Scow Slants to be published bi-annually

Scow Slants publication will be decreased to two issues per year starting in 2012. Plans for 2012 include a spring/ summer issue to be prepared for distribution in late May, and a fall/winter issue to be prepared for distribution in December.

The popularity of the ILYA's enewsletter, ScowLines, and its ability to present timely news and reports, including daily regatta reports and photos, lessens the need for such to be repeated in Scow Slants. All ScowLines articles are archived on the ILYA web site.

Both issues of Scow Slants will cover general Association news including Board of Director's meetings. The spring/summer issue of Scow Slants will continue to publish sanctioned regatta Notices of Race, along with any general information and notices regarding the racing season. The fall/winter issue will chronicle, for posterity, complete race results, and will preview the Association's annual Winter Inland convention.

Distribution of Sailing Instructions to be eliminated at regatta check-in

All fleets in 2012 except Class X and IOD will forego printed Sailing Instructions at ILYA sanctioned events. The SIs will be available on line (http://ilya.org/2012-ilyasanctioned-events-with-notice-of-race.html) along with the Notices of Race, and will be posted on the Official Regatta Notice Board of the event.

Online SIs will be marked as "Draft" until 48 hours prior to the regatta check-in time, at which time they will become "Final." Any changes within the 48 hours prior to regatta check-in time will not be made in

the SIs, but will be posted as changes to the SIs on the Official Regatta Notice Board.

The requirement that regatta participants sign in during the event on site check in period remains. All participants must attest to their access to the event's SIs, and re-affirm their Waiver of Liability for the event as has been required when the SIs were printed for distribution.

Notices of Race will continue to be published in the Scow Slants spring/summer issue.

Commodore's Comments ILYA events, hosts continue to excel



2011 has been a great year to serve as your Commodore. I have attended seven different ILYA

regattas as a competitor, race officer, or spectator. The dedication and attitude of our regatta hosts has been phenomenal. Every event has combined the competitive spirit of our participants with great race officer work and truly entertaining social events. Our host clubs have made all of the competitors and guests feel welcome and have made the ILYA brand stronger.

Once again our two major Championship events led the way. Clear Lake made hosting 100 X boats look easy. Everything ran smoothly, with great racing in both fleets. On the social side they introduced another age group to the Surf ballroom. This is truly one of the unique social venues within our organization.

We returned to Minnetonka after an eight-year absence. Their committee went all out to create a memorable event. From docking at members' piers, to adjusting the racing schedule to accommodate four of our fleets, to spending a fair amount of time at the E scow bar on the island, this was a regatta you had to attend. My final words to the regatta co-chairs were that we have to come back sooner than eight years. I also need to thank all of our regatta hosts for supporting our green initiative. It was refreshing to attend all of our events and not see plastic bottles, often half empty, lying about or tossed in the trash.

Our emphasis on youth sailing paid off this year. At our Annual Championship about 30% of our competitors were under 25 years of age. I can't remember another year where this age group was as well represented.

In response to the growing participation in high school and college sailing by our membership, the board of directors has sanctioned the club 420 as an ILYA class. Most notably this action shows that the ILYA is attuned to the interests of this age group; we will enthusiastically support this class.

The Club 420 fleet will have a committee whose chairperson will be a member of the ILYA Board of Directors. Our hope is that the 420 will become a bridge X boaters can use en route to our adult classes. We are already seeing more activities in SE Wisconsin to create a traveling 420 series that should jumpstart new fleets in many of our member clubs.

Now the question is, how do we follow up and make 2012 better than 2011?

We will start by returning to Chenequa Country Club for the Winter Inland. We are keeping last year's format, with our awards being presented at a late

RC Teams are looking for help with 2012 Annual Championship

Variety of winds, sudden squall mark I-20 Champs

Once again, the crew from Green Lake put on a fabulous weekend of racing for the Inland 20 sailors in the 2011 ILYA Championship. Although Friday started out slow due to light winds, PRO Larry Krause and his team were hard at work keeping a close watch on the conditions. Meanwhile the class took advantage of the downtime and held the fleet meeting under a nice shady tree. Just as the meeting was wrapping up

the call came over the radio to rig up. Around 3:30 p.m. the conditions were right for a great 5-leg light air race. The first bullet of the event went to past champion Steve Scheck.

