

The Edmund Pillsbury Memorial Cup In August 1952, Mr. and Mrs. John S. Pillsbury and family in memory of Edmund Pillsbury presented to the Inland Lake Yachting Association a trophy to be known as "The Edmund Pillsbury Memorial Cup" to be awarded annually to the skipper of the yacht, irrespective of class, who makes the outstanding record in the annual Inland Lake Yachting Association Regatta.

With the permission of the Pillsbury family it was decided in 1965 to award this trophy in the future to the outstanding skipper at the annual regatta, selection to be made by an anonymous committee of Directors appointed by the Commodore. Ckinner

Promotion Committee extends regatta entry discount programs

The ILYA Promotion Committee is committed to extending the expanded adult and junior regatta entry discount program in 2011.

The program will once again provide for free entry registrations for any sailors skippering in their first ILYA adult regatta. Forty-nine adult skippers have taken advantage of the program in the past three years.

Invitationals are included

The program will again provide fifty percent regatta entry discounts to all junior skippers (age 25 or under) in ILYA adult championship regattas, and again in 2011, the fifty percent discount will apply to adult invitational regattas as well. One hundred eleven junior skippers have taken advantage of the program in the past three years.

Special for Class C

Class C championship and invitational regatta entry fees will once again be free (actually \$1) for junior skippers in 2011. This program is subsidized by Promotion Committee funds, the Class C Raffle Fund (now depleted), and the Nation-

al C Scow Sailing Assc. Thanks to a continuing commitment from the NCSSA, the free entry program will continue in 2011. New this year: juniors taking advantage of this incentive are obligated to be members of NCSSA.

MC Opportunities

The MC Sailing Association is offering complimentary memberships in the national association for all youth sailors (under 21 years) who participate in 2011 ILYA invitational or championship MC events. Eligible sailors should contact Executive Secretary Ron Stryker at secretary@mcscow.org to register with MCSA.

Discount Procedures

All of the junior discounts and first time regatta adult discounts are funded again in 2011 for skippers who register on or before the early registration deadline. The Notices of Race and online registration forms reflect the junior discounts. First time adult participants should contact the ILYA office when they prepare to register.

Warning: Classifieds Scam

You may have occasion to use the ILYA Scow Slants or the ILYA Web Site (www.ilya.org) to advertise a boat or related equipment. Evidently some scam artists have found the ILYA Web site and its classified ad page. One of our current advertisers told me he was contacted twice recently with the scam. I heard a similar story from two other ILYA members recently as well.

The scam works something like this (with possible variations): The interested person (scammer) supposedly has a friend or business acquaintance who owes him money. That money (more than you are asking for the boat) is sent to you in the form of a cashier's check (WHICH IS FAKE!). When you receive the cashier's check, you are supposed to deposit it and send a personal check for the overage amount to the scammer.

Here's how you get taken: The bank has no idea that the cashier's check is fake, so they accept it, and you send a good check to the scammer. After a few days, the bank finds out



that the cashier's check was fake, and you are responsible for it. By then you are out your good check, and possibly the boat, if the scammer even bothered to come get it.

You have probably read about this type of scam in your local newspaper. I know it has been written about in the Janesville (Wis.) Gazette a couple of times now.

Precautions: Don't accept or deposit any checks without having the bank first verify its authenticity. Tell others about this scam, especially if they may have items advertised somewhere.



The ILYA Board of Directors Member Support Recognition Program was a great success in its first year. Many ILYA Members and friends supported Association activities and were acknowledged with stickers corresponding to the three-tiered recognition system. Their support will be recognized in the 2011 spring issue of *Scow Slants*.

- *Silver Level Support Recognition* is awarded to members who donate \$100 or more in addition to their dues.
- *Gold Level Support Recognition* is awarded to members who donate \$500 or more in addition to their dues.
- *Platinum Level Support Recognition* is awarded to members who donate \$1,000 or more in addition to their dues.

The recognition applies each calendar year. Members who participate in this program receive an ILYA sticker with the designated recognition category suitable for display on their boat or car. Supporters will also be recognized annually via *Scow Slants*.

