Huge congratulations to the Perfect Vision Sailing Team of Nikki Barnes and Lara Dallman-Weiss on their 7th place finish in the 470 Worlds, which earned them the honor of representing the U.S. in the Tokyo games. Please take a moment to read the message below from Lara's extremely proud father:

Hi White Bear and ILYA sailing friends,

I need to share some really cool news (and a bit of a story).

A little blond-haired girl learned how to sail in Optis at WBSS (thanks for encouraging her, coach Jackie) and then enjoyed 5 wonderful summers in X-boats with her friends and coaches (Teresa, Dan, Katie, Charlie, Daniel, Kristen, David, Tamra, Lisa, Allie, Heather, and Rachel to name a few – oh – don't forget Gordy). There were fond memories forged at regattas sailed at Calhoun, Minnetonka, Oshkosh, Geneva, Okoboji, Delevan, Pewaukee and Clear Lakes that I believe helped cement her love of the sport. Then she became an instructor and coach at WBSS.

She enjoyed good success at Eckerd College with her White Bear friend and sometimes skipper, Andrew. Together they won an ILYA Youth Championship in the 420. She worked

summers as a coach at clubs in CA and Long Island. After college, she just could not get very far away from the sport she loved so much. She did some early sailing in the 470, even competing in an ISAF (now World Sailing) World Championship in Perth, AUS in Dec 2011.

Then she spent about 5 years in bigger boats learning from the experts and even began doing sailing media, including piloting drones. In early Spring of 2018, an opportunity arose to get back into the 470 as collegiate champion and new Coast Guard Academy graduate Nikki Barnes was looking for a crew. This little blond-haired kid from White Bear Lake clicked with Nikki and they formed a team to campaign for the 2020 Olympics called Perfect Vision Sailing. This started a 3 year period of growth and inter-personal discovery. The team grew to include their dedicated coach, Robby Bisi, in 2019.

After a COVID year of reset and refocus, 2021 has brought them to Vilamoura, POR to compete with most of the very best female 470 athletes at the 2021 470 World Championships. That event started last week. The little girl with curly blond hair from White Bear Lake is Lara Dallman-Weiss.

Yesterday, after a 7th place overall standing at the Worlds and an insurmountable lead in the 3 event qualifying series, **Nikki and Lara were nominated by US Sailing to represent the United States at the Tokyo Olympics in the Women's 470 Class**, filling the last Olympic sailing slot for the USA.

Not just a good idea, It's the law

Washington, DC (March 10, 2021) - Operators of recreational vessels less than 26 feet in length will be required to use an engine cut-off switch (ECOS) and associated ECOS link (ECOSL) as of April 1, 2021 as the U.S. Coast Guard implements a law passed by Congress. The ECOS and ECOSL prevent runaway vessels and the threats they pose. The ECOSL attaches the vessel operator to a switch that shuts off the engine if the operator is displaced from the helm. The ECOSL is usually a lanyard-style cord that attaches to an ECOS either in close proximity to the helm or on the outboard motor itself if the vessel is operated by a tiller. When enough tension is applied, the ECOSL disengages from the ECOS and the motor is automatically shut down.

Wireless ECOS have recently been developed and are also approved for use. These devices use an electronic "fob" that is carried by the operator and senses when it is submerged in water, activating the ECOS and turning the engine off. Wireless devices are available on the aftermarket and are beginning to become available as manufacturer-installed options. Each year, the Coast Guard receives reports of recreational vessel operators who fall or are suddenly and unexpectedly thrown out of their boat. These events have led to injuries and deaths.

During these incidents the boat continues to operate with no one in control of the vessel, leaving the operator stranded in the water as the boat continues on course, or the boat begins to circle the person in the water eventually striking them, often with the propeller. These dangerous runaway vessel situations put the ejected operator, other users of the waterway, and marine law enforcement officers and other first responders in serious danger. - **Read on**

Note - this appears to apply to federal waters.