Saturday morning warning was scheduled for 9:30 a.m., but again the sailors had to wait for wind. This time the wait was much shorter with the second race of the regatta getting off around 10:30 a.m. Two nice medium

wind races were sailed back to back, and won by Aaron Lynn and Stefan Schmidt, respectively.

After lunch the fleet headed out for two more races in slightly more wind and chop. Steve Scheck won the fourth race (third of the day), taking his second bullet in the event. Winds began to die off towards the end of race number five, with a slow last upwind leg. But Fond du Lac sailor Jack Boatman persevered and took the last bullet of the day.

Shortly after the last boat squeaked across the finish line the whole fleet was caught off guard as a major squall hit the lake out of nowhere. More than half the fleet went over, and two boats lost their rigs in the gusts that were rumored to be as high as 45 mph. Thankfully, plenty of race committee and assistance boats were on hand to help the capsized sailors. Aside from some bumps and bruises, the I-20 sailors were all fine and safe.

Because of the Saturday evening storm, Sunday races were down a few boats. However, the boats that raced had two excellent windy races with hiking crews and fast downwind rides. Steve Scheck won the first of the two races. Aaron Lynn won the seventh and final race of the regatta. For the third time in class history, Steve Scheck with his wife and long time crew Leigh Leonard took the Championship with an impressive nine total points over seven races (with one drop). Fellow past champion Aaron Lynn and crew Keith Rosenbaum took second place honors. Jack Boatman and his son Eric rounded out the podium with their third place finish.

A special ILYA Sportsmanship Award was given to Joe Norton by PRO Larry Krause. Joe went above and beyond, not only lending assistance to the race committee on his personal boat during racing, but making sure all twelve boats made it safely to shore following the Saturday evening squall. Regatta winners Steve and Leigh both noted their appreciation for the caring folks in Green Lake, as while they were capsized during the squall not one but two local power boats checked to make sure they were ok and if they needed assistance. It is this kind of hospitality and care that make Green Lake one of the Inland 20's favorite regatta sites.

This Is What It's All About! 2011 Melges 17 Championship

A big thank you to David Harrison and his team from Oshkosh for hosting a great ILYA Championship regatta. Also, a big thank you to the race committee who did a great job getting in 5 solid races!

Four great races were held on day one in varying velocity. What was amazing is that on a beautiful Saturday, on such a large body of water, we had no power boat traffic or waves, leaving us with really great sailing conditions all day.

The first day was a battle all day long with lots of lead changes. We saw 5 different race leaders at one point or another during the day.

When the smoke cleared at the end of the day the team of Harrys had the overall lead with Deb and Jim Gluek 5 points back. In third was Ben Biwer, fourth was Lesa and John Gutenkunst, and in fifth was past ILYA Champ Hans Meyer...

Sunday saw us drifting around waiting for wind for a couple of hours. The heat started to get the best of us on Team Melges so we threw off our shirts and hit the water for some cooling off. Unfortunately, this did not turn out so well for my skipper as he accidentally kicked the bottom corner of the rudder getting back in the boat and badly cut his foot. With blood pouring out of my 10-year-old's foot, I decided it was probably best to head for shore and get it looked at. ILYA Commodore Rick Trester graciously towed us back to Millers Bay. While we spent the next few hours in the ER, the fleet was able to start a race in a nice 5-8 knot SW breeze. Unbelievably, the race turned out in our favor, as Lesa Gutenkunst and Hans Meyer were able to hold off Deb and Jim to finish 1,2 which narrowly gave us the overall regatta victory. While you never want to win a regatta like that, we'll take it!