- Sailgroove's activities at our Annual Championship regatta including video clips and live interviews. Sailgroove will also be available for your club's use to highlight the best from our member clubs.
- Costs of sending representatives to the US Sailing Junior Sailing Symposium.
- Other Promotional costs approved by the Board of Directors.

Foundation Funds

The ILYA foundation has been re-chartered to accept general funds in support of Inland sailors who are accepting the challenge to venture out to non-scow National and International events. Foundation trustees will evaluate all requests for financial assistance and provide support as feasible to qualified competitors, with youthful sailors given special preference.

2010 Achievements

In 2010 the **Promotion** Committee spent over \$4,500 to enable 50 youth sailors and 16 ILYA first time participants to sail in our

events at discounted prices. The **General Foundation** has already helped two teams participate at major regattas by helping them fund their campaign. The Foundation is operating in support of three Olympic campaigns shooting for 2012. These are the kind of activities that the ILYA should be supporting.

Attendance in 2010 was heartening, especially at the E and C invitationals and the Annual Championship. Prange encouraged all fleet representatives to maintain active fleet committees so that they have a team ready for sticky issues that may arise in their fleets.

The minutes of the October 31, 2010

Board of Directors meeting were approved as published (F. Barkow/Trester).

The actions of the Executive Committee, which included the following, were approved (Trester/Schmidt):

- Winter Inland awards
- Initiation of PayPal credit card site for donations

On behalf of Nominating Committee Chair C. Porter, Prange recognized directors elected (Driessen, D. Porter) or re-elected (Trester, and S. Schmidt) by the delegates. The slate of Trester as Commodore, Friend as Vice Commodore, and S. Schmidt as Secretary/Treasurer for 2011 was then approved (Spencer/Haines). Retiring Commodore Prange was applauded for his service.

Trester then presided, expressed his pleasure and honor to serve as Commodore, and again thanked Barkow and Mann, and announced his appreciation that C. Porter would remain as ScowLines editor. Trester thanked Simon for accepting the position of Rules Committee At-Large member, and congratulated him on his US SAILING instruction award.

Trester indicated that his focus would be on 'customer service,' providing the best events at the best venues while maintaining fiscal responsibility. A focus on junior sailing will continue. Reaching out to less active clubs and club members will be a part of the service. Communication to members regarding the value of the ILYA to their sailing experience is important as is their support of ILYA through memberships, whether they are participating in regattas or not.

Trester welcomes open communication with the directors, delegates, and members, especially via email, and proposed a new survey be prepared for review in October, considering that we have a new

economy, and more communication tools than existed at the time of the last survey.

Trester proposed and the Board approved (Haines/Driscoll) a by-law change to section 10.11, changing the name of the Publications Committee to the Promotion and Communications Committee, and including a rewrite of the section as follows:

- 10.11 Promotion & Communication Committee—Shall consist of at least three (3) members appointed by the Commodore. The Committee shall carry out the duties assigned to it as contained herein:
 - A. Shall promote participation in all of the association events.
 - B. Shall promote lake and Individual Memberships in the association.
 - C. Shall oversee all communication channels of the association including ScowLines and other forms of social media.
 - D. Shall oversee and advise the Executive Secretary in his or her duties of compiling, editing and publishing the Association's Newsletter, Year book, Annual Report.
 - E. Shall control the content, format, cost, amounts and distribution of all printed matter of the Association needed by any Committee or Officer to assist in the operation of the Association.
 - F. Shall compile photographs from all sources and of all events for use in current publications.
 - G. Shall establish, with the approval of the Board of Directors, the price at which publications will be sold, and the extent of circulation of free publications.
 - H. Shall prepare and submit to the Treasurer yearly a budget for all printing and publication matters in time for inclusion in the preparation of the annual budget of the Association.
 - Shall endeavor to bring in sufficient Publication and advertising income to cover our communication costs.



