP Porter, Boatman, Biwer, Barr, and Woldum. Rogers, Haeger, Spencer, and Hollister were absent. At Large Rules members Simon and Woldum were present. Crary attended for the Club 420 fleet.. Measurer D. Schmidt was absent. Executive Secretary Smith was present. Mann attended as Race Management Chair. C. Porter attended as ScowLines editor. Hodgson attended as consultant to the Executive Committee. Guests included Phil Petersen, Larry Kmiecik, Karen Alnes, and Kim Haines.

Commodore Trester noted successful regattas in 2012, all very well run and most experiencing good attendance. The Mendota/ILYA cooperative Championship was successful thanks to the help of many under the leadership of Haines. The experiment proved that the ILYA can be active in support of host clubs. A number of regattas were registered as Clean Regattas with Sailors for the Sea. The ILYA needs to focus on the direction and purpose of the Club 420 fleet, and the Youth Development Committee should consider its new purpose as transitioning youth to our adult scow fleets.

The Feb. 12, 2012 minutes of the board of directors were approved (Driscoll/Oltrogge).

Executive Committee actions on behalf of the Board were approved (Barr/ Haines). These included revisions to the by-laws accommodating the Club 420 as a sanctioned fleet and revising references of the A One-Design Fleet as the A Fleet, accepting Calhoun and Beulah as Club 420 clinic hosts, setting the date for the Youth Championship at Beulah, and subsequently cancelling the event, and revising the by-laws regarding the host fee structure for No Tears events.

ILYA fleets reported as follows:

Class A (Haines) reported stable participation and the availability of many great used boats.

Class E (Kotovic) reported that the NCESA membership initiative was successful, and that better communication with regatta PROs is needed.

Class C (JP Porter) reported that the junior incentive program was successful again, and that a new mast die is being constructed.

Class I-20 (Boatman) reported that regatta attendance increased in 2012 and that foil rudders are allowed.

Class MC was not represented, but via email Haeger reported no pressing issues for this meeting.

Classes Melges 17 (Biwer) reported that the ILYA fleet is increasing regatta attendance and that the Pewaukee fleet may number 13-14 boats in 2013.

Class X (Barr) reported a great regatta at Delavan with 116 boats, where random weighing was conducted, with no boats needing to add weight, and a few able to drop some weight, but most weighing per their stickers.

IOD Class (Barr for Spencer) thanked Pewaukee for a successful championship which included a huge turnout in the Green fleet, and No Tears hosts Okoboji and Cedar, Wis.

Club 420 Class (Crary for Hollister) noted that the Championship was poorly attended, mostly due to the lateness of the year and conflicts with other events and adult fleets. A great number of used boats are available as some clubs are purchasing new boats. ILYA events need to have boats for charter. ILYA 420 sailors perform exceptionally well in regional and national events.

Trester turned the meeting over to Rules Committee Chair D. Porter to discuss specific class issues. Fleets reported changes to the RC Recommendations as follows: Class I-20 determines a 5 m.p.h. minimum for starting a race. Class Melges 17 revises the target race time to 40 minutes ± 10 . Club 420 Class opts for Windward, Leeward, or Modified WL courses, revises race time limit to 75 min., raises max. steady wind to 30 m.p.h. and max. gusts to 35 m.p.h. and puts no limit on the number of races in a day or back-toback, and prefers to use Code Flag P as its initial preparatory signal, with Code Flags I and Z as options.

In Class C, by-law 85.10.m was changed

to set the minimum sailcloth weight at 3.8 oz. (JP Porter/Simon). Allowable tiller and tiller extension materials were expanded in by-law 85.1.d (JP Porter/Simon). By-law 85.6 was expanded to allow cubitainers for flotation (JP Porter/Simon). A proposal to allow unpaid advertising on sails was defeated (JP Porter/Haines). After discussion a motion (Crary/Biwer) passed disallowing advertising on Class C and Class X hulls and sails unless the advertising is regatta specific and benefitting the entire fleet. The motion also included allowing the display of club burgees on Class C and Class X sails, size and placement of such to be determined by the Executive Committee.

In Class X, the whisker pole experiment had positive, though limited feedback, with only one boat competing regularly. The fleet committee will ask to extend the experiment for another year.