For me, crewing for my 10-year-old on a Melges 17 was really awesome. It is impressive to me how great this boat is for so many different people. We have 10 year old kids to 60+ year olds driving, and a wide variety of crews, including dads, husbands, girlfriends, wives, etc. It really is a great boat for just about anyone, and it's still one of the most fun boats I have ever sailed.

Winning the regatta was a bonus for sure, but there was so much more to it than winning a sailboat race. The time we spent together training for the regatta was invaluable. The great job my kid did driving the boat was really impressive; concentrating all day on Saturday for 4 longish races was not easy, even for me. It was a great opportunity for me to pass on some of the tricks I have learned over the years in sailboat racing, and hopefully some of it will stick.

Beyond the sailing were the trips to Ardy and Ed's for hot dogs and root beer floats, Hobby Town for the remote control airplane, South of the Border for tacos, being kept awake late in the evening by Rock Fest and Kiss, and, of course, spending 4 hours at the ER while the fleet was out cranking around the race course.

It's not all about the sailing. It's about the experience, the memories you make with your friends and family, the stories you will tell for years to come. It's about the bond you make with your son, your daughter, your wife or husband, girlfriend or boyfriend. It's about lessons you can pass on, it's about teaching the next generation to love the sport like you do. This is what it's all about!

Board of Directors meets in Hudson

Minutes October 16, 2011 Best Western Hudson House Inn Hudson, Wisconsin

Commodore Trester called the meeting to order at 8:35 a.m. The following officers were present: Commodore Trester, Vice Commodore Friend, Secretary/Treasurer S. Schmidt, and Past Commodore Prange. The following Directors at Large were present: Andert, Cox, Driscoll, D. Porter, Osmundson, and Strothman. Driessen and Norton were absent. The following Fleet Representative Directors were present: Haines, Rogers, Boatman, Spencer and Woldum. F. Barkow, Haeger, Gill, Harrett, and Barr were absent. At Large Rules members Simon and Woldum were present. J.P. Porter attended for the C fleet. Measurer D. Schmidt was absent. Executive Secretary Smith was present. Mann attended as Race Management Chair. C. Porter attended as ScowLines Editor. Hodgson attended as consultant to the Executive Committee. Guests included Jack Madill and Mike Crary.

Commodore Trester noted the use of successful, non-traditional venues and schedules for 2011. It was a successful season with good participation and growth of our youth sailors. It was personally rewarding to Commodore Trester who attended seven events, many of which worked to fulfill green initiatives. Attending seven events, Trester gained appreciation for the past commodores. Trester noted that 2012 will include an experimental partnership with Mendota Yacht Club for the Annual Championship Regatta, which may also include the Club 420 fleet, a first tie relationship with professional marketing team, and an exciting Winter Inland in February. Trester still hopes to do another members survey.

The Feb. 13, 2011 minutes of the board of directors were approved (Schmidt/Driscoll).

Executive Committee actions on behalf of the Board were approved (Haines/Spencer). These included naming Osmundson as representative to the US SAILING Club Summit along with a stipend of \$250 for expenses, and determining percentage charges for Foundation donations received by Credit Card or PayPal. Osmundson reported a beneficial relationship with Sun Sail resulting in successful raffle opportunities.

Guest Madill praised the women sailors of White Bear who, led by Kathy Sanville, participated in the Adams Cup in Flying Scots.

ILYA fleets reported as follows:

Class A (Haines) reported great participation in 2011 and thanked Minnetonka for an excellent championship event.

Class E (Rogers) reported that the class is experimenting with a new deck design and vang which includes a spinnaker launcher. Headstays are also under experimentation. The class may allow epoxy resin in hull construction. The NCESA may institute scantling rules to require class membership at all events.

Class C (J.P. Porter for F. Barkow) reported that the financial incentives have produced great results in junior regatta attendance, and that the fleet maintains a good number of sailors in the under 30 age group. No mast die will be purchased in the near future as adequate masts are available from Melges Performance Sailboats at this time.

Class I-20 (Boatman) reported that the class continues efforts to promote youth participation. The class may decide to allow deeper rudder to provide more control downwind. The class has added Crear as an official builder.