Louie's Last Regatta (#13) plans race course for Scows

Louie's Last Regatta gained its name from the Milwaukee Ale House's Flagship brand Louie's Demise amber ale. Louie Eishold, great uncle of an Ale House founder, met his demise in a bar fight in 1886 in Sheboygan Wisconsin.

Louie's Last Regatta was started in 1999 by a group of Milwaukee sailors who basically wanted one more sailing regatta before they had to pull their boats from the water. To make their effort more attractive to sailors thinking about snow shovels and ski trips, this devoted group decided to make Louie's into a charity event. The first Louie's Last Regatta brought in \$900, with twelve boats participating.

The event grew steadily in popularity and money raised. Major sponsors came forward, boat crews donated, and the post race party grew. Louie's Challenge, otherwise known as "sanctioned bribery," was a unique and surprisingly popular fund raising feature of the Regatta. Started in 2001, boat crews could bribe the race committee for a better finish position, with all money going to Children's Hospital.

The silent auction was introduced in 2001. In 2002, internationally recognized

Mount Gay Rum came on board as a sponsor, and their distinctive red hats became part of the Milwaukee sailing attire.

In 2004 Sailing magazine listed

Entry is free for skippers sailing their first ILYA Adult Class Regatta, and who contact the ILYA office and register prior to or on the early registration deadline (June 24).

A 50% youth-aged skipper discount is available to qualifying skippers who register prior to or on the early registration deadline (June 24).

Registration fee incentives do not apply to on-site registrations.

Trophies

Trophies will be awarded to the top five skippers in the regatta as well as the top two masters, top grandmaster and top junior. Trophies will be presented following haul-out and lunch after the last race on Sunday.

Risks

Sailing is an activity that has an inherent risk of damage and injury. Competitors in this event are participating entirely at their own risk. See RRS 4, Decision to Race. The race organizers (organizing authority, race committee, protest committee, host club, sponsors, or any other organization or official) will not be responsible for damage to any boat or other property or the injury to any competitor, including death, sustained as a result of participation in this event. By participating in this event, each competitor, or in the case of minors, each competitor's parent or guardian, agrees to release the race organizers from any and all liability associated with such competitor's participation in this event to the fullest extent permitted by

Rules

Except as any of the following are altered by the Sailing Instructions, the regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing, the prescriptions of US SAILING, the Rules and Bylaws of the ILYA, and the scantling rules of the MCSA.

Measurement and weighing will not be conducted, but each entry is bound by MCSA scantlings.

Notification of OCS (on course side) starters and other communication will be done first by VHF radio and second by hailer.

In accordance with ISAF Regulation 20, this regatta is classified as an "invitational" Category A event. ADVERTISING will be restricted to Category A.

Two races are required to be completed to constitute a regatta. If six races are completed, each boat shall discard her worst score, except when prohibited under RRS 88.3(b).

BOATING REGULATIONS of the State of Wisconsin will apply.

Courses

The courses to be sailed will be described in the Sailing Instructions. The racing area will be on the navigable waters of Lake Beulah.

Housing

Attempts to house all distant sailors will be made with advanced request. Contact Kathy Will, (262) 642-5571 (kathywill1@aol.com).

Launching

There is a crane available at the LBYC facility for launching sailboats only. The crane may only be operated by LBYC members. Each yacht should have a lifting bridle for crane use.

Mooring

Bring your own anchor, buoy and line (20 feet) in case it is needed. Boats will be on lifts or tied at homes, or moored in a nearby bay. Although dry sailing is allowed for all yachts at this regatta, it is strongly discouraged to allow ample parking for cars and trailers. All moorings must be removed on Sunday, July 10.

Spectator Fleet

Spectator boats will be available. Power boats can be launched at the public ramp. Beulah has a strict policy limiting entry each day. Plan to launch boat on Thursday and moorings around the lake will be arranged. Directions will be given at the club.

Youth Championships

- Laser dropped in 2011
- 420 Event added to online registration

The Youth Championship for many years combined the Laser, Laser Radial, and Club 420 fleets as an inexpensive regatta for the 25 and under crowd. In 2010 the Collegiate 420 was added to the event, the venue was moved to Lake Calhoun, and the date moved to later in August to accommodate more sailors. The changes enhanced attendance in the Club 420 fleet, as many area boats were available for charter, but the Laser fleets and Collegiate 420s didn't show up.