In Class IOD, age eligibility rules were revised to comply with USODA (Barr/JP Porter).

There being no further Rules Committee business, D. Porter ended the Rules Committee meeting and turned the gavel back to Trester to conclude Board business. The actions of the Rules Committee were approved (Haines/Barr).

Friend reviewed a letter from Harry Melges III relating to ILYA youth progression to adult fleets, emphasis of family-oriented regattas, X boat weight reduction, and the role of the Club 420 in ILYA. Extensive discussion ensued, resulting in the consensus that the Executive Committee would head a special steering committee to study the regatta format/site issue. Kotovic, Reilly, Mann, Haines, JP Porter, Woldum, and C. Porter offered to serve. Friend will form the committee and act as chair.

The Class X committee will determine if sufficient data is available to discuss a possible reduction of the hull weight in the near future, or if more data needs to be collected in 2013.

Smith described renovations being made to the Green Lake downtown park and harbor area, including docking and dredging, and park beautification, and proposed that ILYA donate \$100 to the project for a paver. This was passed (Haines/Oltrogge) and Smith was instructed to see if the ILYA could do help in other ways with the project.

Fleet leaders and school program coordinators are encouraged to attend the US Sailing symposiums which will be promoted via ScowLines.

Youth Development Committee Chair Woldum reported that the direction and committee make-up are to be determined, but definitely will focus on transitioning youth sailors to club membership and scow sailing.

Haines praised the MYC leaders Cmdr. DJ Klauser, Co-chair Trey Sprinkman, Social Chair Darby Sugar as well as ILYA regatta committee members Trester, Friend, Prange and Smith, and participation of the Wis. Hoofers Sailing Club for a successful cooperative ILYA Championship at Mendota. Haines reports that Mendota is well pleased financially, but that club enthusiasm, and especially the club E fleet has benefitted from the shot in the arm. The club is interested in repeating the event more regularly.

Phil Petersen, Commodore of Okoboji Yacht Club, distributed the 2013 regatta schedule for approval. Class C will register on Wed., Aug. 7 and race Thursday through Saturday. Class A will register Sat. afternoon, Aug. 10, and race Sunday through Tuesday. Classes E and MC will register on Wednesday, Aug. 14, and race Thursday through Saturday. All racing will be on Lake Okoboji and headquartered at the Okoboji Yacht Club. The schedule was approved (Kotovic/Driscoll).

The following regatta hosts were approved for 2013 (JP Porter/Schmidt): I-20 Invitational at Cedar, Ind., June 22-23; I-20 Championship at Green Lake, Aug. 2-4; A Invitational (with Melges 17 Champs) at Pewaukee, July 19-21; IOD No Tears West at Clear Lake; Club 420 Championship and Clinic at Delavan, June 21-23.

Determination of formats and fleets attending the 2014 Annual Championship at Oshkosh was deferred pending the results of the steering committee defined above.

Treasurer Schmidt announced that the financial 'review' necessitated by substantial donations in 2011 mostly for Olympic campaigns was completed and is paid by adequate contingency funds in the Foundation account for that purpose, such having no effect on the operating budget, which for 2012 is in good shape. An end of year projection shows a positive balance of \$10,000 or more.

Proposals from Smith regarding possible Snake, Snuff and Uncle Donald account funds was deferred for more consideration.

Race Management and Judges Committee Chairman Mann requested that all fleets discuss at their fleet meetings the use of Code Flag P for their preparatory signal. A one-day US SAILING Club Race Officer seminar will be held March 9 at Milwaukee Yacht Club.

Promotions and Communications Committee Chairman Andert reported that ScowLines has become the 'voice' of the ILYA, and that editor C. Porter, an army of one, needs fleet committee support to provide promotion, results, and recaps. Andert thanked C. Porter and Suzi Reese for excellent ILYA Annual Reports. The committee will investigate ways to grow individual and club membership. The junior discount program remains successful and with the help of NCSSA 58 juniors took advantage of discounted ILYA regattas. Social media can be used to the benefit of ILYA and its members, and ILYA now has an association Facebook page as well as an Annual Regatta (Big Inland) page and a Twitter account. Professional help to provide video and other content may be necessary in the future.