Classes M, MC, and Melges 17 were not represented and had no reports.

Class X (Cox for Barr) reported a great regatta at Clear Lake with 99 boats. see **Board**, page 17

Dave grew up in Connecticut sailing Blue Jays and Lightnings at the Pequot Yacht Club on Long Island Sound. He received his undergraduate degree at Yale, and has received an honorary Doctorate of Education from Piedmont College. He is a Senior Certified Judge,



and is currently the chairman of both the US Sailing Appeals Committee and the Match Racing Committee. He has authored three books on the sport: Understanding the Racing Rules of Sailing, Winning in One-Designs and Dave Perry's 100 Best Racing Rules Quizzes.

He captained Yale's 1975 Dinghy National Championship Team and is a two-time All American sailor. He was fifth at the 1979 Laser World Championship, is a two-time Congressional Cup winner (1983 & 1984), placed second in the 1984 Soling Olympic Trials, won the 2003 Ideal 18 North American champion and is a four time U.S. Match Racing Champion (1982, 2006, 2008 and 2011). He served as the Rules Advisor and Afterguard Coach for Victory Challenge, Sweden's America's Cup team from 2006-07 and as rules advisor for the US Olympic team in 2008. He is currently the top ranked U.S. match racing skipper by the International Sailing Federation (ISAF).

A member of the Sailing World Hall of Fame, Dave has been the recipient of US SAILING's W. Van Alan Clark, Jr. Trophy for Sportsmanship and the first recipient of the Captain Joe Prosser Award for Excellence in Sailing Instruction. He has conducted thousands of "rules talks" and seminars on the sport, and is best known for his clear, humorous and highly interactive presentations.

General Foundation provides funds for youthful competitors

The ILYA foundation seeks to encourage ILYA sailors who stretch outside traditional ILYA events by providing a financial stipend to Inland sailors aged 25 or under who are competing in challenging competitions to encourage participation by providing some financial assistance.

ILYA sailors just getting started in national level competitions may apply for a stipend from the ILYA Foundation – General account based on guidelines and limitations listed below.

For example, a high school sailor who qualifies at the regional level to attend an ISSA national event may request a stipend. Foundation trustees will evaluate all requests and provide support as feasible to qualified competitors.

Criteria for evaluating requests for stipends (application form is available from the ILYA office):

- · ILYA paid membership in good standing
- · Competitive nature of the event
- How the competitor qualified for the event
- · Timeliness: Application made before the event
- · One award per competitor per calendar year
- Net expense to competitor (after other financial support)
- Note: To put these funds to the best possible use, the ILYA

reserves the right to consider an individual's financial need. While competitions not on the list will be considered, the following events are predetermined to meet the "challenging competition" criteria.

- US Sailing Sears Cup Finals
- US Sailing Bemis Trophy Finals
- · US Sailing Smythe Trophy Finals
- US Sailing Junior Women's Championships
- US Sailing Youth Championships (Olympic classes)
- · ICSA Men's Singlehanded Nationals
- · ICSA Women's Singlehanded Nationals
- ICSA Women's Dinghy Nationals
- ICSA Team Racing Nationals
- · ICSA Coed Dinghy Nationals
- ISSA Team racing Championship (Baker)
- ISSA High School Double handed Championship (Mallory)
- ISSA High School Singlehanded Championship (Cressy)

ILYA sailors who are planning an extended campaign in national, international, Olympic or Paralympic events should create a separate ILYA foundation account for the benefit of their campaign, and perform their own fundraising.

being a part of the ILYA, I thank it with all my heart for making me the sailor and person that I am today.

Team racing might be the most fun way to race sailboats. It's essentially like match racing, except for the fact that you have two teammates that can bail you out of trouble when you screw up. It's a relatively short race of nonstop action, and the team with the best overall boat speed, boat handling, knowledge of the rules, and ability to keep calm amidst a course full of hectic chaos and shouting, will USUALLY win...