Pondering the low attendance of the Lasers, the ILYA Board presumed that the eligible sailors, unable to sail both boats, were making a choice in favor of the 420. The Board then decided to split the event into two—separate venues, separate dates—one for the Club 420 and one for the Laser and Laser Radial. Calhoun stepped up to host the Club 420 again, this time in early August, and a site was sought for the Laser event. At the time of the Winter Inland meeting, no host or appropriate date had been found for the Laser Youth Championship, and the event was put on hold until 2012.

The Youth Development Committee and the ILYA Board of Directors are dedicated to the success of the Youth Championships, and will continue efforts to accommodate the interests of this important age group of future ILYA club and scow participants.

Thanks to a donation by Commodore Trester, the Youth Championship Regattas are now included in the ILYA on-line registration program, providing better exposure for the event, and administrative assistance to the host clubs.

producing a revised working copy of the corrected and updated Regatta Manual, Sailing Instruction, Notices of Race, other manuals, and the printing of forms, charts, scoreboards, etc."

Trester then recommended changing the name and definition of the US SAILING National Championship Events Committee to the US SAILING Regional Sailing Association Representative. This recommendation was approved (F. Barkow/Driessen), and By-law 10.13 is revised as follows:

- 13.13 U.S. Sailing Regional Sailing Association representative Representative shall be assigned by the Commodore. The person shall be an individual member of US SAILING as well as the ILYA. ILYA Executive Secretary will be listed as support person for the representative. The representative shall carry out the duties assigned to it as contained herein.
 - A. ILYA RSA representative will be the contact person to US Sailing. They will be responsible for answering questions that require local knowledge, such as what boats to race in the area, what is the appropriate sailing club to join, how to join, etc. They will also be responsible for answering surveys or supplying statistics to US SAILING.
 - B. The representative will be responsible for passing on information on US Sailing services that are offered through the RSAs to more sailors and thus build membership in US SAILING.
 - C. The representative will help both organizations to gain recognition for contributions made to each organization.

- D. The representative will be posted on the US Sailing website.
- E. Shall act as ILYA liaison between the Association and US Sailing in regard to ILYA representatives in the National Championship Events and possible Champion of Champions participation.
- F. Shall publish and disseminate all information concerning the National Championship Events entrance requirements, locations, costs, prizes or trophies, etc., including obligations of winners to advance and participate in next higher series or finals.
- G. Help US Sailing with identifying possible Area K representatives and voting for the area representatives.

Trester presented a list of committee assignments, some of which are appointed positions, and some of which require board approval. The US SAILING representative position is currently unfilled. The attached list [available by request at the ILYA office] was approved in whole (Barr/Norton).

Fleet reports followed. In Class A, Haines reported growth in the White Bear fleet, an active fleet committee, and a new class web site. Friend reported that NCESA has obtained 501.c.3 status, and will experiment in 2011 with a foil forestay or zipper jib luff, both to alleviate fraying of the jib and unsnapping of current jib hanks. Experimentation is open to all who apply, and there are no scoring penalties. F. Barkow reports that NCSSA

JK Sailing Olympic Campaign news

[Kevin Jewett and Mike Kuschner have mounted a challenge to represent the US in the 2012 49er Olympics. In August, the two Geneva instructors chartered a boat and tested the waters in a Canadian event, and in spite of a number of capsizes and a breakdown, finished as the top US team in a respectable 6th place. Here's their latest news...]

This morning I went to the gym and started with some jump rope to warm up. I picked out a red plastic "rope" that was welded to thin black plastic handles and found a spot in the open area of the gym. Ten jumps in I hit the rope with my feet and started over, I repeated this pattern four more times before finally went to get a different rope. This time I picked one with a rotating swivel inside the padded handle, an upgrade. With the new rope I went about 2 minutes, even throwing in a crossover prior to hitting my feet this time...