Trester distributed a draft schedule for the 2013 Winter Inland, in which all fleet meetings are on Saturday and no Friday meetings scheduled. A Friday evening social is possible. C. Porter volunteered to help organize the event.

On behalf of Trophy Committee Chair Barkow, Smith recognized the Garber and D. Porter families for their donation of trophies for the Club 420 fleet. The C fleet has accepted the re-donation of a trophy from Big Cedar Lake to be used as a top female skipper or top female crew award.

Prange proposed revised Foundation Committee guidelines for awarding monies to general Foundation recipients and expanding the events for which such monies are available. Prange also read an announcement which is to be included in the regatta packets of ILYA Championship IOD, X, and Club 420 events, and which explains the opportunities of the Foundation General Fund. These were approved as a 'work in progress' (Prange/ JP Porter).

Per Commodore Trester, the Melges 17 Fleet is no longer on probation as a result of its forming a committee and representation by its chairman at the meeting, along with renewed efforts to increase regatta attendance and establish fleet committee bylaws.

Discussion on possible membership of Sailing Schools in ILYA as deferred per the recommendation of committee Chairman Schmidt.

Prange reported that professional sponsorship marketing was used by Minnetonka in 2011 with great success, and that limited professional help was used in 2012 for the Annual Championship. Prange favors the use of professional sponsorship marketing and suggests incorporating that into discussions by the regatta steering committee formed earlier.

Appeals Committee Chairman Hodgson reported that two appeals were received, of which one is completed and the other returned for a re-hearing.

Trester thanked Driscoll for his six years of service and Prange's many years on the board and as an officer.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 3:08 p.m. (Biwer/Haines).

Okauchee prepares to host C Scow Blue Chip Regatta



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
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Warning: Classifieds Scam

You may have occasion to use the ILYA Scow Slants or the ILYA Web Site (www.ilya.org) to advertise a boat or related equipment. Evidently some scam artists have found the ILYA Web site and its classified ad page. One of our current advertisers told me he was contacted twice recently with the scam. I heard a similar story from two other ILYA members recently as well.

The scam works something like this (with possible variations): The interested person (scammer) supposedly has a friend or business acquaintance who owes him money. That money (more than you are asking for the boat) is sent to you in the form of a cashier's check (WHICH IS FAKE!). When you receive the cashier's check, you are supposed to deposit it and send a personal check for the overage amount to the scammer.

Here's how you get taken: The bank has no idea that the cashier's check is fake, so they accept it, and you send a good check to the scammer. After a few days, the bank finds out



You have probably read about this type of scam in your local newspaper. I know it has been written about in the Janesville (Wis.) Gazette a couple of times now.

Precautions: Don't accept or deposit any checks without having the bank first verify its authenticity. Tell others about this scam, especially if they may have items advertised somewhere.

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

Lessons in Crisis Management

reprinted from US SAILING

The Severn Sailing Association (SSA) in Annapolis, Md. has been hosting onedesign racing events and running junior sailing programs for over a half-century.

On June 23, 2011, a 14-year-old girl participating in SSA's junior sailing program drowned when her Club 420 capsized and trapped her under the boat. This tragedy not only heightened the attention of safety procedures, protocol and equipment, but introduced more awareness for effective crisis management at sailing organizations around the world.

Joel Labuzetta, the Junior Sailing Program Director at SSA, has been immersed in crisis communications over the past year. After extensive research and through the recommendations of US Sailing's report on the incident, Labuzetta has developed a complete crisis management plan for SSA. Learn more about his experience with this tragedy and how SSA implements its crisis management plan:

No one wants or expects to deal with the aftermath of a tragedy. Often a crisis is over in moments but its effects remain for years. Last summer, the SSA staff, students and I went through what I can only hope will be a once-in-a-lifetime experience. As Junior Program Director, I was deeply involved in responding to the events and analyzing what changes we should make. I hope that by sharing what I've learned, the sailing community as a whole can benefit.

Preparation and prevention

Crisis management primarily has to do with preventative preparation for an accident. Since our sport inherently involves so many uncontrollable factors, it is important to be able to control as much of a situation as possible. The same mentality of setting a boat up properly for a race and maintaining equipment needs to be applied to safety and preparation for an emergency.