The racing at Nationals was great. Yes, winning is awesome. Yes, losing is frustrating and annoying, but I try not to forget what all those years sailing in the ILYA has taught me: keep learning, keep working, and keep getting better.

Warning: Classifieds Scam


You may have occasion to use the ILYA Scow Slants or the ILYA Web Site (<u>www.ilya.</u> <u>org</u>) to advertise a boat or related equipment. Evidently some scam artists have found the ILYA Web site and its classified ad page. One of our current advertisers told me he was contacted twice recently with the scam. I heard a similar story from two other ILYA members recently as well.

The scam works something like this (with possible variations): The interested person (scammer) supposedly has a friend or business acquaintance who owes him money. That money (more than you are asking for the boat) is sent to you in the form of a cashier's check (WHICH IS FAKE!). When you receive the cashier's check, you are supposed to deposit it and send a personal check for the overage amount to the scammer. Here's how you get taken: The bank has no idea that the cashier's check is fake, so they accept it, and you send a good check to the scammer. After a few days, the bank finds out

that the cashier's check was fake, and you are responsible for it. By then you are out your good check, and possibly the boat, if the scammer even bothered to come get it.

You have probably read about this type of scam in your local newspaper. I know it has been written about in the Janesville (Wis.) Gazette a couple of times now.

Precautions: Don't accept or deposit any checks without having the bank first verify its authenticity. Tell others about this scam, especially if they may have items advertised somewhere.

While no new boats were built in 2011, rotation of boats to new owners remains strong, as is the fleet. Some western clubs are pushing to include the X Boat in more local programs.

IOD Class (Spencer) thanked White Bear and PRO Hodgson for a great event in which the 64 contestants struggled with stormy weather. ILYA Opti sailors performed well at the Optimist regatta in Michigan. The 2012 National Championship in Ohio conflicts with the ILYA X Boat Championship. Osmundson added that the 2012 Great Plains Championship will be held at Clear Lake Aug. 25-26, giving a boost to the local Opti fleet.

Trester turned the meeting over to Rules Committee Chair D. Porter to discuss specific class issues. In 2012, Class E requests measurement of bow sprit length and potential checking for membership compliance. Class X measurement preference will be determined in February. Class IOD requests boom block hardware and connection safety checks at ILYA events.

Class I-20 request scheduling six races at Invitational events. The fleet desires W and L courses only. Class IOD desires that L courses have a dogleg finish. Class MC prefers not to sail 3 back-to-back races, but will allow 4 races in one day. Class MC desires a seven race championship with a throwout if all seven are completed.

The classes reported preferences for the use of GPS and Velocitek devices. Classes A, E, and I-20 request no restrictions on such devices. Class MC allows GPS in compass mode only. Classes X and IOD prohibit such devices. Class Melges 17 follows national class rules on this and all other issues. Class

C proposed a scantling rule as follows: "Electronics: At the ILYA Invitational and the ILYA Championship, competitors may view electronic data that displays course bearing, countdown timer, and any tactical mode derived strictly from course bearing information. The course bearing information may be derived magnetically or via GPS and may store GPS data for review when not racing. For all other events, any data derived or stored via magnetic compass, countdown timer, or GPS signal is permitted unless prohibited by the sailing instructions." This was approved (J.P. Porter/Spencer).

All classes requested to maintain existing levels of allowable advertising when NORs and SIs are updated to the newest ISAF advertising codes. This includes the more liberal advertising allowed by Melges 17 Class national rules. Race Management and Judges Committee is asked to find the correct SI wording for the two kinds of sailing for the 2012 SIs and NORs.

All fleets except Class X and IOD will forego printed SIs at events. The SIs will be available on line and will be posted on site. Online SIs will be marked as "Draft" until 48 hours prior to the regatta checkin time, at which time they will become "Final." Any changes within the 48 hours prior to regatta check-in time will not be made in the SIs, but will be posted as changes to the SIs on the Official Regatta notice board.