This little tale isn't extraordinarily interesting, but I thought it was a great example of what happened to our Olympic Campaign when we invested in a new boat this winter. Upon arriving in Miami, Mike and I rigged and trained in our original boat, Hull 765. It has a new style rig, but old sails and was pretty flexible (not a desired trait). We trained with many of the newer sailors to the

fleet, many of whom had better equipment, as well as a few of the more experienced teams.

In the first few weeks we experimented with technique, worked out settings, and learned a lot of tweaky little things about sailing the 49er while getting to know the guys in the fleet. We were offered advice freely from everyone we asked, and had a great time with this new crowd. While sailing we would break into the lead occasionally but when a more veteran fleet congregated, you would rarely see us ahead. Speed tuning was painful, and we took our licks just trying to keep up with the development team members, let alone the higher level sailors.

We love our trainer 765, and have had some incredible times sailing her, but the difference we experienced after launching our new boat, USA 1202, was amazing. With the new boat and sails we quickly found ourselves at another level. We were now rivaling the top sailors congregating from around the world for the Miami Olympic Classes Regatta. It really was an amazing and welcome shift. We still had a lot of work to do, but instead of "tripping up every ten seconds", when we didn't make mistakes we found ourselves in the top pack. It became clear that with the right equipment we were not only competitive but could win, as we did in one of the final races of the regatta.

The 49er is an amazingly simple boat in many ways. The vang and cunningham are really the only fine tuning devices that we can adjust while racing so the trick is to get everything else tuned was well as possible prior to the start and hope the conditions don't change too dramatically once racing begins. This puts a premium on the gear. That means, hull, sails, mast, foils and rigging need to be in tip top condition. Then we can focus on the hard part... Sailing the damn thing...

Mike has pushed himself physi-



cally over the winter to transform into the engine of the boat. I have worked to understand the intricacies of driving from the wire and together we have begun developing the team work required to finesse these boats through a world class race course. Like in any other fleet, at the top level the teams that keep their heads out of the boat and find the right spots get ahead. Now that we understand the dynamics of the boat and moves that make it work for us, it's time to sharpen these up to the point when we can execute better than others and stay focused on the big picture.

Here is what our plan over the next few months looks like.
On April 5th we fly into London and begin training with Canadians Gordon Cook and Hunter Lowden whom we will be working with throughout the European circuit this spring. Between events we will be focused on training at the Olympic site in Weymouth, England.

Our upcoming events include:

- April 24-29, South of France Regatta, Hyeres, France
- May 23-28, Delta Lloyd Regatta, Medemblik, Holland
- June 6-11, Sail for Gold Regatta, Weymouth, England

The Sail for Gold Regatta is the first of two Olympic Team Qualifying events, so is the key event for us this spring. Should we be the top US Team at this event, we'll be asked to represent the US at the Olympic Test event this August. The second Olympic Qualifying event is in Perth, Australia this coming December.

We are looking forward to an exciting spring and appreciate the great support that we have received from throughout the ILYA.

Young team takes a stab at national match race competition

Our women's match-race team had an outstanding experience and overall finish at the USSTAG regatta we attended in Key Biscayne, Florida in January.

Because of the Foundation's support for our regatta fee, we were also able to attend a three-day training camp with Dave Perry that allowed us to build on our match racing skills, which proved invaluable for our regatta results later in the week.

All three of the US Sailing Team Alpha-Graphics members, as well as five other teams of all different match-racing levels, attended the camp. We had many discussions about tuning and match-racing moves specific to the Elliot 6 Meter, which is the women's Olympic match-race boat. We also had excellent coaching and video debriefs from Dave Perry who was able to help us improve to a level we could not have accomplished without him. The USSTAG members were also extremely helpful in sharing information and debriefing on the water after a drill or race.

At the end of the week all eight teams participated in a regatta that would determine who would be on the 2011 USSTAG team and who would be attending the Miami Rolex Olympic Class Regatta (MOCR) in mid-January.

