Selection Criteria: Effective April 26, 2019, the Regatta Coordinating Committee will institute a scoring system for each regatta bid. The scoring system intends to more objectively evaluate bids and identify any areas of concern or bias.

Scoring applied to each category:

- Quality of Racing Sailing area fit class standards and expectations
- Turnout Using trailing 3 year average per event, the venue would yield favorable registration numbers (within 2 standard deviations)
- Venue The host club has the capacity to host said bid Logistics (travel/storage)
- Ease of travel and appropriate amount of storage (wet/dry sailing).
- Regatta Experience Overall value to competitors (on and off the water)
- Other Special circumstances to be considered.