ILYA Legal Chair Strothman will review ILYA event waivers and recommend procedures in regatta entry applications and regatta check-in to procure proper signatures of contestants and or parents.

Clarification of rules determining age/fleet assignments in Class IOD were discussed. Current rules regarding contestants born on January 1 of any year could cause confusion. After discussion it was agreed to review the wording in Class IOD rules, and to review Class X wording to prevent similar confusion: ILYA bylaws will be revised as follows to clarify the intent of the board: "Class IOD Championship entries shall be split into White, Blue, and Red fleets according to the age of the helmsperson as follows:

White Fleet: Helmspersons whose eighth, ninth, or tenth birthdays

occur in the year prior to January 1st of the calendar year of the event.

<u>Blue Fleet</u>: Helmspersons whose eleventh or twelfth birthdays occur in the year prior to January 1st of the calendar year of the event.

<u>Red Fleet</u>: Helmspersons whose, thirteenth, fourteenth, or fifteenth birthdays occur in the year prior to January 1st of the calendar year of the event.

There being no further Rules Committee business, D. Porter ended the Rules Committee meeting and turned the gavel back to Trester to conclude Board business. The actions of the Rules Committee were approved (Prange/D. Porter).

It was approved to add the following language to event NORs and SIs: "Media Rights: Competitors give absolute right and permission for video footage or photographs of themselves or their boat generated during an ILYA event to be published in any media for press, editorial or advertising purposes."

A discussion of Class Melges 17, based on its failure to meet the requirement of at least ten registrations on or before the early entry deadline and at least that many in attendance at the championship regatta in 2011 was tabled to the next board meeting in absence of representation by the class.

Discussion about M-16 Class perpetual trophies resulted in a consensus that it would be premature to do anything other than keep them in ILYA possession at this time.

It was approved to change the age limitation on the ILYA keeper trophy in Class C for the highest ranking junior sailor in the Championship Regatta to 25 or under from under 21 (Schmidt/D. Porter). By the same motion the age limitation of the Class MC perpetual Melges Sails Junior trophy would be changed similarly upon approval by the donor or Melges Performance Sailboats. These changes are consistent with the identification of ILYA junior sailors age categories for competition in Youth Championship events, for ILYA dues, and for youth entry fee incentives in adult regattas.

Suzi Reese and Candace Porter will lead working lunch break-out sessions at the US SAILING One Design Symposium Nov. 17-19 in Bay Head, NJ. Smith and or Trester were invited to participate in a see **Even More Board**, page ??

panel discussion but are unable to attend. C. Porter may substitute. All fleet reps are encouraged to attend this event which will include representation by 30-40 one design classes.

Consideration of providing an ILYA membership category for sailing schools will be placed on the agenda for the delegates and the Board in February.

Class X is asked to discuss whether the awarding of top female perpetual trophies is still desired.

Driscoll emphasized the importance of opening up advertising opportunities for events, including allowing sponsor logos or other identification on competing boats. All fleets are asked to consider this at their winter meetings. The Promotion Committee will bring a set of considerations and discussion points for each fleet to consider.

Under Other New Business and Committee Reports, Youth Development Committee, after considerable discussion, the Club 420 was accepted as a sanctioned fleet (Haines/Cox). As a result of this motion, the fleet will need to form a committee and elect a chair, the Executive Committee is authorized to approve related by-law changes, and the Finance Committee will review related financial obligations of membership and entry, etc. Subsequently, Treasurer Schmidt proposed that the 420 skipper membership requirement for ILYA events be changed to \$40 as in Class X and that the fee entry fee for 2012 only remain at \$70. Under Regatta Coordinating, Haines outlined the plan for the ILYA Mendota Yacht Club partnership 2012 Annual Championship Regatta as approved in 2011. The regatta will be based at Gov. Nelson State Park on two consecutive weekends, with Classes E, C, and I-20 registering Thursday, August 9 and racing Fri. through

Prange is heading up sponsorship efforts with professional help from Brown & Brown Marketing.