The first stage of the event was to complete two full round robins. Five of the teams had significantly higher rankings than us, so we were expecting some losses. Our main goal for the two round robins was to start even with our competitors so that we could have a good fight in all races. (In match racing, the pre start can become very intense, and once

the other boat gains control of you, it is very hard to start even).

At the end of the double round robins, we felt that our goal had been achieved, as our record was 6-8, with 2 of those losses being within inches of winning. Unfortunately, one of those close losses caused us to lose the tie breaker for fourth place overall, which was the last qualifying spot for the MOCR, a grade 1 World Cup event. Even with that disappointing news on

the water, we still had to complete a sail-off for fifth place. We wanted to push through the disappointment and finish strong, which is exactly what we did; we were the first team to win two races and thus secured fifth place.

Overall our team—Maggie Shea, Darby Smith, and myself—was very excited about our finish and hard work throughout the week. When I originally wrote to the Foundation I mentioned that I was very confident in our team, and after this week I am even more confident in them, as they are the most hard working, dedicated, and entertaining individuals I have ever sailed with.

We worked hard and learned while keeping "the mood" light on the boat. From this

event we discovered that we want to have a future of sailing together, and so we will be participating in Dave Perry's "Road to Rio" training camps and as many events as possible.

is getting stronger, and will procure the new mast die with member donations. The new die may include tighter specifications within the existing rule. NCSSA will continue to support 50% of ILYA junior Class C entries, but the participating juniors are obligated to join NCSSA. The US SAIL-ING Championship of Champions will be in Class C Scows in 2012 at Pewaukee. Bolles reported that the I-20 class is focusing on youth with entry scholarships and available boats for borrowing. Team racing events will target youth and collegiate sailors. The class has a Facebook page and is developing iPhone and Android apps. Willie Crear is a second builder whose first boat will be measured by the class technical committee. The mold is formerly from Johnson Boat Works. Neuman reported that the class is making a bylaw change to accommodate the features of the new deck mold. Team racing experiments have been well-received and marketable to youth. Osmundson reported that Clear Lake was adding a Melges 17 fleet, and Haines reported that Lesa Gutenkunst is working hard to develop new fleets. Barr reported good attendance at the fleet meetings, including the two PROs for 2011 at Clear Lake. The fleet will retain the threerace minimum for an official championship regatta, and is working on parent and coaching guidelines. Spencer noted the IOD fleet's request to increase the number of races for Red, White and Blue divisions at the ILYA Championship.

Trester turned the meeting over to D. Porter who presided as chair of the Rules Committee. ILYA fleets reported as follows: Class E requests that bow sprits be measured in 2011. Class I-20 requested and was approved for an increase in championship races to eight (Bolles/Spencer).

Melges 17 class requested a change in target race time to 55 minutes plus or minus 10, and a race time limit of 90 minutes. Class X desires to "discourage" the use of the black flag. After discussion Class C and Class X agreed to change the second sentence of bylaw 80.12.b to read as follows (Barr/F.Barkow): "Any whole integer between 0-999 is allowed. The integer '0' may be represented by '0', '00', or '000;' no other integers shall include leading zeros." Class X will view a proposed experiment in 2011 to improve ease of whisker pole launch, and will allow the hardware to be on the experimental boat in the championship regatta as long as the hardware is not in use. The Opti Class was approved to raise the number of championship R-W-B races to eight with a throwout after six (Spencer/Haines), and will reduce the race target time to 30 minutes. and the race time limit to 45 minutes. The fleet will use a dogleg finish for downwind finishes.

There being no further Rules Committee business, D. Porter ended the Rules Committee meeting and turned the gavel back to Trester to resume Board business. The actions of the Rules Committee were approved (Norton/Barr).

There was no new business.

Committee reports followed. Trester reported that the US Junior Symposium was attended by himself, Simon, and Woldum. The emphasis was more on community sailing than on racing. Simon opined that our X boat is an advantage for us as a boat for post Opti sailing, while other vendors are trying to develop boats to fill that market. The 2011 double-handed Youth Championship expects 40-50 Club 420s at Calhoun, Aug. 5-7. The youth single-event membership will include Scow-

Lines in 2011. After discussion of venues and dates, it was decided to table further discussion until the October meeting and add questions regarding it to the survey (Haines/Driscoll). Pewaukee, Wayzata, and Clear Lake will be hosting US SAILING instructor clinics in the early summer.