In our case, having done this as much as possible prior to this tragedy was an important factor in how everyone at SSA responded during the crisis. My staff and I had a plan in place to deal with an emergency situation. We were properly trained, the plan was efficiently executed, but a sailor still drowned. I can't imagine having to tell someone that an accident could have been prevented and a tragedy was due to negligence or poor planning.

Aside from the guilt associated with a preventable accident, there is also the issue of legal implications. I had always been aware of the seriousness of a liability lawsuit, but thinking of such a tragedy in personal terms regarding my responsibility to the families whose children sail in my program has made a very strong impression on me.

I believe that it is the Junior Program Director's job to continually think through scenarios and to work out the best possible preparations. The benefits of preparation and prevention came up in response to many questions raised by last summer's tragedy.

Consider these questions for Crisis Management and Planning Who contacts the family?

As Junior Program Director, I was the first one to call the parents before the ambulance left the site of the accident. Lessons shared:

- The primary concern is for the family. Be sympathetic and supportive.
- Insist on having accurate contact numbers and emails, including emergency only numbers.
- Be honest and straightforward when speaking. Only state what you know to be true. Avoid speculating.

What about classes for the day?

Our accident happened in an afternoon race class, and the ambulance responded to an off-site location since our emergency plan called for bringing a victim to the nearest shore as a meeting point. Concurrent classes that day were not cancelled because coaches directly involved in the accident, including myself, did not return to SSA until after the program ended for the day.

Lessons shared:

- Keeping other sailors insulated from emergency proceedings and personnel is an important consideration.
- If your emergency meeting/egress point is at your club, think about how this will affect your classes.

Do you cancel the program?

Our accident happened on a Thursday. We decided to close for Friday, and were open again on Monday, with another day off Tuesday for the memorial service.

Lessons shared:

- Consider the size of your program and the nature of the crisis to make this determination.
- · Have board members or others available in person to answer questions when classes resume.

How do you contact people and who does it?

We sent a group email stating that the program would be closed. We already had email lists in place for our weekly newsletters. In addition, my Junior Board and I called the families of the race team involved in the accident to break the news and be available for questions. Almost without exception, families and sailors were already aware of the tragedy through Facebook. An important note is that our primary contacts were daytime telephone numbers and we were making calls after 6 pm, which led to making multiple calls.

Lessons shared:

- · Have a method of mass-communication for your program.
- · Assume that everything you write and say will be published. Again, stick to facts, do not speculate.
- Have a single point of contact for media. In our case this was Commodore Hal Whitacre. Hal drafted a widely publicized statement a few days after the accident.
- If you operate under a yacht club organization, contact your board of directors. They need to be in the loop early, and should be part of the response.
- Call your insurance agent immediately. Know who they are and have their phone number available.
- Know who your club's lawyer is and contact him/her.

Who is liable?

Lessons shared:

Have all staff record written statements immediately. Even those

not directly involved may have useful information about what they saw, heard, and the timing.

Ask yourself these questions:

- Were the coaches Level 1 certified including up-to-date First Aid and CPR?
- Were life jackets being worn?
- What was the class coach to sailor ratio?
- How quickly did the coach/emergency personnel respond?

What happens to the staff and sailors?


I feel lucky to be a part of a very closeknit club. Many of my staff grew up together and live locally, and many of the sailors are here year-round. However, we also have staff new to the area and from out of the country. We had several grief counselors contacted through race team parents and were able to have the staff meet with a counselor before leaving SSA for the day. Another counselor was available the next morning to meet with sailors involved and the staff. Coaches who lived alone were welcomed into others' homes for as long as necessary.

Lessons shared:

- Ensure that the staff and sailors involved have a support structure available; family, friends, and loved ones
- Have a counselor or psychologist/ psychiatrist contact that can be made available.
- Bring in some outside people to help.
 Board members and parents can be

- particularly valuable you will need people who are close to the situation but removed enough to think clearly.
- Different people will have different responses to stress and loss. Recognize that everyone will not react the same way, and that's OK.

Crisis management is about being prepared before the crisis. Know what your support structure is and be ready to use it. The stress following a tragedy is too much for one person to handle. Our response was a collaborative effort between our staff, Junior and Senior Club boards, neighboring yacht clubs, and many other people who were working together. I am very grateful for the support I continue to receive, and hope that our experience can help other clubs be prepared to deal with a crisis.