Porter/ Spencer) to award the I-20 Invitational/ Melges 17 Championship to Pewaukee (I-20 to confirm), July 13-15; to award the C Invitational to Geneva, July 18-21; to award the Club 420 Championship along with the Annual Championship, Aug. 16-19; and to award the Laser/Laser Radial Youth Championship to Beulah on a date to be determined. 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2012 ILYA Annual Championship to cover two weekends at Mendota

An innovative schedule will enhance the return of the ILYA Annual Championship Regatta to Lake Mendota in Madison, Wisconsin. Six fleets will attend the event, three on each weekend.

Up first are the Es, Cs, and I-20s, registering at Governor Nelson State Park on Thursday, August 9, and racing Friday through Sunday, August 10-12.

The adult fleets will moor at Nelson Park, mostly in the water on moorings brought by the sailors. Dry sailing will be available, but it will be limited by the logistics of the parking and launching facilities.

A special evening of heavy hors d'oeuvres and libation awaits the fleets at the extraordinary Pyle Center on the Fridays of each weekend. Saturday nights will be open season on Madison's numerous dining and fun establishments. Regatta chairpersons will advise participants where to go to most likely meet their competitors for and after dinner.

As most racing will be scheduled back-to-back (to back), on-the-water lunches may be pre-ordered for your crew and supporters. In addition, a headquarters food and beverage stand will be open at the most opportune times.

Post race fun awards are planned at headquarters for the adult fleet, and the juniors are welcome to join in the fun.

ILYA skippers set to vie for Olympic Women's Match Race Berth

ILYA sailors Sally Barkow (Pine Lake) and Stephanie Roble (Lake Beulah) are the skippers of two US Women's Match Race Teams which qualified in October in Miami to sail in the final Olympic qualifying regatta May 4-7 in Weymouth, England.

Weymouth will be the site of the 2012 Sailing Olympics scheduled for late July and early August.

Barkow, sailing with crew Elizabeth Kratzig Burnham and Alana O'Reilly, placed third to skippers Tunnicliffe and Tulloch in the October event, but has since bested Tulloch at the US Women's Match Race Championship in November in New Orleans, winning the event.

Barkow is the #3 ISAF ranked women's match racer in the world. The 2008 Olympian is a two-time winner of US Sailing's Rolex Yachtswoman of the Year award. In 2011 she finished third overall in the ISAF Sailing World Cup, winning four medals at four World Cup events. Barkow won the Princess Sofia Trophy in Palma, Spain; was second at French Olympic Sailing Week in Hyeres, France; and posted third place finishes at Skandia Sail for Gold in Weymouth, U.K. and US Sailing's Rolex Miami OCR in Miami, Fla.

Roble, sailing with team members Maggie Shea and Darby Smith, was fourth in Miami. Roble's team started sailing together a year ago when they met at the Chicago Match Race Center. She placed third at this year's Lysekil Women's Match Racing Championship, fourth at the Buddy Melges Challenge, and second in the Chicago Match Race Center's GoPRO Match Cup. Roble is ranked 38th in the world by ISAF.

The four teams will sail a series of qualifying races in two boats at Weymouth.

- Media activities at our Annual Championship regatta including video clips and live interviews for on-line distribution, as well as mark-by-mark race reporting.
- Other Promotional costs approved by the Board of Directors.

Foundation Funds

The ILYA foundation has been re-chartered to accept general funds in support of Inland sailors who are accepting the challenge to venture out to non-scow National and International events. Foundation trustees will evaluate all requests for financial assistance

and provide support as feasible to qualified competitors, with youthful sailors given special preference.

2011 Achievements

In 2011 the **Promotion** Committee enabled 51 youth sailors and 7 ILYA first time participants to sail in our events at discounted prices. The **General Foundation** has already helped a number of teams, mainly youth, participate at major regattas by helping them fund their campaigns. The Foundation is also operating in support of four Olympic campaigns (see inset) shooting for 2012. These are the kind of activities that the ILYA should be supporting.



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