Friend presided over the Regatta Coordinating Committee report. Discussion of 2011 regatta bids resulted in the awarding of the I-20 Invitational to Clear Lake, June 25-26, pending Clear Lake's formal approval by March 7 (Trester/Spencer). If not approved, the regatta will be awarded to Cedar, Ind.

Haines reported that the 2012 Annual Championship will be held at Mendota on two weekends, which will help with the volunteer pool and attendance. Arrangements are being made for one regatta party on each weekend at the Pyle Center with the Alumni Center reserved in case of rain. The Hoofers will provide taxi service and sack lunches. Details with Governor Nelson Park need to be worked out to accommodate headquarters, launching and mooring for the five (possibly six) anticipated fleets including A, E, C, MC, and I-20. The I-20's prefer the earlier of the two weekends, and the likely grouping will be E, C, and I-20/A, MC, and possibly M-17.

After hearing the preferences of each of the classes affected, the 2013 Annual Championship for classes A, E, C, MC, and I-20 was awarded to Okoboji (Trester/Norton). The use of Spirit Lake for Class A is an option to be considered in planning.

Discussion of 2012 regatta bids resulted in the awarding of the MC Invitational to Upper Minnetonka (Neuman/Porter), the E Invitational to Gull (Dries-

sen/Schmidt), the IOD No Tears West to Okoboji (Spencer/Porter), the IOD No Tears East to Cedar, Wis. (Schmidt/F. Barkow), and the IOD Championship to Pewaukee (Haines/Spencer).

Treasurer Schmidt reviewed the 2010 finances with the Board, comparing earlier years. The association showed a net profit of \$3500 for the year. The member support sticker program was successful and will be continued in 2011. Driscoll recommended sending letters to 2010 donors asking for their continued support in 2011. The Treasurer's report was approved with no fee or dues increases (Driscoll/Prange).

Chairman Mann reported that Race Management training was being scheduled in conjunction with US SAILING, and that a training seminar with optional Club Race Officer test would be held April 9 at North Lake. Mann and John Strassman will coordinate the event, which is open to anyone and costs \$50 for US SAILING members, and \$85 for others. Mann presented a list of PROs for 2011 which was

approved (Porter/Haines).

Prange and Trester spoke for the Promotions and Communications Committee. Prange will investigate professional fundraising/sponsorship via contacts with Minnetonka Yacht Club. The Committee is authorized to continue with the Sail-Groove contract through October when it shall report on the benefits to the association (Schmidt/Porter). Scow Slants and ScowLines information should be sent to Smith and C. Porter respectively.

Trester reiterated that the Winter Inland provided a great event with great food in a great venue. Chair Barkow was encouraged to plan the same venue for 2011 with expanded Friday afternoon or evening activities, including a program for instructional leaders and something for young sailors as well.

Chair Barkow reported that the Trophy Committee was nearly finished with refurbishing existing trophies, and that some new ones are close to being donated. Brain Anderson has volunteered to make boxes for the Ordway Trophy and Pillsbury Cup. Class C desires to have the crew trophy repaired, and reasonable plates will be made to accommodate engraving on the Green Lake (E) and Norris (I-20) trophies, as the price of sterling has become unreasonable. Cedar, Wis. Is donating a crystal ice bucket for MC race #4, and Pine is donating a mariposa platter for MC race #5. The committee will look for suitable awards for the I-20 additional races.

Trester urged everyone to consider attendance at the US SAILING symposium in April in Chicago, which targets adults and club issues. F. Barkow recommended that Board members who print their own meeting documents notify the Executive Secretary to eliminate unnecessary duplicate printing.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 2:03 p.m. (Newuman/Driscoll).

Smith explained the US SAILING partnership program which enables ILYA



Family — Provides Regular membership status for the member, spouse, and all unmarried children who are under the age of 25 on January 1 of the membership year.
